

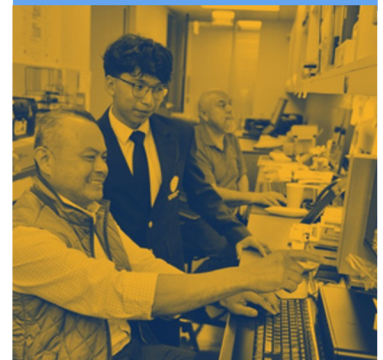

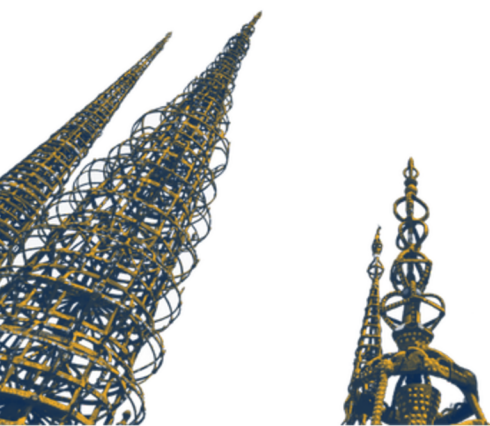

For more than a decade, Verbum Dei Jesuit proudly celebrated a **100% college acceptance rate**. Two years ago, we challenged ourselves to go further—not only getting our young men to college, but **ensuring they graduate**.

Among the Class of 2018, 54% of those who enrolled in college earned their degrees—significantly exceeding the national average for students from similar socioeconomic backgrounds. Yet our commitment to excellence calls us higher. **Our goal is clear: an 80% college completion rate**.

Because of your partnership, we are building the systems and support to make that vision a reality. We have strengthened academic expectations, expanded college readiness efforts, and invested in dedicated alumni support through the hiring of an Alumni Advisor who accompanies our graduates throughout their college journey. We are also helping students make thoughtful, mission-aligned college choices—an increasingly critical step as higher education costs continue to rise.

The progress reflected in this report is the direct result of a community that believes in forming men prepared not only to enter college, but to persevere and thrive. Thank you for walking with our students—your support is transforming aspirations into achievement.

Kevin Garcia

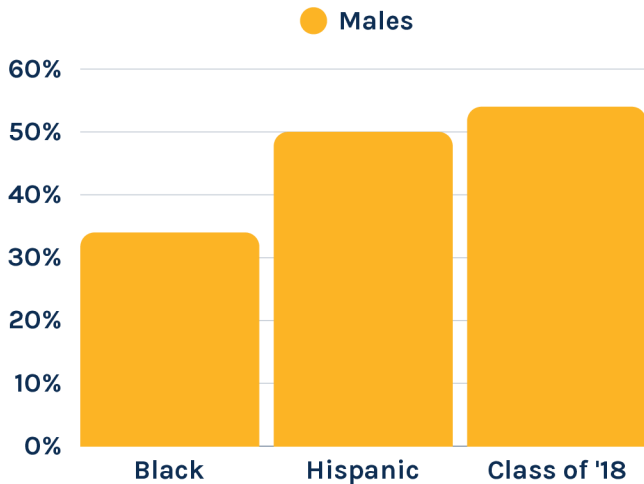

National College Graduation Rates

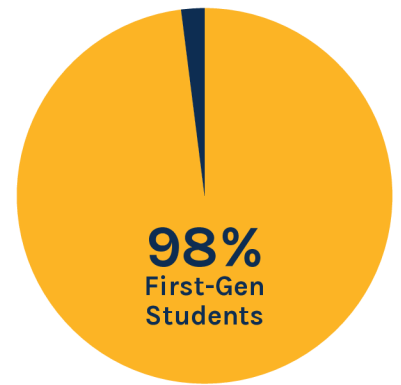
Black and Hispanic males lag behind the overall average, highlighting persistent disparities in educational outcomes.

