**Consent Agenda** Dr. Daniel presented the following consent agenda items with recommendations for approval: Minutes from the regular Board meeting, March 23, 2026; Vouchers for the period ending April 13 & 27, 2026, and the payroll and supplemental pay for the periods ending March 6 & 20, 2026, and April 3, 2026; and Personnel Report.

**Minutes** The Minutes from the regular Board meeting held March 23, 2026, were distributed to Board members for review with a recommendation for approval.

**Vouchers and Payroll** **RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the vouchers for the period ending April 13 & 27, 2026, and the payroll and supplemental pay for the periods ending March 6 & 20, 2026, and April 3, 2026.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Vouchers paid by the Fort Wayne Community Schools total \$22,229,932.34.

Gross wages and fringe benefits paid by the Fort Wayne Community Schools total \$23,395,758.44.

Details of all paid vouchers and payroll remain on file in the Business Office until audited by the State Board of Accounts. Following the audit, these records are stored as required by record retention regulations.

**Personnel Report** The Personnel Report was approved as part of the consent agenda and is located following the signature page.

**School Based Medicaid Reimbursement** Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the School Based Medicaid Reimbursement:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve a contract with Go Solutions to provide Medicaid reimbursement services for a two-year term, effective July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2028. Go Solutions offers a web-based platform for entering data related to eligible services, with pricing that includes an annual software license fee of \$8,000, a flat rate of 5.5% on reimbursed claims over the two-year period, and a one-time implementation fee of \$9,275.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Eligible health-related services include speech/language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, individual psychological evaluations for special education students, as well as transportation services to access these services. Reimbursed funds will support Special Education expenditures that would otherwise be paid from the Education Fund. Funding will come from the Education Fund.

Jennifer Berning, Director of Special Education, and Stephanie Hess, Director of Business Services, were available to answer questions.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the EduShift, Inc, External Evaluator for EACH (Expanding Access to Critical Mental Health Supports) Grant :

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the appointment of EduShift, Inc for evaluation and technical services for the U.S. Department of Education, Expanding Access to Critical Mental Health Supports (EACH) for a yearly amount (with adjustments) of \$175,000.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** EduShift, Inc, a 24-year-old research and evaluation organization, will provide process and outcome evaluation of the EACH Grant program using multiple validated assessment tools to provide ongoing analysis of program results. Expenses represented include evaluators' consultant fees, travel, supplies, office expenses and computer-related costs. Evaluators will also provide management and technical support. This expense will be funded by the EACH grant.

Regan Fry, Manager of Student Mental Health and Dr. Griffin, Director of School Climate and Culture were available to answer questions.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the renewal of our Microsoft Enrollment for Education Solutions (EES) Annual License Agreement from Bell Techlogix of Indianapolis, IN for \$236,602.06.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** This annual Microsoft purchase provides Office 365, Windows and Office licenses for all District owned devices and includes many of the core data center products such as server operating systems, database servers, and desktop management tools.

This purchase is being made pursuant to IC 5-22-10-4 as a special purchase for compatibility with existing systems. FWCS utilizes Microsoft products as part of its enterprise environment, and continuation of these services is necessary to maintain system integration, security, and operational continuity. Pricing is established by Microsoft and is consistent across authorized resellers. Funding will come from the Operations Fund.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve a two-year contract with McMahon's Best One Tire to provide school bus tires and related tire services effective July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2028 in the estimated amount of \$325,000.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Services include providing Tier-1 bus tires and retreads for a fleet of 240 buses as well as wheel refurbishing and alignment services, tire repairs and emergency roadside services. Funding will come from the Operations Fund.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve a contract amendment with Hagerman, Inc. for the Athletic Improvements at Snider and North Side and a contract amendment with Jones Petrie Rafinski for the Wayne Site Improvements Project. The contract with Hagerman, Inc, was originally approved on August 12, 2024 and previously amended on November 25, 2024 and March 24, 2025, totaling an amount of \$16,617,896. The original contract with Jones Petrie Rafinski was approved on March 10, 2025 in the amount of \$452,000.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** This purchase will provide new classroom furniture at Blackhawk, Jefferson, Miami, Northwood and Shawnee Middle Schools and new STEM classroom furniture at all middle schools. The furniture will be installed during the summer of 2026.

