 - i. Requirement for 45 hours of training for almost all K-3 teachers and several(?) 4-12 teachers (we are required to cover the salary cost for teachers to train - cost of training is free).
 - ii. The district will purchase a new curriculum for the start of the 2025-2026 school year. A portion of our new curriculum cost will be covered by the state.
