D. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Mrs. Eisner

Lame Duck Session Activity at the State House

- **Both the Assembly and Senate Education Committees** have been actively holding meetings and considering a range of education-related bills as the 2025 legislative session nears its January 13th end.
- A **voting session** was also held at the State House, and committees continued to advance and review legislation with implications for school districts. NJSBA will continue to monitor legislation affecting schools and post weekly updates.

1. S3316 – Regional School District Study Commission

- Establishes a commission to study the governance and funding of regional school districts.
- Focus areas include equitable cost sharing and district representation.

2. S2433 – Career Pathways Promotion

Encourages integration of career awareness and technical education into middle and high school curricula.

3. Graduation Test Requirement May Be Eliminated (A4121)

Although more relevant to high schools, the Assembly passed a bill eliminating the NJGPA as a graduation requirement, reflecting broader efforts to move away from high-stakes standardized testing.

K–8 implication: May signal future changes in state assessment policy overall.

4. School Finance Reform Commission Proposed (A6205)

Legislation would create a School Finance Reform Commission to study and recommend changes to New Jersey’s school funding formula.

Implication: Potential future impact on state aid distribution, especially for smaller or regional K–8 districts.

5. Therapy Dog Pilot Program (S3330 / A1165)

Advanced by both Senate and Assembly committees, this bill would establish a 3-year pilot program allowing therapy dogs in selected elementary schools to support student wellness. Under the proposal, *selected districts* would participate (two from each of the state’s southern, central, and northern regions), with guidance provided by the Commissioner of Education on implementation.

Implication: If enacted, select K–8 districts could apply to participate.

6. School Meal Access and Posting Requirements (S4973)

Would require public schools to prominently post subsidized meal applications on their websites to ensure all families are aware.

K–8 implication: Compliance may require website and communication updates.

7. Special Education Cost and Placement Reporting (S4970 / S3039)

Two bills would strengthen transparency in special education, requiring districts to report detailed data on:

- Out-of-district placements
- Cost per student
- Timelines and services

Implication: Districts would need to prepare for enhanced reporting requirements.

8. Emergency Drill Reform (A5826)

Would adjust school safety drill requirements to reduce student trauma, while maintaining preparedness.

Implication: May prompt updates to drill procedures and staff training in K–8 buildings.

9. Charter School Reform Legislation Advances

A sweeping charter school reform bill advanced in the NJ Senate Education Committee. Key provisions include: -

- A ban on for-profit charter operators -
- Mandatory transparency: budgets, contracts, executive pay, IRS filings, and trustee names must be publicly posted -
- At least one-third of charter trustees must reside locally -
- Ban on fully virtual charter schools -
- Enrollment protections to prevent selective admissions and offloading students -
- Restrictions on new charters if nearby schools have vacancies

If enacted, the bill could increase accountability, reduce rapid charter expansion, and improve fiscal transparency.

10. A4941 – Seniority Credit for Veterans in Support Roles

- Allows educational support professionals (e.g., aides, clerical staff) who are veterans to receive **up to four years of seniority credit** for their military service.
- Mirrors existing protections already available to teaching staff.
