Braham Area Schools #314
Superintendent Report
June 16, 2025

1. Braham Area Education Foundation meeting update - May 21, 2025:
 - a. Total funds raised by the 5/3/25 Gala expected to be approximately \$50,000.00
 - b. Four grants totaling \$5,635 awarded to ISD #314 for the May 5 round of grant applications.

2. Schools Advocating for Fair Funding (SAFF) meeting update - May 22, 2025:
 - a. Sen. Mark Koran gave an update of the current requirements for new construction and storm shelters (they are working on modifications) and also the legislative process.
 - b. MDE Officials Adosh Unni and Cathy Erickson provided a legislative update. A special session is going to be scheduled and final results will be shared at that time.
 - c. 2025-2026 fees were shared. Fees will increase 4% (\$90.00 increase for Braham).

3. RRSEC Executive Council meeting update - May 22, 2025:
 - a. Discussions were held on the new MTSS grant and how it will impact members, along with a discussion on the potential to bring in an associate member to the cooperative. More information will come as that progresses.
 - b. Approved '25-'26 school calendar & a three year contract with Director Tanya Tacker (7/1/25 - 6/30/28).

4. Tusen Tack Board meeting update - May 27, 2025:
 - a. Food Shelf: People served in 2024 almost doubled from 2021 [2937 from 1541] and the '25 number is also trending up.
 - b. Total revenue from all Tusen Tack programs is down nearly 20% for 2025.
 - c. Tusen Tack is scrutinizing their financial reports to more accurately reflect the work being done. One example: *\$140,000 of donations were given away in 2024 & \$540,000 worth of services were provided. In the past these combined funds were simply labeled as donations.*

5. Grandy Lions meeting update - June 2, 2025:
 - a. Donations totalling \$50,000 were made, including \$36,000 to the Grandy Community Center & Ballfield, \$10,000 to Family Pathways for a new homeless shelter & four other smaller gifts.
 - b. The Grandy Lions celebrated their 40th birthday on May 20. The club currently has 36 members.
 - c. Joe Beise will take over as President on July 1, 2025.
 - d. The next meeting will be Monday, July 7, at 6:00 p.m.

 6. RRSEC Executive Council meeting update - June 4, 2025:
 - a. RRN Building Update: Soil borings happening on proposed property. If passing, an offer will be made.
 - b. Long time Principal Howard Armstrong has resigned. The position is currently open.

 7. Braham Chamber of Commerce meeting update - June 10, 2025:
 - a. The Initiative Foundation presented lending & grant opportunities for small businesses in the Braham community.
 - b. Appreciation Day was a success with an estimated 600 meals served, a fantastic parade, and multiple activities available.
 - c. Next meeting: Back-to-Business Social on Tues. August 19, 5:00 p.m. @ Braham Brewing Company.

 8. Tusen Tack Housing Study meeting update - June 11, 2025:
 - a. The housing study is complete. There is an estimated demand of 421 new housing units by 2030 with a recommendation to develop 103 units, to include multifamily, single family, and rental properties. A complete copy of the report is available from Tusen Tack.

 - a. Local 284 (SEIU): Three meetings held. Update shared at board meeting.
 - b. BEA: First meeting scheduled for June 23.
 - c. RRSEC: (SEIU): Four meetings held. Tentative agreement has been reached.
 - d. ECMECC: First meeting scheduled for June 13 @ 1:00 p.m.

 10. Other:
 - a. The Employee Recognition Breakfast was held on May 29 with over 60 employees in attendance. Several people were recognized for various accomplishments and employment milestones. Pictures and pertinent information was submitted to the local press.