Pricing was obtained utilizing the Special Exception Purchasing method pursuant to Indiana Code 5-22-10. Funding will be from the 2026 General Obligation Bond and 2026 Facilities Improvements Lease Bond.

Commercial Food Systems – Special Purchase Authorization

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Commercial Food Systems – Special Purchase Authorization:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve an additional expenditure not to exceed \$400,000 to Commercial Food Systems for the purchase of food products and supplies for Nutrition Services through July 31, 2026.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** These purchases provide food products required for the School Breakfast Program and National School Lunch Program that are not available through other vendors. The products meet FWCS specifications for USDA meal pattern crediting, allergen-free menus, and operational packaging. Vendor selection is based on specification compliance and pricing in accordance with 2 CFR 200 and applicable Child Nutrition regulations.

In accordance with Indiana Code 5-22-10-8, purchases may be made from a single source when only that vendor can supply products meeting the required specifications. Additionally, Indiana Code 5-22-10-5 authorizes purchases that result in savings to the governmental body. Funding will come from the Nutrition Services Fund.

Felipe Guerra, Director of Nutrition Services, was available to answer questions.

Title III Grant, 2025-2027

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the Title III Grant, 2025-2027 from the Indiana Department of Education in the amount of \$615,734.00.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Funds from this grant will allow for the continuation of a range of supplemental services for the district's Multilingual Learners program. The grant supports supplemental instructional materials, professional learning staff and family engagement.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Title IV, Part A Grant, 2025-2027:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the Title IV, Part A Grant, 2025-2027 from the Indiana Department of Education in the amount of \$1,064,539.74.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Title IV, Part A funding is provided to schools under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). It is intended to improve students' academic achievement within three focus areas: well-rounded education, safe and healthy students and technology use and integration.

The allocation is based on enrollments for both public and non-public schools housed within the geographic boundary of the FWCS district. The amount of \$232,257.26 has been allocated to serve identified non-public schools for Title IV, Part A purposes.

Kimberly Brooks, Director of Federal Programs, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Antonette Payne, seconded by Julie Hollingsworth, that the recommendation concerning the Title IV, Part A Grant, 2025-2027 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Title II, Part  
A Grant FFY  
2025

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Title II, Part A Grant FFY 2025:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the Title II, Part A Grant FFY 2025 for usage during the 2025-2027 school years from the Indiana Department of Education in the amount of \$1,752,164.48.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Title II, Part A funding is provided to schools under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The allocation is based on enrollments for both public and non-public schools housed within the FWCS attendance boundary. The amount of \$378,157.22 has been allocated to serve identified non-public schools for Title II, Part A purposes.

Title II, Part A is an entitlement grant provided to supplement the Education Fund. The dollars will be used to implement professional learning activities as needed to further educators' capacity to support students in increasing academic achievement.

Lexia – Adaptive  
Literacy Program

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Lexia – Adaptive Literacy Program:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of a one-year district wide license for Lexia, an adaptive literacy program, in the amount of \$312,556.81.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Lexia is an adaptive online program that provides personalized instruction grounded in the Science of Reading. After two years of district wide implementation across our elementary schools, student data and consistent educator feedback indicate that Lexia is supporting meaningful growth in literacy. Based on these outcomes, we are renewing our commitment to Lexia as a key component of our district wide literacy framework. Funding will come from Textbook Rental.

Shannon Quigley, Director of Elementary Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment was available to answer questions.

Quaver – K-5  
Music  
Curriculum

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve a six-year adoption renewal of a district wide license for Quaver, a K-5 Music Curriculum, in the amount of \$291,060.00.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Quaver Music is a comprehensive digital resource that supports K–5 music instruction through interactive, standards-aligned lessons and activities. Based on educator feedback Quaver increases student engagement while supporting the development of foundational music skills and concepts.

Funding will come from Textbook Rental.

