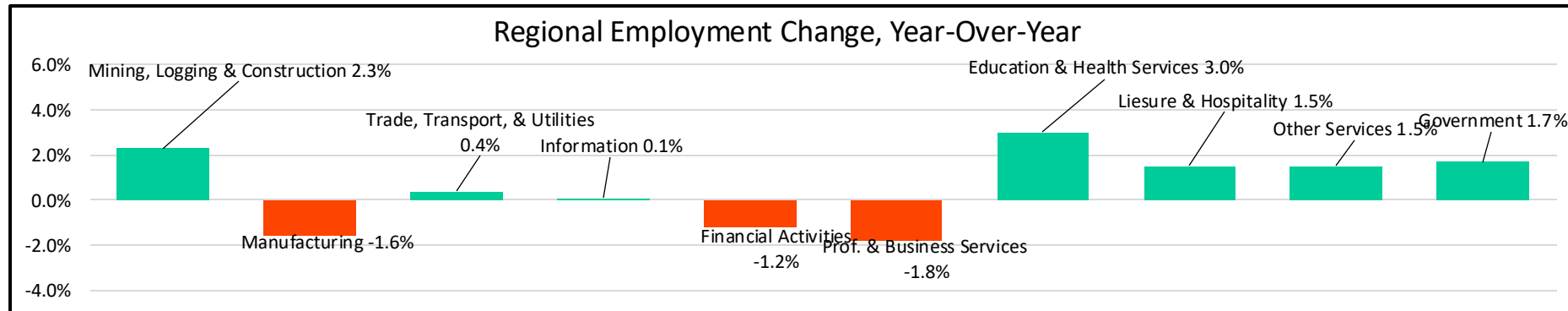
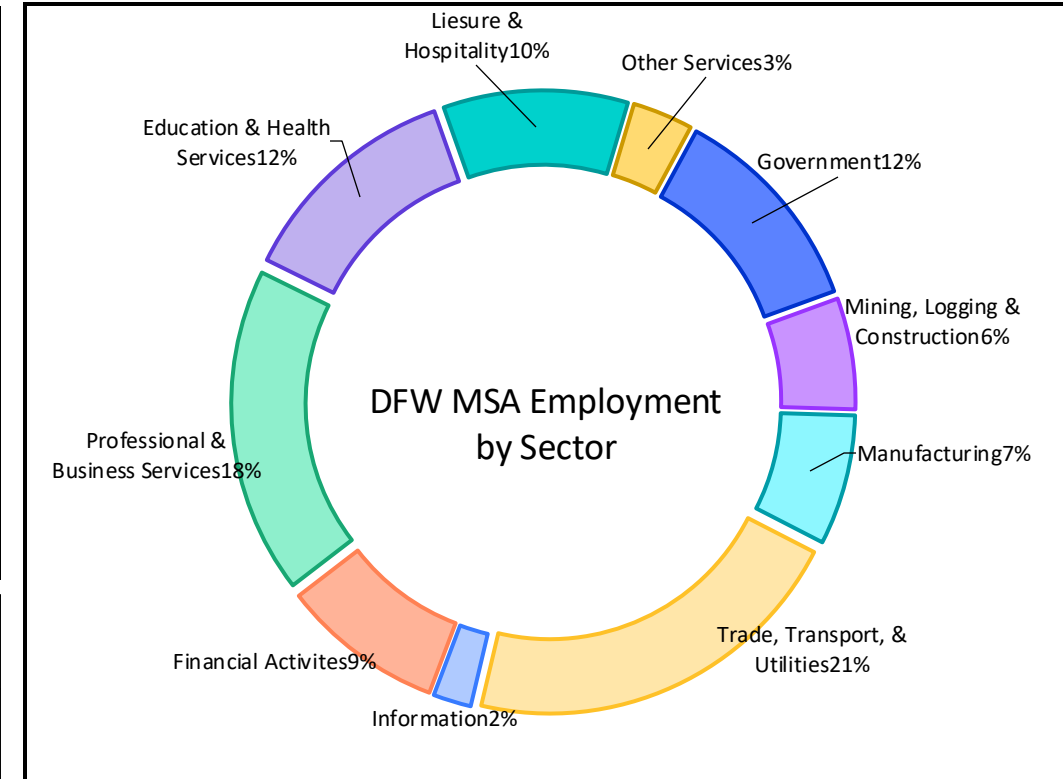
May 2026

What changed and why is Student Mobility a trend that may remain?

- **Pandemic Event** – The Covid-19 pandemic significantly disrupted student’s education by forcing schools to close and shifting learning to remote or hybrid formats. That disruption not only took place in the world of education, but also initiated work from home which created opportunities for parents to begin evaluating their children staying home and learning while they were home.

- **Technology** – Greater use of technology devices and the development of more online instructional programming has created a new market for online curriculum and instruction. The growth of social networks, the programming of algorithms used by those social networks related to concentrated content & messaging, and the flexibility of being able to learn anytime & anywhere is a dramatic departure from the traditional instructional schedules and models.

- **Geopolitical** – The business of political campaigning has grown even more over the last several years. Political races have ongoing advertisements referencing political platforms at a higher frequency than what we have had in the past. The messaging of school choice, school safety, and concerns about the quality of education being provided are referenced in many of the political ads regardless of political affiliation.



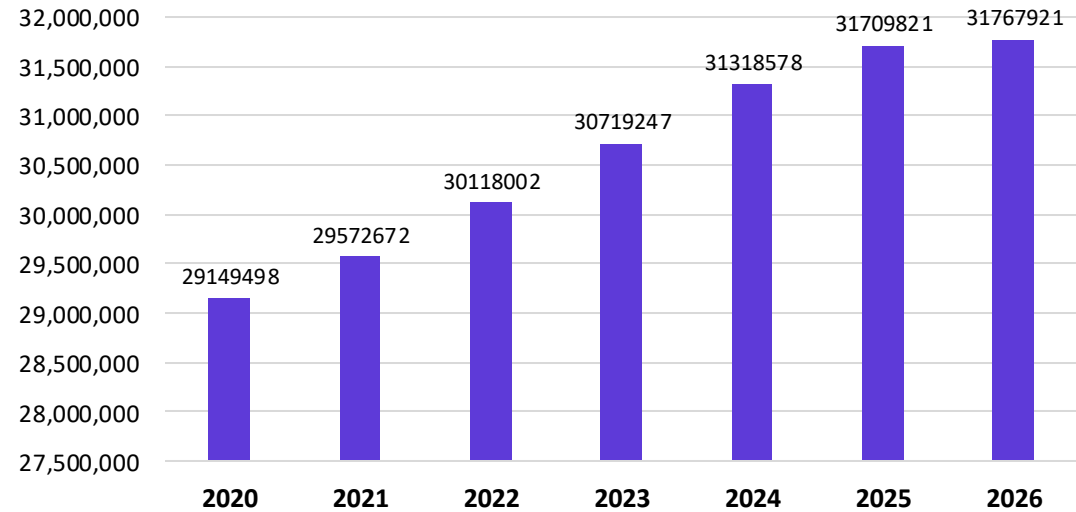
Texas Led U.S. in population growth in 2025, but immigration slowed

Texas’ population growth slowed significantly last year amid a nationwide slowdown in the number of newcomers moving to the United States but still topped the rest of the country for adding new residents, new U.S. Census Bureau data show.

