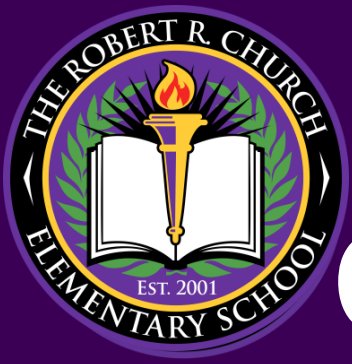


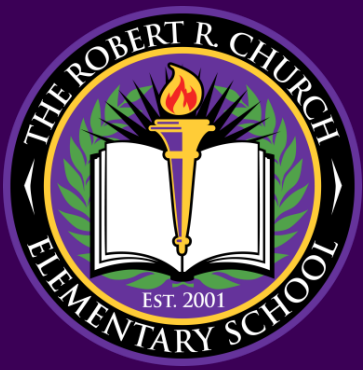

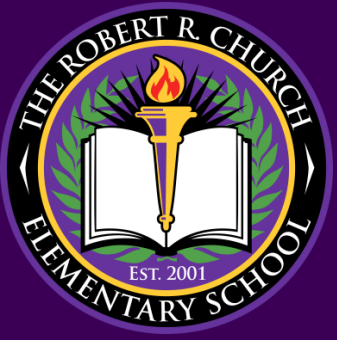

What is Title One?

Title One serves to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.



What is Title One?

Title One is a federal program which provides additional funds above and beyond the funds provided to every Shelby County school. Funds are provided to schools who have a certain percentage of socio-economic disadvantaged students. The Robert R Church Elementary School is qualified to receive these federal funds.



Title One Eligibility

Children eligible for free
and/or reduced lunches under
the National School Lunch Act.



Title One Eligibility

Some children are deemed automatically eligible to participate:

- A. Any student served in the Migrant Education Program;
- B. Any child who participated in Head Start, Even Start, the Early Reading First program, or Title I preschool services at any time within the previous two years;
- C. Any child attending a community day program or living in a state or local institution for neglected or delinquent children; and
- D. Any child who is homeless and attending any school in the LEA



Title One

- Title 1 provides funding to assist in increasing parental involvement. (monthly parent meetings and trainings, light refreshments)
- Title 1 provides funding to assist and support the instructional program by purchasing instructional supplies. However, supplanting is not allowed.
- Title 1 provides funding to support Professional Development. Redelivery of PD information is required once professional development has been completed.

Parents Right to Know

Parents have a right to request the following:

- A teacher's professional qualification, which includes state qualifications, licensure, grade/s certification, waivers
- A teacher's baccalaureate and/or graduate degree, field of endorsement, and previous teaching experience
- A paraprofessional's qualifications
- An assurance that their child's name, address, and telephone listing will not be released to military recruiters

TCAP Achievement Test (Grades 3-8)
Testing Window April 14- May 2, 2025 (Grades 2-5)

The assessments provide information on how students are performing on particular standards, and this information can be used to drive instruction. Reports are available for download at the time the assessment is completed, and this information is available to share with students and parents.

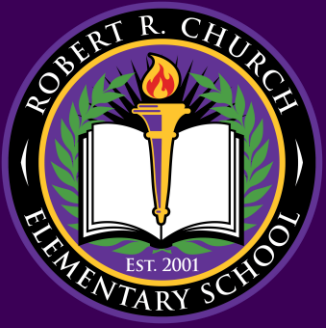


Additional Assessments

Assessments are used to help teachers determine if a student is understanding the content presented in the classroom.

In addition to state assessments, we use the following assessments for our students:

- Bi-weekly Common assessments in all core subjects K-5
- Reading and Math benchmark tests (iReady and Aimsweb)
- Progress Monitoring weekly (Tier 3) and biweekly (Tier 2) for identified students using iReady and Aimsweb



Parent Communication

The teachers of The Robert R Church Elementary communicate students progress in several ways:

Title One Instructional Supplies

Title I funds are allotted for instructional supplies to help increase student achievement. Supplanting is not allowed. Budget set for instructional supplies and equipment for teachers.



Title One Process for Completion

When items need to be purchased, there's a process for completion.

Several MSCS employees must approve the orders prior to delivery.

Once orders arrive, they will be distributed as soon as possible.



Title One Professional Development

Title 1 funds are allotted for Professional Development.

After completing professional development, the attendee has to redeliver the information.

Professional Development must be aligned to the School Improvement Goals, and proven to be effective.
