

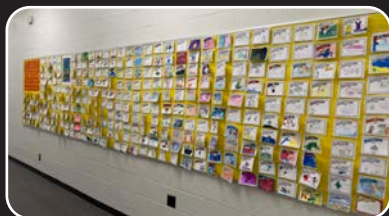

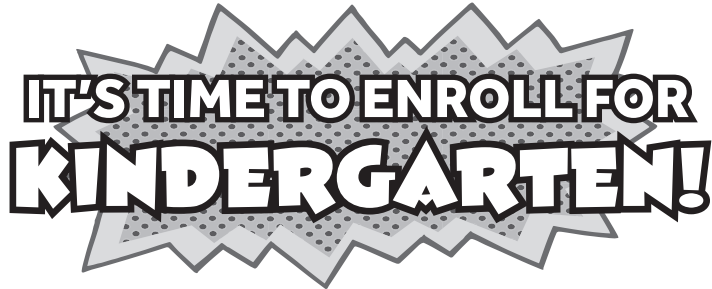

Northview's enrollment process is online to make it as smooth as possible for the families of our newest Wildcats. Visit our website at nvps.net/district/enrollment/k-12-enrollment to enroll your child today. If you are the parent of a current Northview student and wish to enroll another child, sign into your ParentVUE account to enroll them. Once you've completed the enrollment form, you can drop off the required documents at the Administration Building (4365 Hunsberger Ave. NE) at any time. If you have questions, email Central Enrollment at enroll@nvps.net.

A developmental kindergarten program is available for students who meet the kindergarten age requirement but are not yet ready for the comprehensive kindergarten program, or students whose birthday is between September 2 and December 1 and do not meet the kindergarten age requirement. A limited number of spots are available. Placement is determined by our kindergarten teachers.

GREAT START READINESS PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

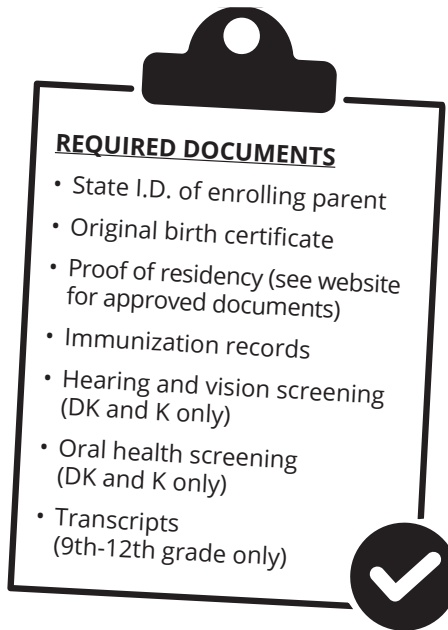
Applications are being accepted for Kent ISD's Great Start Readiness Program. For more information on program eligibility or to apply, visit freepreschoolkent.org. Preschool is in session Monday through Thursday. Please note that no transportation is provided.



SCHOOLS OF CHOICE PROGRAM

Families who are interested in having their child attend Northview as a non-resident student are encouraged to visit nvps.net/district/enrollment/schools-of-choice to learn more about the Kent ISD Schools of Choice program. The application period is open through May 15.

If you're a current Schools of Choice family and would like to enroll a new sibling for the 2026-27 school year, use your ParentVUE account to enroll them, then submit a Schools of Choice application for Northview during the application period.



TWO POSITIONS OPEN FOR NORTHVIEW BOARD OF EDUCATION

Northview Public Schools has two positions up for election in November. These seats will be filled at the annual school election on Tuesday, November 3, 2026. The seats will serve a six-year term, ending December 31, 2032.

Residents interested in running for office must file an affidavit of identity and a nominating petition (or pay a \$100 filing fee) by 4:00 pm on July 21, 2026. An individual is eligible for election as a school board member if the individual is a citizen of the United States and is a qualified and registered elector of Northview Public Schools by the filing deadline. Petition and affidavit forms will be available at the Plainfield Charter Township Office (6161 Belmont Avenue, Belmont, MI, 49306). These forms must be filed at the Kent County Clerk's Office. If you have any questions, please call 616-364-8466.

Any Northview resident interested in running will also need to submit a biography (300 words or less) and a photo to northviewnews@nvps.net no later than **July 6, 2026**. Please notify Karlie Rittenhouse at krittenhouse@nvps.net if you plan to file for board candidacy, but are unable to submit your biography by July 6, to ensure space can be held for your bio in the back-to-school issue of the *Northview News*.

Candidate biographies will be featured in the back-to-school issue of the *Northview News* scheduled to be delivered in homes on or near August 8.