Texas added 391,243 residents in 2025, bringing the state’s population to 31.7 million. but the Lone Star State grew by 1.2%, its slowest clip since 2021, after years of red-hot growth following the COVID-19 pandemic.

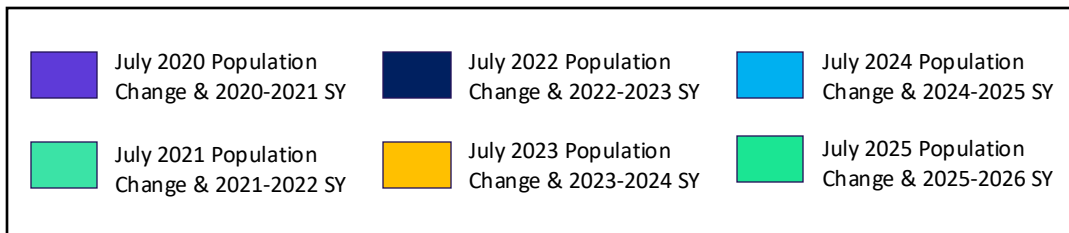
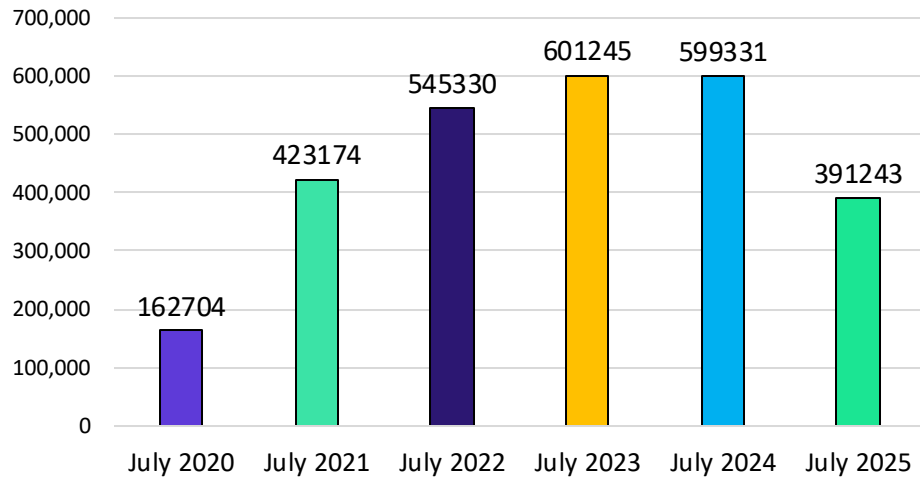