First-Generation Graduates

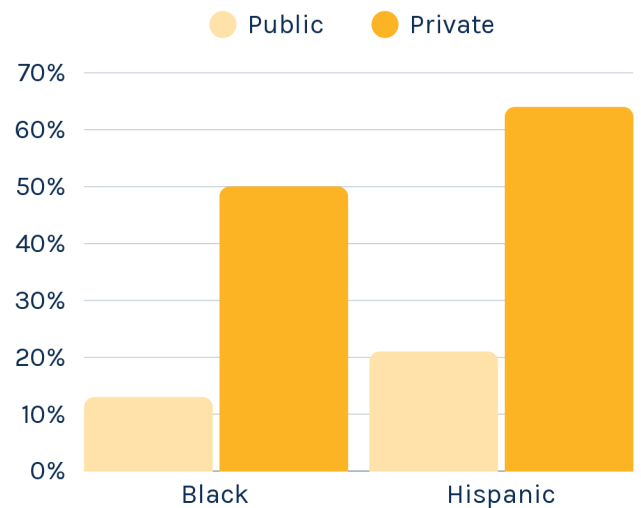

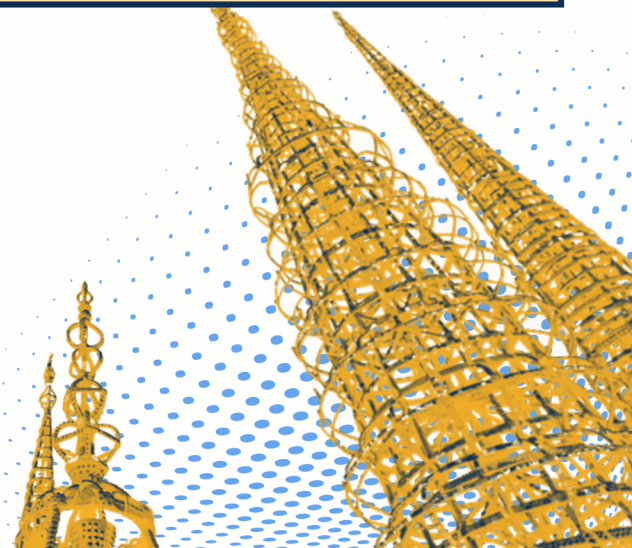

In Memoriam

Greg Goethals, S.J.

January 19, 1955 - November 24, 2025

Verbum Dei Jesuit High School gives thanks to God for the life, priesthood, and fearless leadership of Fr. Gregory M. Goethals, S.J.—a relentless champion of Catholic education whose presence shaped countless lives across Southern California and far beyond. Fr. Greg believed, with his whole heart, in what a Jesuit education makes possible: young people formed with faith, intellect, conscience, and courage, prepared to lead lives of purpose and service.

For Verbum Dei, Fr. Greg was more than a supporter. He was a builder of hope and a trusted friend to our community—especially to our President, Fr. Travis Russell, S.J. He understood our mission at a deep level: accompanying young men from Watts and surrounding neighborhoods as they become “men for others,” grounded in prayer, disciplined in excellence, and ready to transform their families and communities. He carried Verbum Dei in his heart, and he carried our students in his prayers.

In 2023, we were honored to recognize Fr. Greg as a Verbum Dei President’s Gala Honoree—an acknowledgment of what so many already knew: that his advocacy for our school was steadfast, strategic, and rooted in love. He helped shape the very foundation of our benefactor community, not by seeking attention, but by inviting others into relationship with the mission. Fr. Greg had a remarkable gift for making people feel seen, welcomed, and called to something greater. He inspired generosity not through pressure, but through purpose.

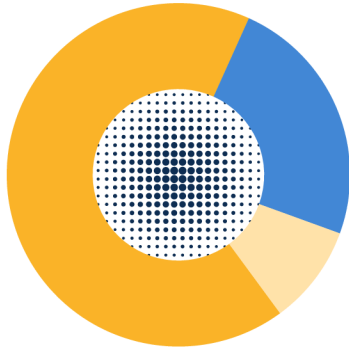
Those who worked alongside him describe his leadership as bold and visionary—yet always human. He could be decisive and direct when the moment demanded it, and light-hearted and joyful when encouragement was needed most. In him, strength and tenderness lived together. He led with clarity, with humor, with deep compassion, and with an unshakeable belief in the dignity of every person.

Fr. Greg’s legacy is written in campuses strengthened, students empowered, and communities renewed—but most of all, in lives changed through his faithful witness. We mourn his passing, and we also celebrate the enduring impact of his vocation: a life poured out in service, animated by the Gospel, and marked by joy.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