Shannon Quigley, Director of Elementary Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment will be available to answer questions.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Discovery Education – Science Adoption:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of a six-year district wide license for Discovery Education for Elementary Science adoption in the amount of \$899,998.10.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Discovery Science is a comprehensive digital resource that supports elementary science instruction through engaging, standards-aligned content. Based on educator feedback during a district pilot, Discovery Science was selected by teachers. Discovery Science will align to our ELA curriculum and strengthen science instruction ensuring consistent access to high-quality materials across all elementary schools. Funding will come from Textbook Rental.

Shannon Quigley, Director of Elementary Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment was available to answer questions.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the McGraw Hill Science ICP, Earth Space, Physics:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve a six-year adoption renewal of McGraw Hill for Integrated Physics-Chemistry, Earth Space Science and Physics in the amount of \$284,337.73

**RELATED INFORMATION:** McGraw Hill Inspire Science is a comprehensive high school curriculum aligned to state and national standards, designed to engage students in inquiry-based learning and real-world problem-solving through the proven 5E instructional framework. This 6-year adoption recommendation ensures a consistent, high-quality learning trajectory that shifts students from passive observers to active investigators of physical phenomena. Funding will come from Textbook Rental.

Dave Meyer, Secondary STEM Coordinator and Courtney Lumbley, Director of Secondary Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment were available to answer questions.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the SAVVAS Science 6-8, Biology, Chemistry:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve a six-year adoption renewal of SAVVAS Science for grades 6-8, Biology, and Chemistry in the amount of \$1,063,875.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Savvas Science is a comprehensive science curriculum aligned to state and national standards, designed to engage students in critical thinking and real-world problem-solving. These resources provide teachers with a cohesive 6-year pathway that bridges the gap between middle school discovery and high school mastery. This adoption ensures our students have access to a consistent, cutting-edge learning environment that prepares them for the STEM careers of the future. Funding will come from Textbook Rental.

Dave Meyer, Secondary STEM Coordinator and Courtney Lumbley, Director of Secondary Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment were available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Maria Norman, seconded by Julie Hollingsworth, that the recommendation concerning the SAVVAS Science 6-8, Biology, Chemistry be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

McGraw Hill  
Social  
Studies  
Adoption

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the McGraw Hill Social Studies Adoption:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board approve a six-year adoption renewal of McGraw Hill Social Studies grades 6-8, US History, World History, Government, Economics, Geography, Psychology, and Sociology in the amount of \$1,732,126.82.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** McGraw Hill Social Studies is a comprehensive curriculum aligned to state and national standards, designed to engage students in critical thinking and real-world problem-solving through a robust inquiry-based framework. This 6-year adoption recommendation provides a seamless vertical pathway from middle school to high school, in order to transform students into informed, active citizens. By centering instruction on "compelling questions" and the analysis of primary sources, the curriculum moves beyond memorization to foster deep historical and civic reasoning. Funding will come from Textbook Rental.

Josh Riikonen, Experiential Learning Coordinator and Courtney Lumbley, Director of Secondary Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment were available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Maria Norman, seconded by Jennifer Matthias, that the recommendation concerning the McGraw Hill Social Studies Adoption be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Museum of Art Board Appointments

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Museum of Art Board Appointments:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board reappoint Matt Schiebel and appoint Courtney Lumbley to the Board of the Fort Wayne Museum of Art for three-year terms. Both have agreed to serve as members of this board.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The Board of School Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools is entitled to appoint two members to the Board of the Fort Wayne Museum of Art.

This will be Matt's second and last term, as members may not serve more than two consecutive terms. Courtney, who is the Director of Middle Schools & Secondary Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment replaces Josh Riikonen. The three-year terms began June 1, 2026, and will end May 31, 2029.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Steve Corona, that the recommendation concerning the Museum of Art Board Appointments be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Appointment of Deputy Treasurer

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Appointment of Deputy Treasurer:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that Brigitte Godwin be appointed as deputy treasurer, for calendar year 2026, and that bonds for these positions be set as follows: Deputy Treasurer \$50,000.

It is further recommended that the administration be granted authority to execute any corporate resolutions required by the various banking depositories.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** IC 20-26-4-1 provides for appointment of a treasurer and deputy treasurers at the same time that the new Board organizes.

Ms. Godwin started with the District after this date as Fiscal Affairs Manager. She will serve as a deputy treasurer along with full-time deputy treasurer Angela Ridge; Director of Fiscal Affairs, Michelle Cammack; and Treasurer Sherry Nidlinger, all of whom were appointed in January.