State of Texas Population Growth



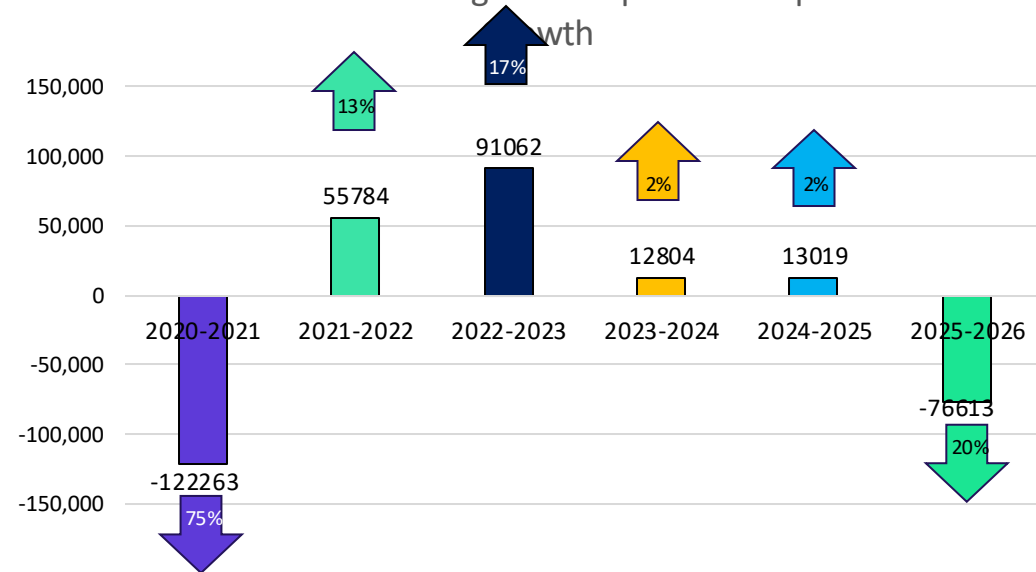

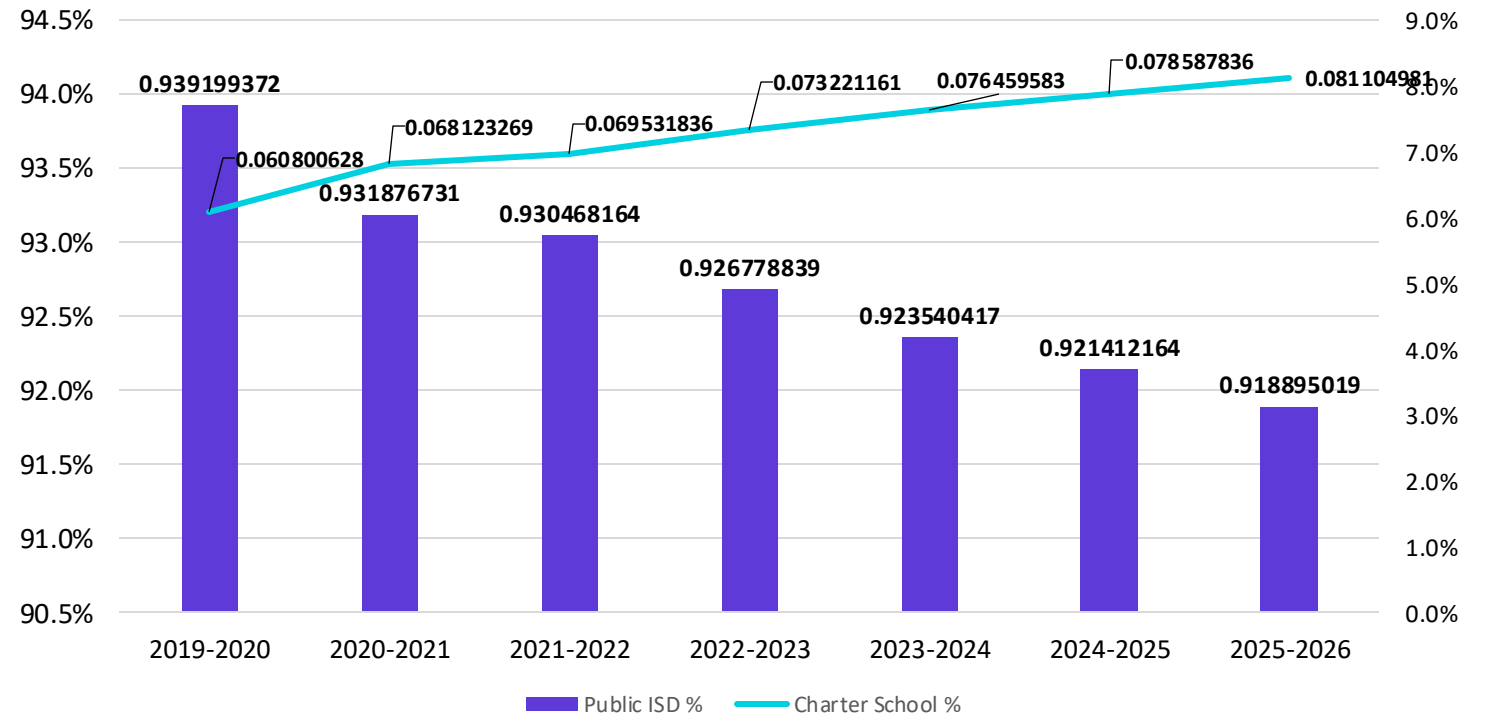
TEA Enrollment Change % Compared to Population

Enrollment Data (2019-20 to 2025-2026)



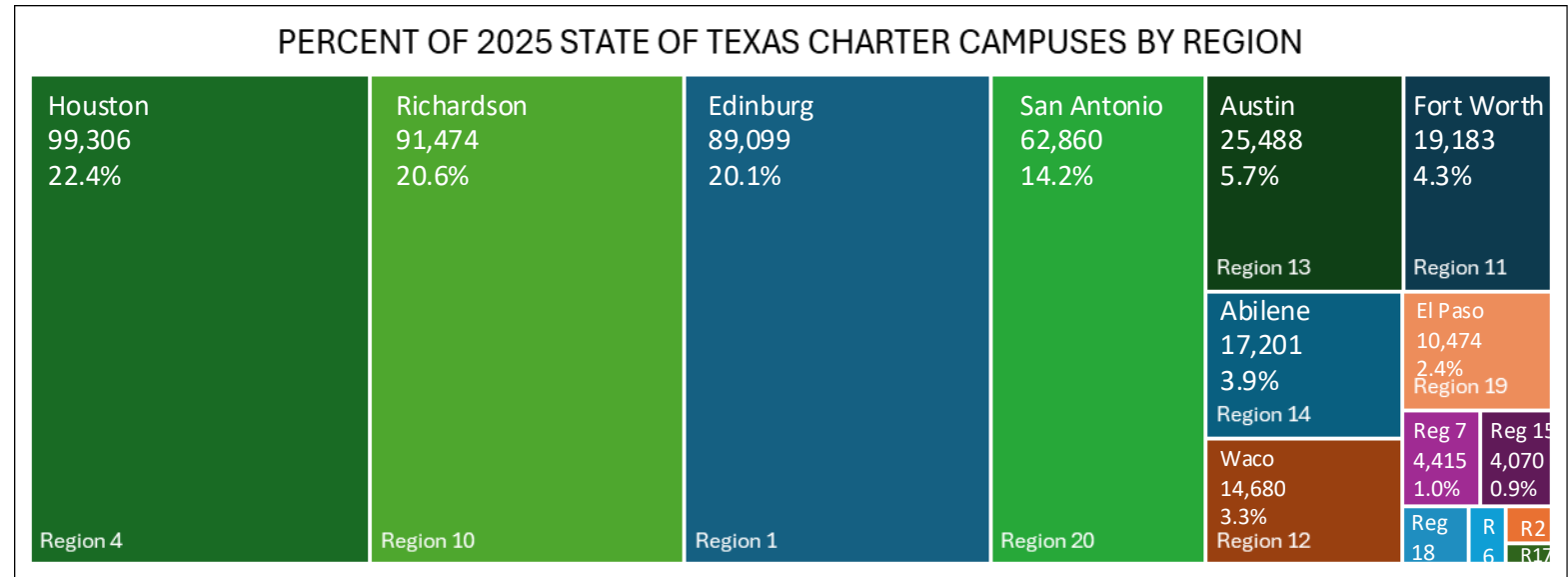
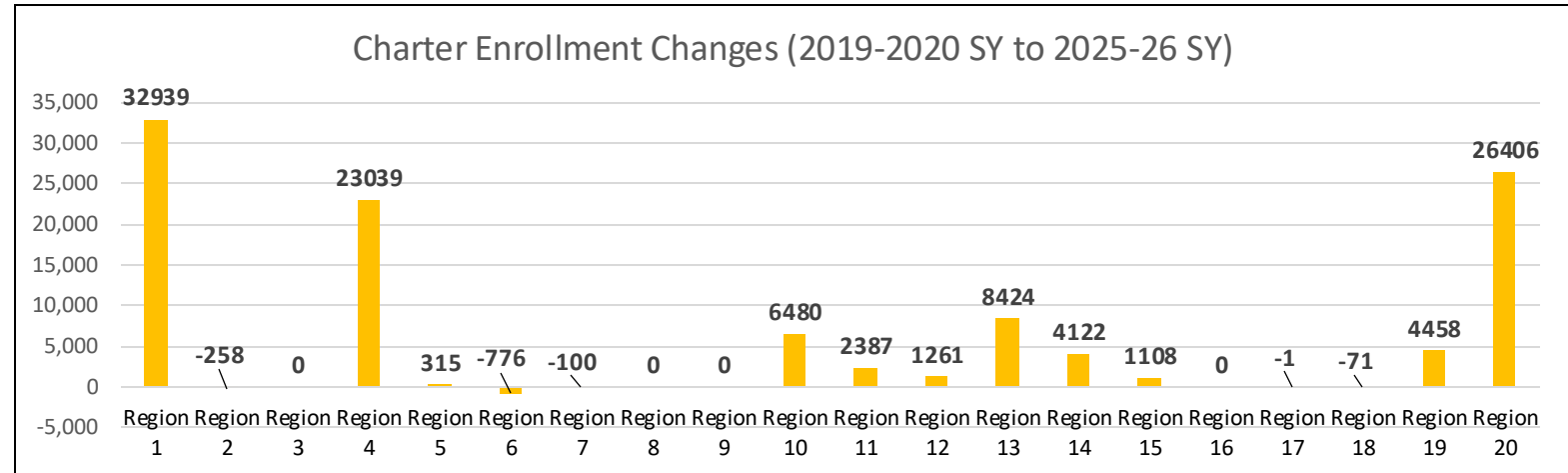

