MINUTES

Regular Board Meeting
Santa Ana Board of Education

Tuesday, April 28, 2026

1. CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Brazer Aceves called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m.

Other members in attendance were Mr. Bustos and Ms. Magdaleno.

Ms. Brazer Aceves announced closed session items including Conference with Labor Negotiators, Personnel Matters, Anticipated Litigation, and Conference with Real Property Negotiators.

There was no one wishing to address the Board related to closed session items.

2. RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular Board meeting recessed to closed session at 5:05 p.m.

Ms. Lebsack joined the meeting at 5:09 p.m.

3. RECONVENE TO REGULAR MEETING

The Regular Board meeting reconvened at 6:02 p.m.

Cabinet members in attendance were Dr. Perez, Ms. Flores, Mr. Hacker, Ms. Barquin, and Mr. Bustamante.

Ms. Brazer Aceves noted for the record that Dr. Alvarez was absent.

4. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Superintendent Dr. Perez led the Pledge of Allegiance.

5. LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Ms. Brazer Aceves read the following statement: *"I want to recognize that our District and school campuses are located in the Village of Pasbenga. I want to acknowledge that this land we refer to as Orange County, is the unceded and traditional lands of the Gabrielino Tongva Nation, and the Juaneño Band of Mission Indians Acjachemen Nation. These lands were taken through a process of colonization, physical, and cultural genocide. I want to pay my respect to elders, both past and present, as well as the Tongva and Acjachemen Youth who have attended and are currently attending our schools, or in the neighboring districts."*

7.1 Recognition of Community Partners and Santa Ana Unified School District Staff for Their Support of the Immigration Support Plan

Ms. Brazer Aceves recognized the collective effort across the District and community in support of students and families through SAUSD's Immigration Support Plan. President Brazer Aceves extended gratitude to District departments, school sites, Family and Community Engagement teams, mental health teams, individual educators, and external partners including the Mexican Consulate, Orange County Supervisor's Office, Orange County Health Care Agency, Santa Ana City Council, Santa Ana College, Law Office of Jose Alfredo Hernandez, Orange County Justice Fund, SoCal Legal Aid, Community Health Initiative of Orange County, Orange County Rapid Response Network, Orange County Response, and United Across Borders.

8. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Perez delivered the Superintendent's Report highlighting student accomplishments and staff recognitions. Century High School E-Business Academy placed 4th place out of hundreds of teams in the Bakersfield Invitational. They qualified for national finals at the Youth Business Summit in New York City for the first time in 25 years. The SAUSD Track and Field Invitational hosted at Saddleback High School, showcased special education student inclusion and achievement. Dr. Perez recognized National Librarian Day, Afterschool Professionals Week, Administrative Professionals Day, School Nutrition Employee Week, School Principal's and Assistant Principal's Day.

She shared that Employee of the Month awards were presented to Teresa Mata at Taft Elementary School, a 27-year Teacher serving as School Site Council President and Department Lead, and Valeria Hernandez at Santa Ana Virtual Academy, an Attendance Clerk recognized for her dedication. Superintendent Perez welcomed our new leadership team members, Sergio Zazueta as Executive Director of Facilities and Operations and Lazaro (Larry) Pita as Manager of District Safety Programs and Compliance.

STUDENT BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Mr. Abascal reported on AVID achievements, announcing that SAUSD AVID students earned \$85,500 in scholarships at the OC AVID Senior Awards Night at UCI on April 15. He highlighted an alumnus from Godinez, now an AVID teacher in Newport Mesa, who shared that AVID changed his life trajectory 11 years ago. Mr. Abascal also reported on an alternative high school volleyball tournament held at Century High School, where Circulos at Advanced Learning Academy won the tournament. He thanked Dr. Emily Wolk for meeting with student Board members to review District data through the Panorama survey and LCAP survey.

