All students are eligible during the Thanksgiving break (November 22 - 29), Christmas break (December 19 - January 7), and Spring Break (March 6 - 14)

NOTE: A student who receives, at the end of a grading period, a grade below 70 in any academic class—other than an advanced placement or international baccalaureate course, or an honors or dual credit course in English language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, economics, or a foreign language—may not participate in extracurricular activities for at least three school weeks.

A student with disabilities who fails to meet the standards in the individualized education program (IEP) may not participate for at least three school weeks. An ineligible student may practice or rehearse.

FM (LOCAL)

The District shall make no distinction between absences for UIL activities and absences for other extracurricular activities approved by the board.

A student in grades 6–8 shall be allowed in a school year ten extracurricular activity absences not related to post-district competition, five absences for post-district competition prior to state, and two absences for state competition.

A student in grades 9–12 shall be allowed unlimited extracurricular activity absences, subject to “no pass, no play” rules. [See FM(LEGAL)]

FMG (LOCAL)

A student who participates in a school-sponsored trip shall be required to use transportation provided by the school to and from the event. An exception may be made only if the student’s parent or guardian makes a written request that the student be released to the parent or to another adult designated by the parent.

The District shall not be liable for any injuries that occur to a student using transportation that is not provided by the school.