WHERE DO I FIND THE BOARD MINUTES?

SEVERE WEATHER AND OTHER EMERGENCIES

School closing and delay decisions are made by administrative staff with the safety of your student(s) in mind. In a situation when school remains open, parents may choose not to send their student(s) to school. Adverse weather conditions and other emergencies may make it necessary to cancel school, delay the start of school or send students home early or late. Whenever this happens, notice will be communicated through: 1) our district notification system and 2) the district's social media. Whenever possible, event cancellations/reschedules will be posted on the website throughout the day as they occur. Please arrange an alternative shelter home where your student(s) can go if you will not be home. Emphasize that students should stay off the streets once they reach home. Review your family's plan with your student(s) regularly.

TWO-HOUR DELAY PROCEDURES

In the case of a two-hour delay, your child's bus pick-up time and school start time will be exactly two hours after the originally scheduled bus pick-up/school start time.

Tornado watch/warning procedures: If a tornado "watch" is announced prior to, or during, regular school hours, students will normally be dismissed at the regular dismissal time. If an official tornado "warning" is announced, or if a tornado appears, students will be retained in school in predetermined shelter areas until the warning is lifted.

After school and community activities: If a tornado "watch" or "warning" is announced during school hours, all after-school and evening activities will be CANCELED unless an ALL CLEAR is announced prior to 4:00 pm.

SUN BUCKS: MICHIGAN SUMMER ELECTRONIC BENEFITS TRANSFER (EBT)

Summer will be here before we know it! We're excited to share that the SUN Bucks Michigan Summer EBT program will be available again this year to help eligible families purchase food during the summer months when school meals are not available. If you have not completed the Education and Nutrition Benefits application, it's not too late, and it may result in important resources for your student, such as Summer EBT. Check the income guidelines before filling out the application on our family portal at northview.familyportal.cloud.



TRANSPORTATION NEWS

- **Early Bird Registration:** Bus registration is opening soon for the 2026-2027 school year. A link to the online form will be posted to the district's social media when the registration period opens, so that you can sign up before August 1 to receive a bus assignment for the first day of school.
- **Evacuation Drills:** Now that it is getting warmer, each bus route will be conducting their required bi-annual safety evacuation drills. Each driver will take a few moments after school dismissal to ensure your students know our procedures in case of an emergency.
- **Lost and Found:** The bus lost and found is overflowing. Stop by our office to search for your child's forgotten items. We've collected gloves, hats, coats, boots, sneakers, water bottles, cell phones, car keys and glasses.

NORTHVIEW ALUMNA GRADUATES WITH TOP HONORS FROM MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY

Northview High School’s 2023 valedictorian, Viola Weber, continues to make the district incredibly proud as she prepares to graduate from Michigan State University (MSU) in May 2026. As an MSU Honors College student earning a bachelor’s degree in neuroscience, Viola was awarded the university’s highest academic honor—the Michigan State University Board of Trustees 4.0 Recognition Recipient!

This recognition is presented each semester to graduating seniors who have maintained the highest cumulative grade-points at the close of the semester prior to graduation. To qualify, students must have earned a total of at least 60 credits in residence at MSU with numerical grades. Achieving this level of academic excellence is rare. Only about 4 percent of all MSU graduates reach this milestone, and an even more exclusive .5 percent of science majors, attain this achievement. Congratulations, Viola! The district is proud of you!

A MOVING BODY = A LEARNING BRAIN!

Developmental kindergarten teachers know that our young students learn best when their whole body is involved, and with the help of the Northview Education Foundation (NEF), DK students at North Oakview are learning more through music and movement! A generous grant from the NEF was awarded to the North Oakview DK teachers to purchase rhythm sticks, shaker eggs, scarves, ribbon rings, music and a new CD player to add more screen-free music and movement to their days. As the students sing songs and move their bodies with the new supplies, they've practiced following directions, having self-control, improving hand-eye coordination, building muscle memory, crossing the mid-line, moving to rhythm and more! The new supplies are also creating opportunities to build a positive classroom community as they move, sing and giggle together. Thanks, NEF, for adding more meaningful play to their days!