Ms. Gomez reported on multiple student achievements. Isai Alamilla and Catherine Rueda from Godinez Fundamental High School qualified for the 2026 National Speech and Debate Tournament in Richmond, Virginia. Ms. Gomez recognized the Santa Ana High School girls wrestling team for their 2025-26 accomplishments, including earning titles like Empire League Champions, CIF Division 1 Dual Meet Champions, CIF Eastern Division Individuals Champions, Southern Section Masters 4th Place, California State 8th Place. Individual recognitions included Hayden Arce, Andrea Navarrete, and Michelle Rodriguez for placing 3rd in League; Yahira Marmolejo, and Maryanne Quiñonez for placing 2nd League; Marley Zepeda as League Champion; Isabella Garcia as League Champion and 7th place CIF; Olivia Lavanderos as League Champion and 6th place CIF; Anabelle Serratos as League Champion and CIF Champion; Gabriela Martinez as League Champion, 2nd place CIF, and 4th place Masters; Eliana Salazar as League Champion, CIF Champion, and 2nd place Masters; Marley Nelson as League Champion, CIF Champion, and 3rd place Masters; Tiffany Nguyen as League Champion, CIF Champion, 2nd place Masters; Angelica "Cookie" Serratos as League Champion, CIF Champion, Masters Champion, and State Champion, currently ranked No. 3 in the Nation.

Ms. Magdaleno expressed support for the new civic engagement policy and highlighted that the policy formalizes student voter registration efforts by designating a voter outreach coordinator, strengthens participation during High School Voter Education Week, and integrates voter education into 11th and 12th grade history and government classes. She thanked the team for the intentional work and expressed excitement about seeing the policy implemented across classrooms and posters displayed at high schools during voter registration week.

Ms. Lebsack raised concerns about voter registration and undocumented students, requesting that the Board fully examine and answer questions about how SAUSD will assure that undocumented students do not inadvertently register to vote.

Mr. Bustos thanked the public speakers from the community who spoke on very important topics and looks forward to hearing updates from staff specifically related to enrollment and Special Education. Mr. Bustos shared that he visited Martin Elementary, Lincoln Elementary, Chavez High Schools, attended the Math Field Day competition, the Godinez senior exit interviews, and the High School Choral Share event celebrating arts in the District.

Brazer Aceves requested an open session to be added to the May 12 Board meeting to celebrate California Distinguished Schools (Middle College, MacArthur, and Godinez) and asked that the celebration occur before the closed session. She recognized recent community events including the Sylvia Mendez Day press conference at Mendez Fundamental Intermediate School, Kinder Caminata at Santa Ana College, Valley High School's open house and unveiling of the "Poderosas" art project honoring local women, Jackson Elementary's open house, the Mariachi Festival, and the Godinez senior exit interviews.

- Monitor and enforce compliance with state and federal laws related to athletics, including student safety requirements and equity in participation. **E**
- Provide training and support to athletic directors, principals, and coaches on CIF rules, eligibility, Title IX, and compliance-related requirements. **E**
- Oversee recruitment, hiring, assignment, and evaluation of athletic coaches in accordance with District policies and collective bargaining agreements. **E**
- Review and monitor athletic budgets, expenditures, and facility use to ensure proper resource allocation and fiscal compliance. **E**
- Serve as the District's liaison with CIF, league representatives, and community partners regarding compliance and governance issues. **E**
- Oversee the implementation of health and safety protocols, including concussion management, conditioning standards, and emergency procedures. **E**
- Develop and present reports, data, and compliance audits to District leadership and the Board of Education. **E**
- Provide leadership to ensure equitable access to athletic opportunities for all students, including monitoring gender equity and participation rates. **E**
- Perform other related duties as assigned.



Policy 5113.12: District School Attendance Review Board

Status: ADOPTED

Original Adopted Date: 09/11/2024 | **Last Revised Date:** 04/28/2026 | **Last Reviewed Date:** 04/28/2026

The Governing Board recognizes that poor school attendance and behavior problems negatively impact student learning and achievement and put students at greater risk of dropping out of school. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a comprehensive and integrated system for the early identification of attendance problems and shall implement strategies to encourage students' attendance. After other interventions have been exhausted, students with a pattern of unexcused absences may be referred to a school attendance review board (SARB), in accordance with applicable law, in order to receive intensive guidance and assistance.

The SARB shall maintain a continuing inventory of community resources, including alternative educational programs.

The Superintendent or designee shall collaborate with the SARB and appropriate community agencies, including, but not limited to, law enforcement agencies, child welfare agencies, and health services, to provide school-based and/or community-based interventions tailored to the specific needs of the student.