IC 20-26-4-5 provides that the treasurer and deputy treasurers give a bond for the faithful performance of duty in an amount determined by the governing body.

Rosie Shipman, Chief Financial Officer, was available to answer questions.

Teacher Appreciation Grant (TAG)

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Teacher Appreciation Grant (TAG):

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board accept the Teacher Appreciation Grant funding from the Indiana Department of Education in the amount of \$1,020,431.53.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Last year, the Indiana Legislature overhauled Indiana’s Teacher Appreciation Grant program with HEA 1001 (2025), changing it from a broad, evaluation-based bonus system to a limited model that ties eligibility to student impact and outcomes. With these funds, FWCS plans to pay teachers who met criteria designated under the new state-controlled framework. Selected teachers will receive their grants on May 15, 2026.

Michelle Bosworth, Chief Human Resources Officer, was available to answer questions.

Presentation

Adrienne Shroyer, Director of College & Career Readiness and School Counseling, presented an overview of the Higher Education Coalition. She provided an overview of the Higher Education Coalition’s purpose, current membership, and key areas of focus. She was joined by Todd Ruppert, Northrop Coordinator of School Counseling, and both were available to answer questions.

Comments

Noah Smith read the resignation letter of Anne Duff, after 12 years of service on the Board of School Trustees, as she and her family have moved out of the district.

Board Member Steve Corona reflected on Anne’s long-standing dedication to Fort Wayne Community Schools, noting her involvement since 1999 and her service on the Board beginning in 2015. He emphasized her strong advocacy for public education, including her work speaking with legislators in Indianapolis, and expressed hope that she would be formally recognized. Member Corona also congratulated two women with ties to Fort Wayne Community School’s Rachel King Merz, current Croninger Principal and Maria Marchesano, Elmhurst Alumni and current Butler University Head Coach for their recognition on a silver anniversary women’s basketball team and mentioned a former FWCS family whose son was recently drafted into the NFL.

Board Member Maria Norman, shared that it had been an emotional time for her with Anne’s resignation. She spoke about attending Study Elementary’s 100th anniversary celebration. Member Norman described the event as meaningful, highlighting student projects that represented different decades from the 1920s to today, as well as performances by students and strong participation from alumni and staff. She expressed pride in the school community and looked forward to continued celebrations.

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth expressed agreement with others about Anne’s impact, describing her as a tireless advocate for public education and FWCS students. She noted Anne’s continued involvement with schools even after her employment and said she would be missed, wishing her well and hoping she would continue to stay connected.

Board Member Antonette Payne shared that although she has only been on the Board for a short time, Anne was one of the first people to support and guide her. She appreciated the opportunity to learn from Anne and expressed that she will be missed.

Board Member Jennifer Matthias first congratulated the Snider Final Four 3DE team, describing how impressed she was with the students’ collaboration, growth, and professionalism, especially as they worked through challenges and built friendships across differences with regard to their national competition with Arby’s. Member Matthias reflected on her own journey from a concerned parent attending Board meetings to becoming a Board member, with Noah Smith, emphasizing how Anne mentored her and encouraged her to advocate for public education at the state level. Ms. Matthias highlighted the importance of parent involvement and advocacy, crediting Anne for inspiring her and others to speak up for students and thanked Anne for her lasting impact.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel spoke about Anne’s deep ties to the community, including her involvement in Rotary and youth exchange programs, and noted that she will be greatly missed. He also

mentioned recent student involvement in opening day at the Fort Wayne Zoo and emphasized the importance of dialogue and collaboration in improving the district. Dr. Daniel discussed data showing that many students remain in Indiana for higher education and highlighted the value of FWCS programs such as dual credit opportunities and unique partnerships that support student success and community growth.

Board President Noah Smith, reflected on Anne's mentorship and the influence of her own mentors, noting how she guided him and Jennifer when they first became involved as advocates and School Board members. He emphasized Anne's passion for equitable public education and her lasting impact on the community. He thanked her family for sharing her with the district and encouraged continued advocacy for students, even when there are disagreements, recognizing Anne's role in inspiring others to take action.


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
