

IMPORTANT POLICIES FOR PARENTS TO UNDERSTAND

The following policies are important for parents to understand, as they outline the specific prohibitions and rights that govern a student's daily life and a parent's ability to advocate for their child.

Policy #	Policy Title	Summary of What the Policy Prohibits
2:260	Uniform Grievance Procedure	Prohibits the district from ignoring formal complaints regarding violations of rights and mandates a specific timeline for resolving them.
2:270	Discrimination and Harassment on the Basis of Race, Color, and National Origin Prohibited.	Prohibits discrimination and harassment based on actual or perceived race, color, or national origin in all District educational programs, activities, and workplaces, including unequal treatment, denial of opportunities or services, and racially or ethnically offensive conduct.
7:10	Equal Educational Opportunities	Prohibits discrimination or harassment against students based on protected characteristics like race, gender, religion, or sexual orientation.
7:15	Student and Family Privacy Rights	Prohibits the school from requiring students to submit to certain surveys or evaluations regarding sensitive personal beliefs without parental notice/opt-out.
7:20	Harassment of Students Prohibited	Prohibits any person (staff or student) from engaging in sexual harassment or harassment based on protected statuses within the school environment.
7:70	Attendance and Truancy	Prohibits students from being absent without a valid cause and prohibits the district from failing to notify parents of such absences.
7:190	Student Behavior	Prohibits specific "gross disobedience or misconduct," including the use of weapons, drugs, or physical violence on school grounds or at events.
7:140	Search and Seizure	Prohibits "unreasonable" searches of students or their property, requiring "reasonable suspicion" before a search can occur.
7:160	Student Appearance	Prohibits student appearance, dress, or hygiene that disrupts the educational process or compromises health and safety while protecting students' rights to maintain hairstyles and wear attire connected to their cultural, ethnic, or religious identity.
7:180	Prevention of and Response to Bullying, Intimidation, and Harassment	Prohibits bullying, intimidation, harassment, and cyberbullying that disrupts the educational environment or harms students' physical, emotional, mental, or academic well-being, and establishes expectations for prevention, reporting, investigation, intervention, and discipline.
7:220	Bus Conduct	Prohibits unsafe, disruptive, or disobedient behavior on school buses, including conduct that threatens the safety of riders or staff, and establishes consequences, supervision procedures, and expectations for maintaining a safe transportation environment.
7:345	Use of Educational Technologies; Student Data Privacy and Security	Prohibits the unauthorized sale, rental, lease, trading, access, use, modification, or disclosure of student data and requires the secure, lawful use of educational technologies to protect student privacy and support District educational and operational goals.