The Board shall appoint members to the district's SARB, who may include a parent/guardian, as well as representatives of various agencies including, but not limited to, school districts; the county probation department; the county welfare department; the County Superintendent of Schools; law enforcement agencies; community-based youth service centers; school guidance personnel; child welfare and attendance personnel; school or county health care personnel; school, county, or community mental health personnel; the county district attorney's office; and the county public defender's office. (Education Code 48321)

Each SARB shall, at least annually, consult with students who reflect the diversity of all the schools that are served by the SARB for the purpose of soliciting input that will assist SARB members in gaining a better understanding of, and proposing interventions for, student attendance and behavioral challenges. (Education Code 48321)

The district's SARB shall provide support to improve student attendance and behavior through proactive efforts focused on building positive school environments and improved school connectedness, early identification and immediate intervention to re-engage students with poor attendance or behavior, and intensive intervention with students and families to address severe or persistent attendance or behavior issues.

The district's SARB shall operate in accordance with Board Bylaw 9320 - Meeting and Notices, Board Bylaw 9321 - Closed Session, and Board Bylaw 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials; Education Code 48320-48325; applicable rules and regulations of the County Office of Education's SARB; and the Ralph M. Brown Act (open meeting requirements).

The SARB shall collect data and annually report outcomes on SARB referrals to the Board, Superintendent or designee, and County Superintendent of Schools. (Education Code 48273)

Policy 6146.1: High School Graduation Requirements

Status: ADOPTED

Original Adopted Date: 11/12/2024 | **Last Revised Date:** 04/28/2026 | **Last Reviewed Date:** 04/28/2026

1. **SCOPE:** The Board of Education desires to prepare all students to obtain a high school diploma to enable them to take advantage of opportunities for postsecondary education and/or employment.

2. **POLICY:** Credit Requirements

District students shall complete graduation course requirements as specified in Education Code 51225.3. Unless exempted as provided in "Exemptions from District-Adopted Graduation Requirements," district students shall also complete other course requirements adopted by the Board. Students who are exempted from district-adopted graduation requirements shall be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and school activity related to graduation in which other students are eligible to participate.

Minimum academic standards for graduation from senior high school in the Santa Ana Unified School District beginning with the Class of 2009 are as follows:

- Satisfactory completion of a minimum of two hundred and twenty (220) semester periods of credit.
- Semester credit and the time or content equivalency mean:
 - One period of forty (40) to sixty (60) minutes of instructional time per week throughout one semester or no less than seventeen (17) weeks is the equivalent of one semester credit.
 - A minimum of twelve (12) clock hours of instructional time provided during the academic year or in a summer school is the equivalent of one semester credit.

In certain cases, with prior approval of the principal, credit may be assigned when equivalent learning is achieved through individualized instructional programs except in subjects for which a minimum of instructional time is specified by law.

Course Requirements - Comprehensive High Schools

Total Graduation Requirements: 220 semester credits (minimum)

All courses required for high school graduation shall be aligned to District and State standards, where applicable.

To obtain a high school diploma, students shall complete the following courses in grades 9-12, with each course being one year unless otherwise specified. Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) has aligned the high school graduation requirements to meet A-G eligibility requirements, including validation rules specified by the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC) systems.

1. English : 4 years (40 credits) which can include UC approved courses and classes taken in a foreign country. (Education Code 51225.3)
2. Mathematics: 3 years (30 credits) including Algebra I and Geometry. Completion of such coursework prior to grade 9 shall satisfy the Algebra I or Mathematics I requirement, but shall not exempt a student from the requirement to complete two mathematics courses in grades 9-1 (Education code 51224.5) Students may be awarded up to one mathematics course credit for successful completion of an approved computer science course that is classified as a "category c" course based on the "a-g" course requirements for college admission. (Education Code 51225.3, 51225.35) Validation rules apply, as specified by the CSU and UC systems.
3. Science : 2 years (20 credits) including one course of Biology/Life Science and one course of Physical Science.
4. Social Science: 3 years (30 credits) including World History, Culture and Geography(10 credits); U.S. History and Geography (10 credits); Principles of American Democracy (5 credits); and Principles of Economics (5 credits).
5. World Languages: 2 years (20 credits) in the same language. Courses in Languages Other Than English

(LOTE) taken in seventh and eighth grades may be used to fulfill part of the requirement. A course in American Sign Language shall be deemed a course in world language. Education Code 51223 Validation rules apply, as specified by the CSU and UC systems.

