HEARING

The Hearing Itinerant Program provides students with hearing loss with a range of supports to access learning opportunities at school, at home, and in the community.

Areas of Focus:

- Instruction in academics and communication.
- Support in the use of various amplification systems.
- Specialized consultation and professional development for staff on supporting students with hearing loss, equipping educators with the tools and strategies necessary for student success.

ADAPTED PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Adapted PE is a modified physical education program ensuring that children with significant needs can participate in physical activities in ways that are safe, enjoyable, and beneficial for their physical, emotional, and social development.

Areas of focus:

- Individualized instruction that targets physical, emotional, and social wellness.
- The use of modified activities and equipment to facilitate activity and participation.
- Inclusion opportunities with peers, when appropriate, and consultation with general education physical education teachers.



VISION

Provides students with significant vision loss with a variety of supports to access learning opportunities at school, home, and in the community.

Areas of focus:

- Instruction provided in both academic and daily living skills.
- Instruction in the use of Braille and other tactile learning systems.
- Specialized consultation and professional development for staff on supporting students with vision impairments, equipping educators with the tools and strategies necessary for student success.

ORIENTATION & MOBILITY

O&M Specialists empower students with visual impairments to travel safely and independently in their schools, communities, and residential areas.

Areas of focus:

- Orientation, travel, and route planning in familiar and new environments.
- Understanding and using environmental cues (sound, texture, landmarks).

Specialized consultation and professional development for staff on supporting students with vision impairments, equipping educators with the tools and strategies necessary for safe student travel.