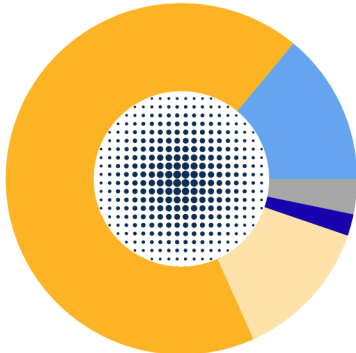

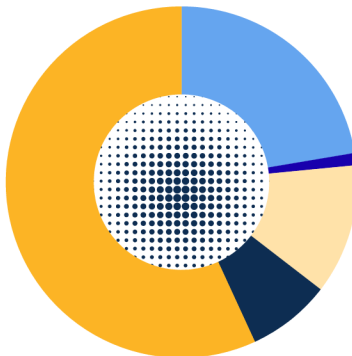

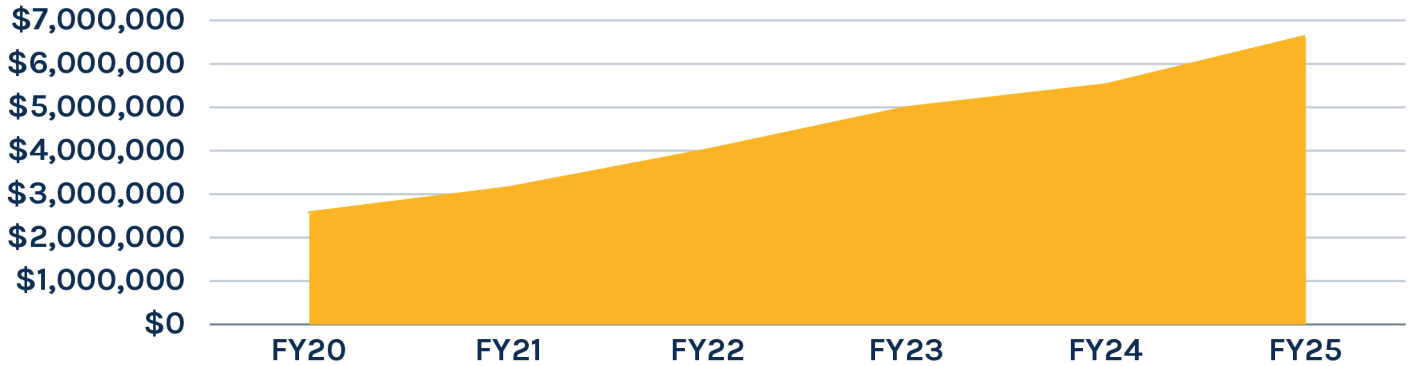

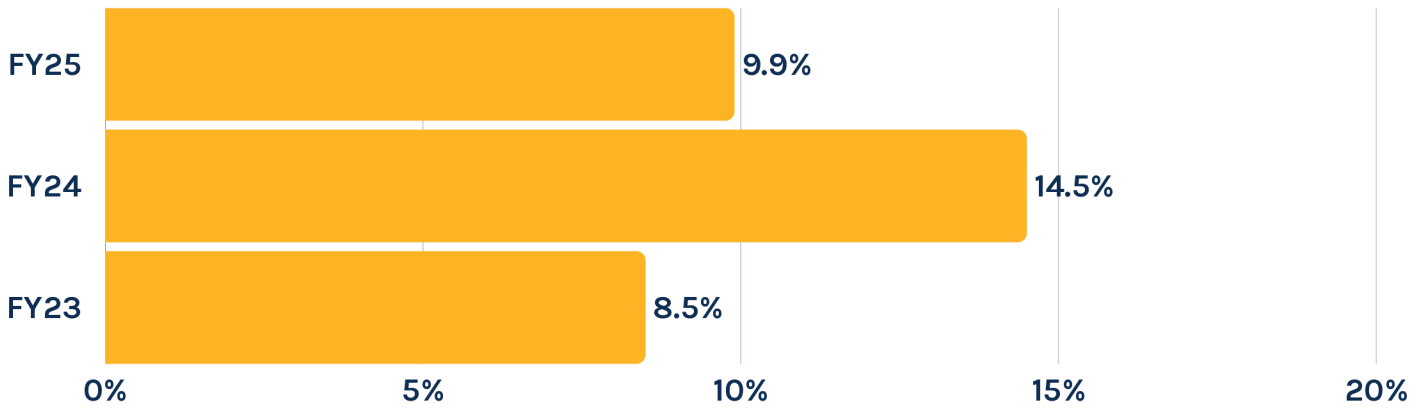

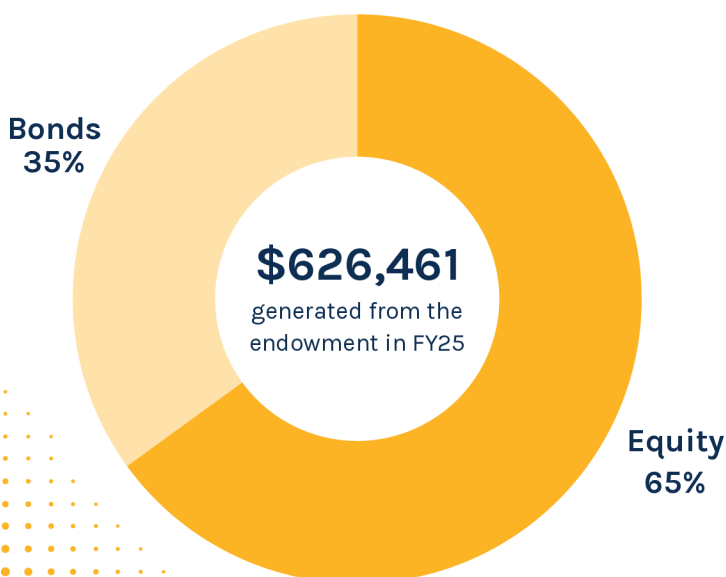