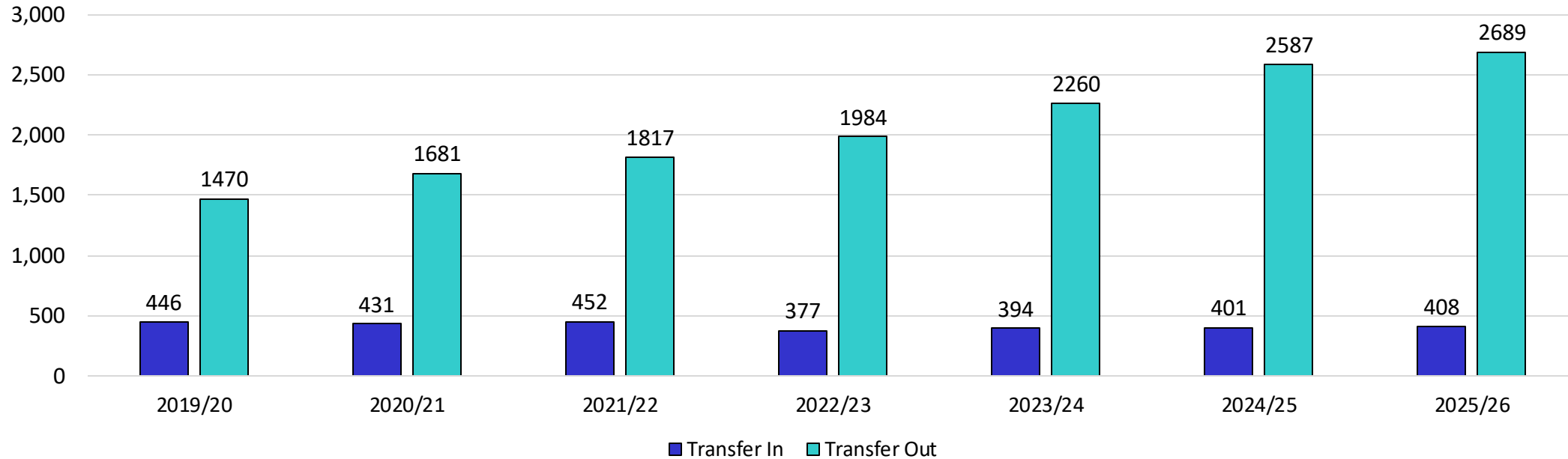


State of Texas – Virtual/Online School Enrollment



Enrollment has increased by over 56,000 students since the 2019-20 school year. An increase of over 345%.

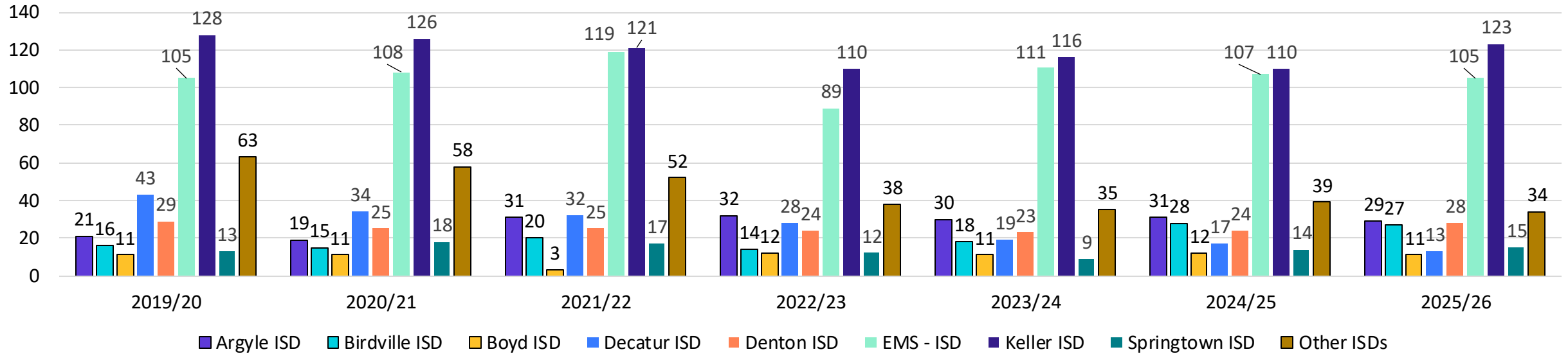
Northwest ISD Student Transfer #s (2019-2020 through 2025-2026)

