1. CALL TO ORDER

Board of Directors Chair Drew Gottfried called the May 4, 2026 board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Directors present were Vice Chair Rusty Rexius, Stephen Hammond and Jennifer Woodland. Others present were Superintendent Jim Crist, Business Manager Sheri Longobardo, Special Education Director Whitney Connolly, Elementary School Principal Brenna Fairchild, Middle/High School Principal Chris Reiersgaard, Middle School Assistant Principal Caleb Salmond and Board Secretary Kimberly Silbernagel.

Director Gottfried read the mission statement.

2. CHANGES OR ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were no changes or additions.

3. PRESENTATIONS

3.1 Budget Orientation

Business Manager Sheri Longobardo conducted a Budget Committee orientation which reviewed the major points of the budget process, responsibilities of the budget committee, the sources, uses, and restrictions of each school fund, and the District’s latest financial projections. This presentation included clarifications of terminology/nomenclature as well as funding sources.

The first Budget Committee meeting, where the Proposed Budget will be presented, is scheduled for May 18, 2026. The board will also hear public comments at this meeting.

The budget document will be made public and available for viewing by May 15, 2026.

This resolution would approve the inclusion of District-funded construction scope not eligible for the Seismic Rehabilitation Grant Program (SRGP) into the existing CM/GC procurement and construction process for the Pleasant Hill High School Gymnasium project, in an amount not to exceed \$400,000, and to authorize the Superintendent to execute necessary amendments and change orders.

Financial Report as of April 30, 2026**

Revenues:

- We have received \$3,760,790 of the budgeted \$3,856,873 in property taxes for 2025-26 and \$41,384 in other tax-related income.
- We have received \$8,318,170 of our anticipated \$9,247,469 in State School Fund (SSF) payments.
- We have received \$477,505 in interest from investments.
- We have received \$92,021 in curricular activity such as athletic fees and gate fees.
- We have received \$79,487 as our first of two payments from the Common School Fund.
- We have received \$156,807 in other revenue for a total of \$12,926,165.

Expenditures:

- Salary expenditures through January are \$4,824,395.
- Benefits total \$2,680,596.
- We have spent \$1,300,833 in purchased services.
- Supplies, capital outlay and other expenditures are \$589,624.
- We have transferred \$2,330,000 into reserve accounts for Insurance, Equipment, Maintenance and Building Projects, Instruction Materials and Technology needs.

Leah Williams – Physical Education/Health

We recommend the hiring of Leah Williams for the secondary Physical Education/Health position based on her strong instructional practice, commitment to student engagement, and demonstrated success working with middle school students. Ms. Williams is completing her Bachelor of Science in Education at Bushnell University with endorsements in Physical Education and Health and has been serving Pleasant Hill School District during the 2025–26 school year in a temporary teaching capacity.

In her current role teaching middle school Physical Education and Health, she has established a structured, supportive learning environment while building strong relationships with students, staff, and families. She has demonstrated effective classroom management, adaptability in meeting diverse student needs, and a commitment to fostering lifelong health and fitness habits. Her ability to step into the role this year and provide consistency for students while continuing to grow professionally makes her a strong candidate for permanent employment.

Taylor Reineke – Secondary Math

We recommend the hiring of Taylor Reineke for the Secondary Math position based on his extensive instructional experience, strong content knowledge, and proven ability to support student growth across a wide range of mathematics courses. Mr. Reineke holds a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics and a Master of Education and brings over a decade of experience teaching secondary mathematics, including advanced coursework such as AP Calculus.

Equally important, Mr. Reineke joined Pleasant Hill School District during the 2025–26 school year to fill a mid-year resignation. In that role, he quickly established strong

relationships with students and staff, maintained instructional continuity, and demonstrated a high level of professionalism and adaptability. His experience using data to inform instruction, participating in PLCs, and supporting MTSS systems aligns well with district priorities. His successful transition into our system mid-year and his depth of experience make him a strong candidate for permanent employment.

Doug Piquette – Physical Education

We recommend the hiring of Doug Piquette for the Physical Education position based on his extensive teaching experience, deep content knowledge, and long-standing success working with secondary students. Mr. Piquette holds a professional teaching license with a Physical Education endorsement and has nearly three decades of experience teaching Physical Education at both the middle and high school levels, most recently at Thurston High School.

Throughout his career, he has demonstrated a consistent ability to build positive relationships with students, maintain high expectations, and create engaging, skill-based physical education programs. His experience across grade levels, combined with his knowledge of curriculum development and student engagement, brings significant strength and stability to our program. We are excited to welcome Mr. Piquette to Pleasant Hill, as he brings a wealth of knowledge and experience that will enhance our Physical Education offerings.

Hadley Polinsky – School Psychologist

We recommend the hiring of Hadley Polinsky for the School Psychologist position based on her strong preparation, relevant internship experience, and commitment to supporting students' academic, behavioral, and social-emotional development. Ms. Polinsky is completing her Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) degree in School Psychology at the University of Oregon and is currently serving as a School Psychology Intern with Springfield Public Schools.

In her internship, she has conducted comprehensive psychoeducational evaluations, supported IEP development, collaborated with multidisciplinary teams, and worked closely with students, staff, and families to implement evidence-based interventions. Her training and experience align well with the needs of our district, particularly in strengthening student support systems. We are pleased to recommend her as a fully licensed school psychologist for the upcoming school year, bringing valuable expertise to our student services team.