CHILLIN' OUT IN ALASKA & CONNECTING CLASSMATES

North Oakview 2nd graders in Mrs. Putnam's classroom are celebrating a grant from the Northview Education Foundation (NEF)! They are so excited to be using some new items in their classroom cool-down corner, "Alaska," which supports students who may need a few minutes break for a variety of reasons. The students now have large visual sand timers to manage their time in this break spot and a mini magnetic drawing board to sketch pictures describing how they are feeling. They're also enjoying some exciting new items for their "Table Top" (i.e., social time of the day) where students connect first thing in the morning by welcoming each other to school, building, problem solving and playing math games. Mrs. Putnam added a new gear set to this portion of the day as well as new Play-Doh tools to help students get their creative juices flowing first thing in the morning! Lastly, the NEF provided comfortable seating for their classroom library with new rocking chairs that the students LOVE! FIELD SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE "SEW" INTO MICHIGAN HISTORY

Over the winter, Field School students in Mrs. McCormack's 3rd and 4th grade class were immersed in stories and lessons about the Underground Railroad and the treacherous journey north to freedom. Students read books about heroic people risking their lives to save others, and families working together to share information. They learned how nature was used in protecting and hiding runaways—for example, using bird calls—and about the role wetlands played. They learned about how Michigan and its waterways played a vital role in the final step to freedom in Canada!



Michigan's close proximity to Canada and our linking waterways provided those journeying north with a safer way to escape to freedom. Finally, students learned about the lore that quilts were used as a method for communication along the Underground Railroad. Legend has it that different quilt blocks symbolized different things, and even maps were disguised within a quilt pattern!

The students learned about the symbols, then dove into the world of quilting, with the end goal being to create a class quilt. Students worked with volunteers—grandmothers and mothers from our class—to plan, measure, cut, press and quilt their quilt block. Along the way, they learned about sewing machines, how to thread a bobbin, how to press, how to measure twice and cut once and how to problem solve when things do not go to plan. Once all of their blocks were complete, the class discussed the area and arrangements of an array for their class quilt. They debated and coordinated based on aesthetics and design, but finally, the quilt was complete. The students worked incredibly hard creating informational posters to go along with their quilt, so that it could be a teaching tool in an exhibit. We are so incredibly proud of their work and learning along the way!

EAST OAKVIEW STUDENTS REACH NEW HEIGHTS WITH "9 SQUARE IN THE AIR"

Physical education classes at East Oakview reached a new level of excitement this spring as students played the school's brand-new *9 Square in the Air* game.

The high-energy game, which combines elements of volleyball and the classic playground game of four-square, has quickly become a student favorite. The game encourages quick reflexes, strategy and sportsmanship, all while keeping a large group of students engaged at once.

The addition of this equipment was made possible through a collaborative effort last fall between the Northview Education Foundation (NEF) and the East Oakview PTC. By combining their resources, these two organizations were able to provide a unique, inclusive and active tool for the school's PE Department. The school extends a sincere thank you to both the PTC and the NEF for their dedication to enhancing the student experience and supporting physical literacy. 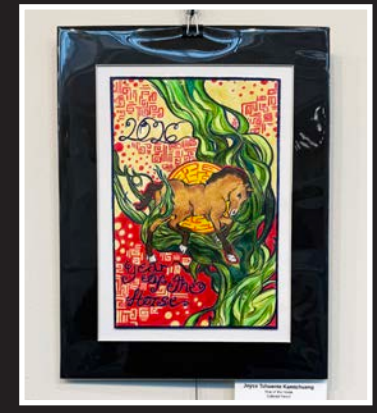

2026 SUMMER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

FEES: We now use a fully online registration system. Fees are set by our community partners and help to cover expenses for each specific program. There is a small processing fee that adds to the cost of each class, which is taken into consideration when pricing the programs.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES: Many of our programs fill fast, so we recommend early registration and at least five days prior to the first class so that our instructors can plan accordingly. Most programs will email additional details a few days prior to their start date. If you do not receive an email, please show up for the first scheduled date.

WAITLISTS: If the class is full, you will be placed on an online waitlist. You will be

contacted via email should a spot open up in the program. If you are on a waitlist and no longer want to be considered, please email NVComEd@nvps.net to be removed.

LATE REGISTRATIONS: Any registrations received after the five-day deadline will be considered if there is still room in the program. When we receive your late registration, we will determine if you can be added and you will receive an email if there is room in the program. If you register the night before or day-of and no email is received, contact us for your enrollment status or show up to the first class to see if there is room for you.

REFUNDS: Full refunds will be given if a request is received five business days

prior to the first date of the program. After this deadline, no refund requests can be honored. If a program is canceled due to low enrollment, a full refund will be issued.

SEVERE WEATHER POLICY: Indoor programs will be held in all weather conditions. Outdoor programs have a backup plan. If severe weather warnings are issued immediately before or during our camps, students will take shelter in the district-approved area in the building where the class is held. Any class canceled due to weather or other emergencies may or may not be rescheduled due to complications with facility and instructor schedules. We always do our best to reschedule the canceled date if we're able to.