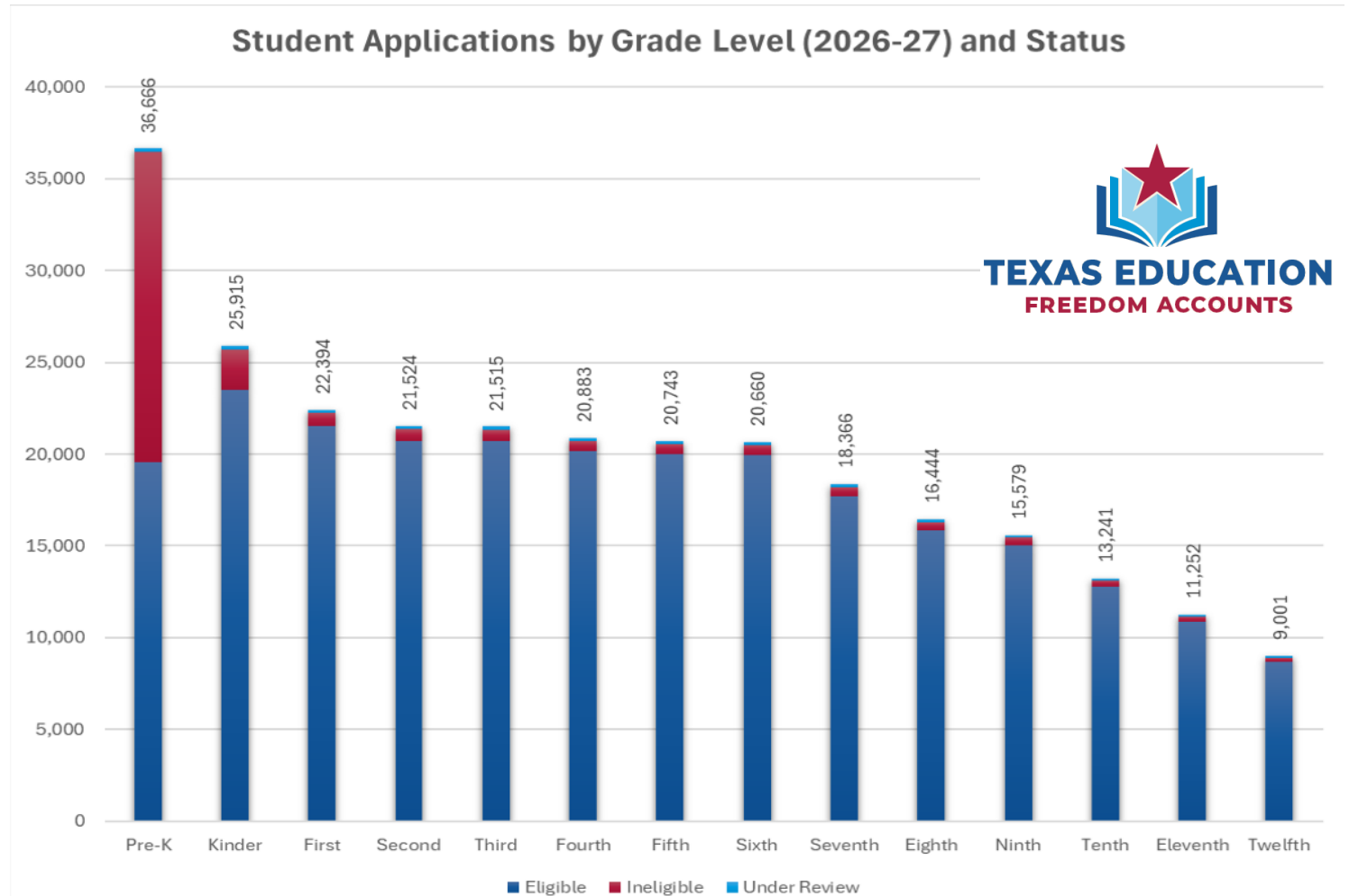
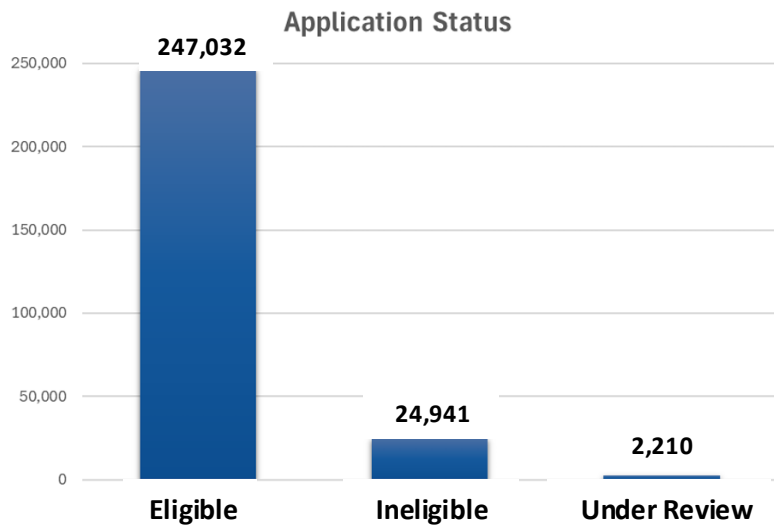
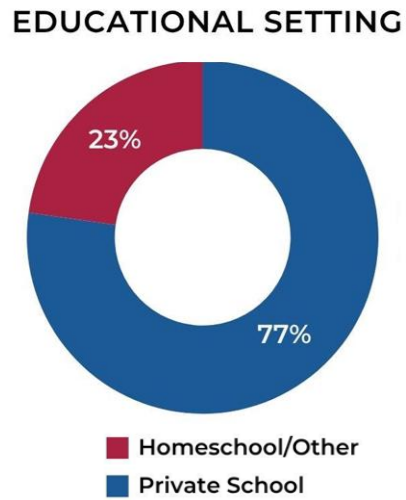
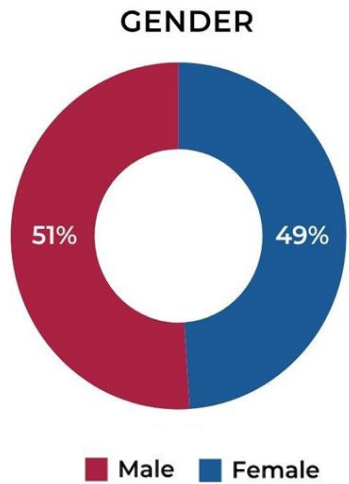
- Approximately 58% of students that did not re-enroll this school year in Northwest ISD were due to the students moving outside the District’s boundaries.
- Of the Students that left the school district this school year 73% stayed in Traditional ISD schools.
- Evaluating School Choice conditions; 20% of students that left the District selected attending a Charter School versus a much smaller % that enrolled in Private School or Homeschool.

The graph below identifies students that were enrolled in Northwest ISD last year and are no longer enrolled in the District this current 2025-26 school year. It is intended to provide insight as to if the students still reside within the District and decided on another school system this year or if they potentially moved outside the District and are attending and what type of instructional programming they selected for this current school year.