6. Visual and Performing Arts: 1 year (10 credits) in year-long sequence in a single area (dance, drama/theater, music, or visual arts) requiring the first semester as a prerequisite.
7. College and Career: Student Skills/College and Career Planning to be included in the Planning/Technology intermediate and high school curriculum.
Technology: Technology shall be integrated throughout the intermediate and high school curriculum. Technology requirements shall be met through a District approved demonstration of technological competence.
8. Physical Education: 2 years (20 credits) unless the student has been exempted. (Education Code 51225.3)
9. **Ethnic Studies:** 1 year (10 credits) beginning with the Class of 2026, consisting of **one fall and one spring semester** of any qualifying Ethnic Studies course, (Education Code 51225.3)

Local Exemption for Academic Success: Notwithstanding the District standard, the Board recognizes that California Education Code 51225.3 mandates a minimum of 5 credits (one semester) of Ethnic Studies beginning with the Class of 2030. The Superintendent or designee may grant a partial waiver of the local requirement-reducing the obligation from 10 credits to 5 credits-for students whose academic progress or graduation status is negatively impacted by the additional 5-credit local mandate. This exemption shall only apply to the additional 5 credits required by the District. All students must still complete the 5-credit state minimum to satisfy graduation requirements.

10. Financial Aid Completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) is required for high school graduation. The parent or legal guardian of the pupil, or the pupil if the pupil is a legally emancipated minor or 18 years of age or older, may opt out of the requirements by completing and submitting an opt-out form. (Education Code 51225.7)

Pursuant to Education Code 51230, if the district requires the completion of community service hours for high school graduation, the district may provide a student with credit towards that requirement for completion of a course in community emergency response training. However, if the district chooses to offer credit for the completion of such a course, the Board is still obligated to notify parents/guardians, students, and the public of information specified in Education 51225.3.

Alternative Course Requirements - Educational Options (Continuation) High Schools

Santa Ana Unified School District recognizes that some students other than Foster Youth, McKinney-Vento Youth, Formally Incarcerated Youth, Migratory Youth, Military Family Youth, or New Arrived Immigrant Youth struggle to meet the district's graduation requirements. Students with academic issues, behavior issues, attendance issues, mental health issues, past trauma issues, social-emotional issues, parenting teens, and/or students who economically support their families sometimes struggle to meet the district's graduation requirements. The Educational Options Alternative Course Requirements listed below will apply to Cesar E. Chavez High School and Lorin Griset Academy, which are both Continuation High Schools.

The Educational Options Course Requirements aims to support students whose educational journeys benefit from an alternative setting, providing opportunities for graduation while maintaining rigorous standards aligned to state requirements, while still offering students the courses that will prepare them for Community College, Trade School, and/or Career and Employment Opportunities.

Total Educational Options Alternative Graduation Requirements: 170 semester credits (minimum)

1. English: 3 years (30 Credits) which can be fulfilled with three one year-long sequence courses.
2. Mathematics: 2 years (20 Credits) including one year of Algebra I and one year of Geometry.
3. Science: 2 years (20 Credits) including one year of Biology/Life Science and one year of Physical Science.
4. Social Science: 3 years (30 Credits) including one year of World History (10 credits), one year of U.S. History (10 credits), one semester of Government/Principles of American Democracy (5 credits), and one

semester of Economics/Principles of Economics (5 credits).

5. World Languages: 2 years (20 Credits) which can be fulfilled with two one year-long sequence courses in the same language. Courses in Languages Other Than English (LOTE) taken in seventh and eighth grades may be used to fulfil all or part of the requirement. A course in American Sign Language shall be deemed a course in world language. (Education Code 51223)
6. Visual and Performing Arts: 1 year (10 Credits) which can be fulfilled with one year-long sequence course.
7. Physical Education: 2 years (20 Credits) which can be fulfilled with two one year-long sequence courses unless the student has been exempted. (Education Code 51225.3)
8. Electives: 2 years (20 Credits) which can be fulfilled through the successful completion of a qualifying course that meets the district's specifications.
9. Ethnic Studies: 1 year (10 credits) beginning with the Class of 2026, consisting of one fall and one spring semester of any qualifying Ethnic Studies course. (Education Code 51225.3)

Local Exemption for Academic Success: Notwithstanding the District standard, the Board recognizes that California Education Code 51225.3 mandates a minimum of 5 credits (one semester) of Ethnic Studies beginning with the Class of 2030. The Superintendent or designee may grant a partial waiver of the local requirement - reducing the obligation from 10 credits to 5 credits-for students whose academic progress or graduation status is negatively impacted by the additional 5-credit local mandate. This exemption shall only apply to the additional 5 credits required by the District. All students must still complete the 5-credit state minimum to satisfy graduation requirements.

