Re: Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) Request for Consultation for San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD) Collection

[TITLE & LAST NAME]:

SJUSD (designated as the 'Museum') has approximately 210 human-created objects within its collection that may contain sacred objects or objects of cultural patrimony. These objects include, but are not limited to, blankets, rattles, masks, groundstone, pottery, medicine bags, basketry and tools. These objects are from areas and states now known as California, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Alaska, South Dakota, Florida, New York, Louisiana, Washington and Minnesota. The Museum has less than 20 items from the natural world, including rock samples, fossils and shells.

Most of the items within the Museum's collection were purchased and donated between the 1980s to the 2010s. A large number of the items within the collection are modern made re-creations made by indigenous artisans and most likely date to within the last 40 years. The collection has not been evaluated for hazardous materials, but it is assumed items may contain chemicals used in preservation as well as dust and mold.

In accordance with NAGPRA, we are committed to consulting with you on the identification, care and repatriation of items that may potentially be affiliated with your tribe.
