Building & Grounds Report
May 18, 2026

- Fire marshal Paul Meyers, who replaced Kevin McGintey, was here for an annual fire inspection. Few more items to correct over the summer when Northland fire performs their annual inspection for the year.
 - Took delivery of new grounds equipment earlier this spring, 1st being the John Deere skid steer, which got some use with a few snow events. Seemed to work well. 2nd being the addition of 2 John Deere mowers which are only recently getting into full use, but are working good as well.
 - No major HVAC fixes have been needed, only minor repairs over the winter, equipment still operating well.
 - Irrigation has been put together, and started. Found several issues with pipes and wires needing some repair, typical for our Minnesota climate which is hard on that kind of thing. Peterson Companies found the faults and were able to fix and get us back up and running. I'll have a few sprinkler heads to replace, so that's not so bad.
 - Gearing up for some summer projects, which will include new flooring in classrooms, so that becomes a production to get ready and put back together, but nice when completed. Hopefully approval for paved softball path, and the usual cleaning and waxing that typically happens over the summer months, 2 gym floors to get a new finish for next year (HS east, and west)
 - All in all some days are busier than others, as a team we're able to push through the harder days, and do the best we can. Very special thank you to the team and others that have helped to make our buildings look presentable to the public.

15. **Consider Student Assurance Services, Inc.**

The school district has participated in this program for a number of years. It provides district parents an opportunity to purchase insurance through Student Assurance Services, Inc. of Stillwater, MN to provide coverage for their children for accidents and other purposes.