10. Financial Aid – Completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) is required for high school graduation. The parent or legal guardian of the pupil, or the pupil of the pupil is a legally emancipated minor or 18 years of age or older, may opt out of the requirements by completing and submitting an opt-out form. (Education Code 51225.7)

Exemptions from District Adopted Graduation Requirements

A foster youth, homeless student, former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, migrant student, or newly arrived immigrant student participating in a newcomer program who transfers into the District any time after completing the second year of high school shall be required to complete all graduation requirements specified in Education Code 51225.3 but shall be exempt from any additional District-adopted graduation requirements, unless the Superintendent or designee makes a finding that the student is reasonably able to complete the requirements in time to graduate by the end of the fourth year of high school. Within 30 days of the transfer, any such student shall be notified of the availability of the exemption and whether the student qualifies for it. (Education Code 51225.1)

The Superintendent or designee shall not require or request the foster youth, student experiencing homelessness, former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, migrant student, or newcomer student who is exempted from district-established graduation requirements and who completes the statewide coursework requirements before the end of the fourth year of high school, and would otherwise be entitled to remain in school, to graduate before the end of the student's fourth year of high school. (Education Code 51225.1)

If the foster youth, student experiencing homelessness, former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, migrant student, or newcomer student was not properly notified of an exemption, declined the exemption, or was not previously exempted, the student or the student's educational rights holder may request the exemption and the Superintendent or designee shall exempt the student within 30 days of the request. Any such student who at one time qualified for the exemption may request the exemption even if the student is no longer eligible. (Education Code 51225.1)

Annually, the Superintendent or designee shall report to the California Department of Education, in accordance with Education Code 51225.1, the number of students graduating from the fourth or fifth year of high school who, for the prior school year, graduated with an exemption from district-established graduation requirements that are in addition to statewide coursework requirements.

Exemption from District-Established Graduation Requirements/Alternative Pathway to a Diploma for Students with Exceptional Needs

District students shall complete all course requirements for high school graduation as specified in Board Policy 6146.1 - High School Graduation Requirements. However, a student with a disability may be exempted from all coursework and other requirements adopted by the Board that are in addition to the statewide course requirements for high school graduation if the student's IEP provides for both of the following requirements: (Education Code 51225.31).

1. That the student take the alternate assessment aligned to alternate achievement standards in grade 11 as described in Education Code 60640
2. That the student complete state standards aligned coursework to meet the statewide coursework specified in Education Code 51225.3

Prior to the beginning of grade 10, the IEP team for each student with a disability shall determine whether the student is eligible for the exemption, and if so, notify the student's parent/guardian of the exemption. (Education Code 51225.31)

Any such exempted student shall receive a diploma and be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and school activity related to graduation in which a student of similar age without a disability would be eligible to participate. (Education Code 51225.31)

Certificate of Educational Achievement or Completion

Instead of a high school diploma, a student with a disability may be awarded a certificate or document of educational achievement or completion if the student has met one of the following requirements: (Education Code 56390)

1. Satisfactorily completed a prescribed alternative course of study approved by the board of the district in which the student attended school or the district with jurisdiction over the student as identified in the student's IEP
2. Satisfactorily met the student's IEP goals and objectives during high school as determined by the IEP team
3. Satisfactorily attended high school, participated in the instruction as prescribed in the student's IEP, and met the objectives of the statement of transition services

A student with a disability who meets any of the criteria specified above shall be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and any school activity related to graduation in which a graduating student of similar age without disabilities would be eligible to participate. (Education Code 56391)

Retroactive Diplomas

Any student who completed grade 12 in the 2003-04 through 2014-15 school year and met all applicable graduation requirements other than the passage of the high school exit examination shall be granted a high school diploma. (Education Code 51413)

In addition, the district may retroactively grant high school diplomas to former students who: (Education Code 48204.4, 51430, 51440)

