We love having our students begin our day with the morning announcements! Their voices fill our classrooms with positivity and cheer each day as they lead us with The Pledge.

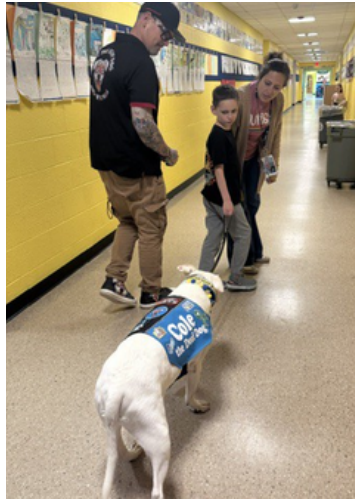

Makenzie Langan – Honorable Mention, Environmental Science – “Environmental Impact of Fertilizers: Is Slow-Release Actually Better?”

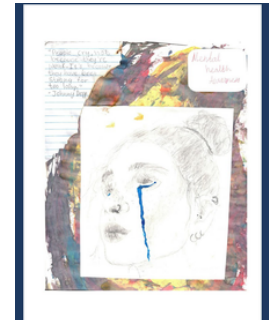

Creative Expression Art Contest

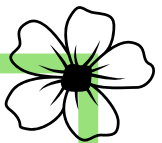