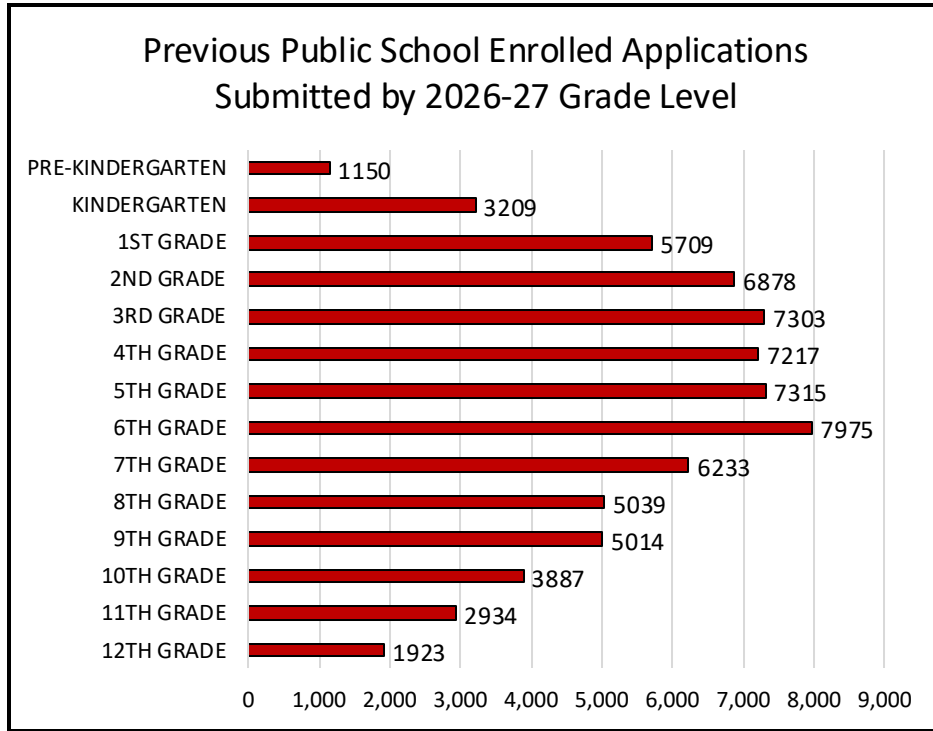

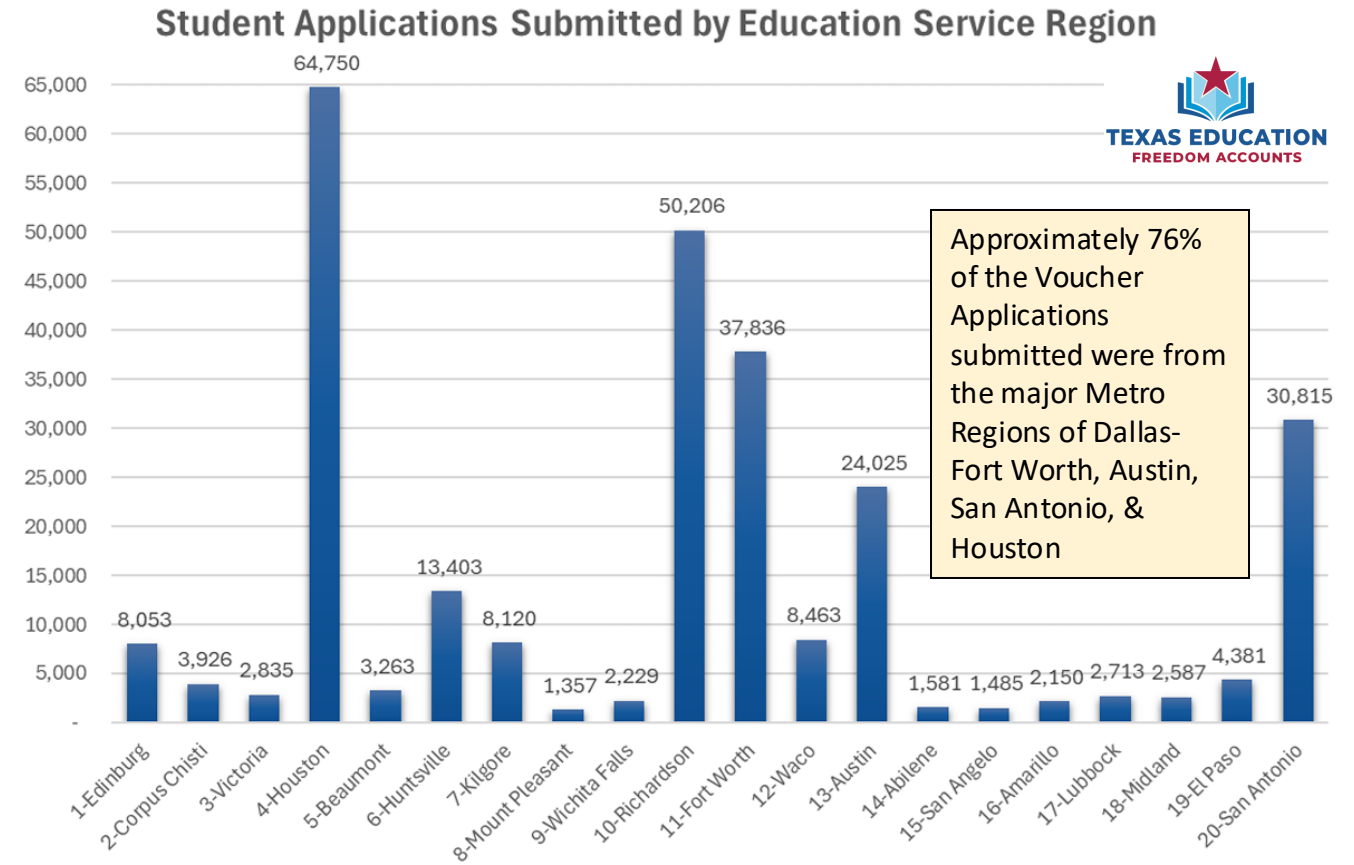


State of Texas – Education Freedom Accounts

Applications By Region Analysis & Students by Grade Enrolled in Public Schools in 2024-25 School Year