1. Departed California against their will while in grade 12 and did not receive a diploma because the departure interrupted their education, provided that they were in good academic standing at the time of the departure. Persons may be considered to have departed California against their will if they were in custody of a government agency and were transferred to another state, were subject to a lawful order from a court or government agency that authorized their removal from California, were subject to a lawful order and were permitted to depart California before being removed from California pursuant to the lawful order, were removed or were permitted to depart voluntarily pursuant to the federal Immigration and Nationality Act, or departed due to other circumstances determined by the district that are consistent with the purposes of Education Code 48204.4.
2. In determining whether to award a diploma under these circumstances, the Superintendent or designee shall consider any coursework that may have been completed outside of the U.S. or

through online or virtual courses

3. Were interned by order of the federal government during World War II or are honorably discharged veterans of World War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War, provided that they were enrolled in a district high school immediately preceding the internment or military service and did not receive a diploma because their education was interrupted due to the internment or military service in those wars. Deceased former students who satisfy these conditions may be granted a retroactive diploma to be received by their next of kin.
4. Are veterans who entered the military service of the U.S. while in grade 12 and who had satisfactorily completed the first half of the work required for grade 12 in a district school
5. Were in their senior year of high school during the 2019-20 school year, were in good academic standing and on track to graduate at the end of the 2019-20 school year as of March 1, 2020, and were unable to complete the statewide graduation requirements as a result of the COVID-19 crisis

HONORARY DIPLOMAS:

The Board may grant honorary high school diplomas to: (Education Code 51225.5)

1. An international exchange student who has not completed the course of study ordinarily required for graduation and who is returning to the student's home country following the completion of one academic school year in the District.
2. A student who is terminally ill.

The honorary diploma shall be clearly distinguishable from the regular diploma of graduation awarded by the district. (Education Code 51225.5)

Policy 6146.4: Differential Graduation And Competency Standards For Students With Disabilities

Status: ADOPTED

The Governing Board recognizes that students with disabilities are entitled to a course of study that provides them with a free appropriate public education (FAPE) and that modifications to the district's regular course of study may be needed on an individualized basis to provide FAPE. In accordance with law, each student's individualized education program (IEP) team shall determine the appropriate goals, as well as any appropriate individual accommodations necessary for measuring the academic achievement and functional performance of the student on state and districtwide assessments.

Exemption from District-Established Graduation Requirements

District students shall complete all course requirements for high school graduation as required by law in accordance with Board Policy 6146.1 - High School Graduation Requirements. However, a student with disabilities who entered ninth grade in the 2022-23 school year or later shall be eligible to be exempted from all coursework and other requirements adopted by the Board that are in addition to the statewide course requirements for high school graduation if the student's IEP provides for both of the following : (Education Code 51225.31).

1. That the student is eligible to take the alternate assessment as described in Education Code 60640
2. That the student complete state standards aligned coursework to meet the statewide coursework specified in Education Code 51225.3

Additionally, a student with disabilities who entered grade 10 in the 2022-23 school year or later may be eligible for the same exemption, at the district's discretion, if the student's IEP provides for both of the requirements specified in item #1 and 2 above (Education Code 51225.31)

Any such exempted student shall receive a diploma and be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and school activity related to graduation in which a student of similar age without a disability would be eligible to participate. (Education Code 51225.31)

The district's responsibility to provide FAPE shall not terminate when a student with a disability who is exempted from district-adopted graduation requirements participates in graduation activities unless the student's IEP team, which includes the parent/guardian and student, has determined that the student has completed the high school experience. (Education Code 51225.31)

Certificate of Educational Achievement or Completion

Instead of a high school diploma, a student with a disability may be awarded a certificate or document of educational achievement or completion if the student has met one of the following requirements: (Education Code 56390)

1. Satisfactorily completed a prescribed alternative course of study approved by the Board of the district in which the student attended school or the district with jurisdiction over the student as identified in the student's IEP
2. Satisfactorily met the student's IEP goals and objectives during high school as determined by the IEP team
3. Satisfactorily attended high school, participated in the instruction as prescribed in the student's IEP, and met the objectives of the statement of transition services

A student with a disability who meets any of the criteria specified above shall be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and any school activity related to graduation in which a graduating student of similar age without disabilities would be eligible to participate. (Education Code 56391)