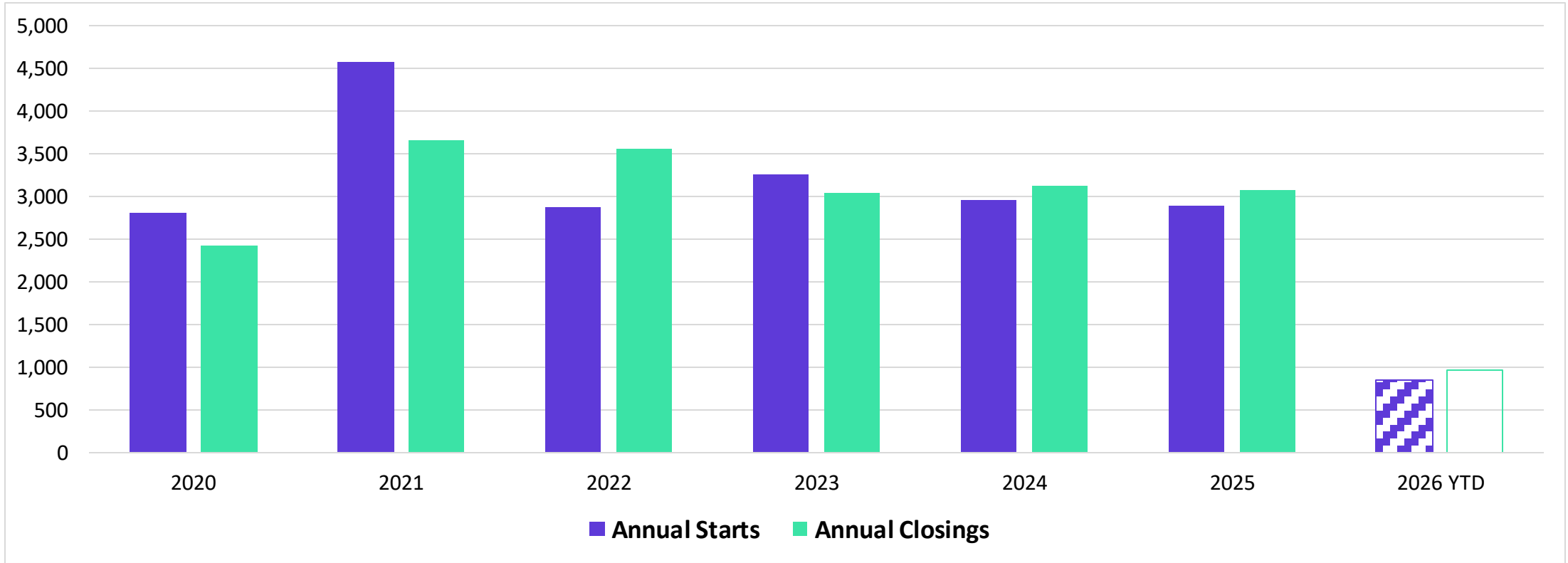

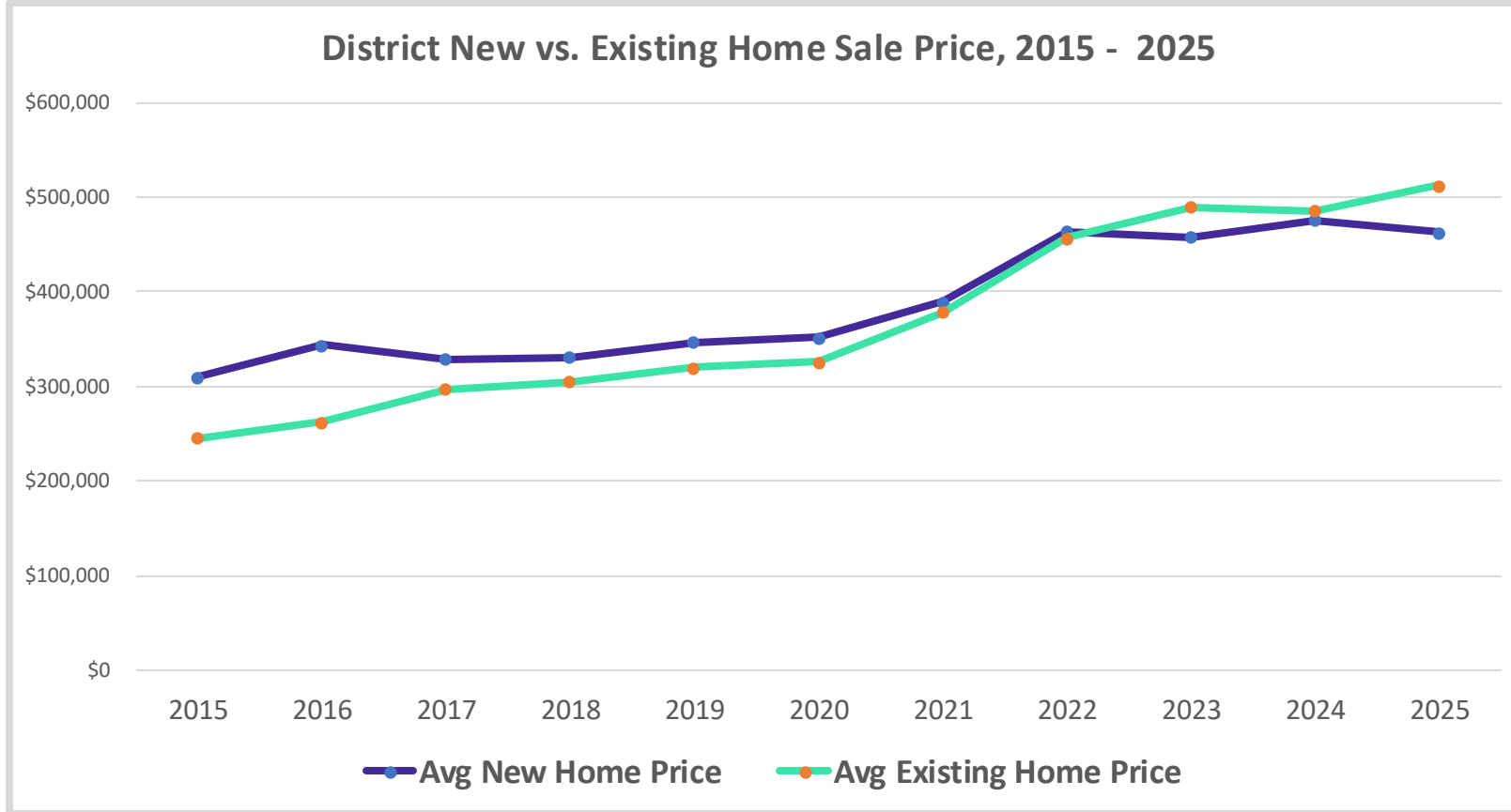

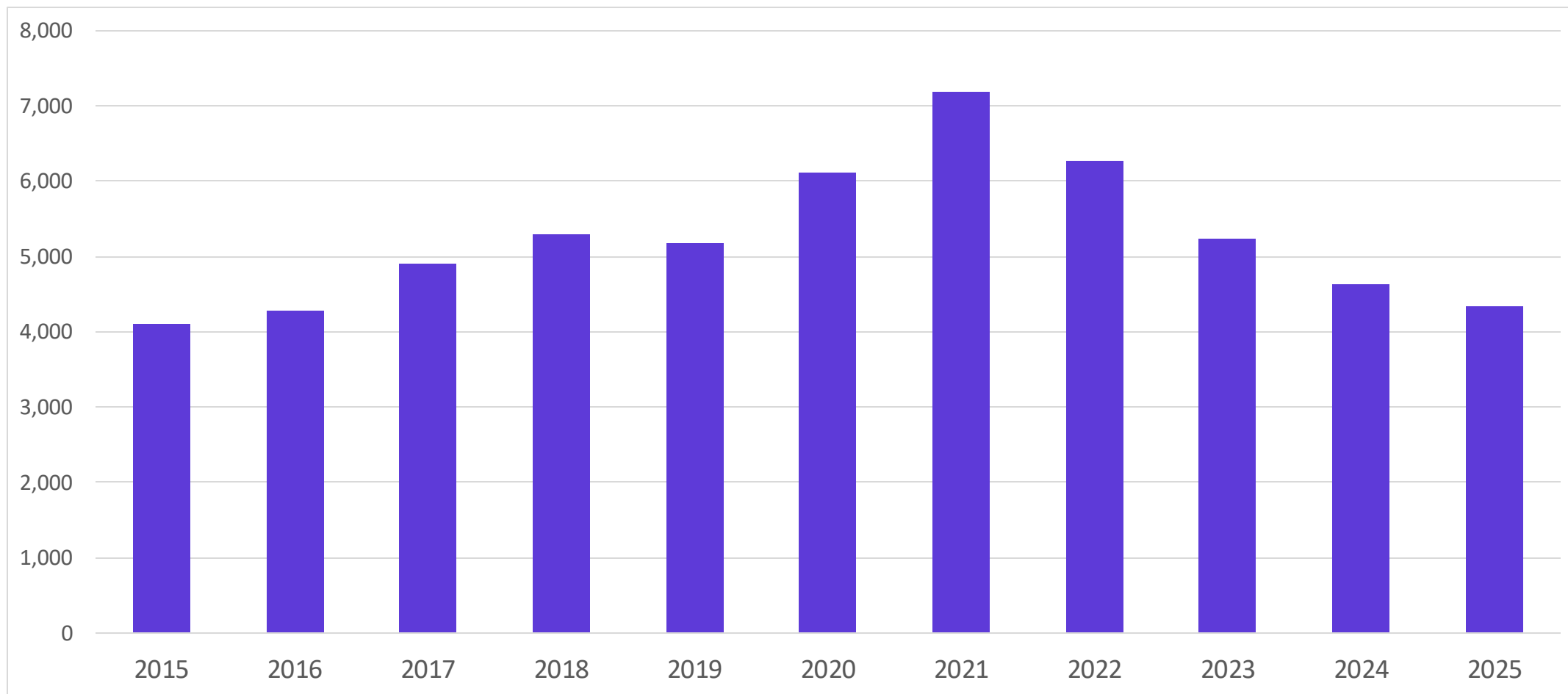

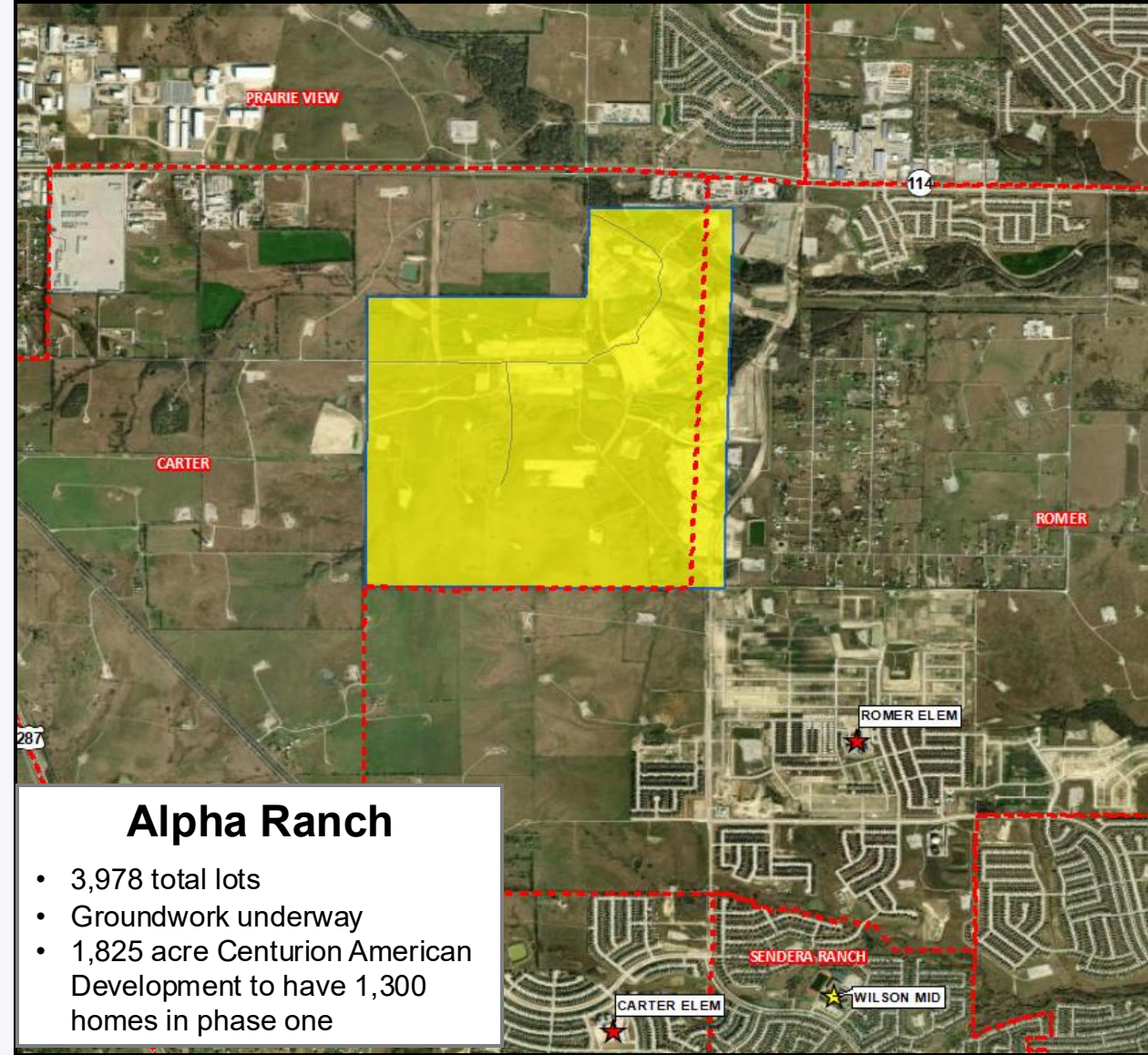
- The district has 71 active subdivisions with approximately 1,070 homes under construction and more than 5,900 lots ready to be built on

Housing Market Conditions -



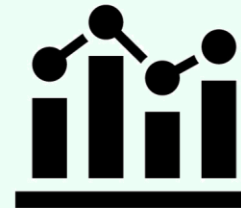
2025 new home starts and closings in NISD were on par with 2024 totals. Going forward, potential home buyers continue to face significant headwinds due to ongoing economic uncertainty including much higher gas prices which, thus far, is negatively impacting home sales in 2026.

The district currently has approximately 1,070 homes under construction, 5,900 lots available to build on, and more than 39,000 homes planned in the future.
