STUDENT TRANSFER AGREEMENT

Wink-Loving ISD considers transfer applicants annually prior to the beginning of the school year. To apply, the parent/guardian must submit a completed Application for Transfer and read and agree to the following terms and conditions listed in this agreement.

Acceptance to attend WLISD is a privilege extended to non-resident students by the school board and community. WLISD maintains high academic and discipline standards and encourages its students to achieve their potential. Therefore, the district deems it necessary for anyone accepted into our school district to conform to these expectations and become an integral part of the school community. Parent interest, participation, and cooperation is expected.

Any transfer accepted is conditional. Student and parent/guardian behavior and cooperation will be evaluated on a continual basis. Transfer requests may be rejected or a transfer discontinued based on student or parent/guardian violations of district policies, regulations, and procedures. Priority will be given to students who have siblings currently attending school in the district.

I understand the following may result in the revocation of my child's transfer:

1. The student is charged in any court with any felony or misdemeanor offense involving drugs, alcohol or narcotics and a conviction results from the charges.
2. The student is indicted by a grand jury on a felony charge and is found guilty.
3. The student possesses and/or uses any drug, alcohol or tobacco while at school or a school sponsored activity regardless of its location.
4. The student is party to any interruptions of school, disturbance of classes, or any disobedience.
5. The student fails to meet academic standards, attendance standards, or is habitually truant or tardy.
6. Parent/guardian misconduct, including, but not limited to, harassment of school personnel, any failure to abide by school policy, or any conduct inappropriate for a school setting.

		I have read and understand Board Policy FDA(LOCAL), the transfer policy of WLISD, which was included in my Application Packet.
		I understand that the Parent/Guardian of the Student must assume responsibility for transportation of Student. I understand that WLISD shall not be required to provide transportation to students on intra-district or inter-district transfers.
		I understand and agree that the Parent/Guardian agrees to notify the campus of any address changes.
		I understand transfers are considered on a student-by-student basis and, in some cases, a transfer may be approved for one sibling, but not for another.
		I understand transfers can affect a student's UIL participation eligibility.
		I understand that I cannot move my student for athletic purposes.
		I understand that WLISD reserves the right to limit or restrict student transfers to any campus.

		I understand that transfer students may be returned to their home campuses in order to reestablish enrollment balance if an unexpected increase in enrollment on the campus occurs.
		Parent/Guardian and Student agree to assume responsibility for satisfactory attendance, discipline, achievement of the student, and cooperation with the school staff while at the transfer school. I understand that this transfer, if approved, may be revoked based upon issues concerning attendance, failing grades, and/or discipline.
		I understand that, a person who knowingly falsifies information on this form required for the Student's enrollment in the District will be liable to the District for tuition costs, as provided in Education Code 25.001(h), if the Student is not eligible for enrollment on the basis of false information. In addition, presenting false information or false records is a criminal offense under Penal Code 37.10.

Authority

The Superintendent or designee is authorized to accept or reject any transfer requests, provided that such action is without regard to race, religion, color, sex, disability, national origin, or ancestral language.

A resident student who becomes a nonresident during the course of a semester may be permitted to continue in attendance for the remainder of the semester without submitting a transfer application if the student maintains the standards required of transfer students.

Transfer Application

A nonresident student wishing to transfer into the District shall file an application for transfer with the campus principal in accordance with administrative regulations.

Upon receipt of a completed transfer application, the District shall request the following documents from the sending district:

- Transcript (grades 9–12);
- Current report card (kindergarten–grade 12);
- Standardized test scores (grades 3–11);
- Attendance record (kindergarten–grade 12); and
- Discipline record (kindergarten–grade 12).

Factors to Be Considered

The Superintendent or designee shall consider the following factors when approving or denying a transfer request:

1. The results of parent and student interviews, including the parent's and student's commitment to and support for the total school program;
2. The student's academic record and test information, which shall include but not be limited to state-mandated assessments, conduct/discipline records, and attendance records;
3. The student's grade level and the effect of additional students at that grade level on class size, staffing, and facilities;
4. The effect of a transfer on the available space and instructional capacity at the campus; and
5. The suitability of established programs and curriculum for meeting the student's academic needs.

Students with Disabilities

The District shall abide by all applicable state and federal law when considering the transfer application of a student with disabilities, including, but not limited to, a student receiving special education services.

Reasons for Denial

The District may deny a transfer request based on any combination of the factors listed above. The District may also deny a transfer request if approval of the transfer would result in the hiring of additional staff, purchasing equipment, or adding facilities; or would limit the educational opportunities of District residents.

The District shall deny a transfer request from a student whose records indicate that the student:

1. Was assigned to a disciplinary alternative education program (DAEP) within the past 18 months; or
2. During the previous 12 months:
 - a. Was expelled, for any reason;
 - b. Engaged in delinquent conduct or conduct in need of supervision and is on probation or other conditional release for that conduct, or has been convicted of a criminal offense and is on probation or other conditional release; or
 - c. Lost credit or was not promoted on the basis of absences in excess of ten percent of class time; however, the District may consider documented extenuating circumstances for absences.

Transfer Agreement

A transfer student and his or her parent shall be required to sign a transfer agreement before the student is enrolled in the District. The agreement shall specify the terms of the student's admission, including any tuition amounts that may be charged and an acknowledgment of District policies and procedures. A transfer student shall be notified in the written transfer agreement that he or she must follow all rules and regulations of the District.

A transfer agreement shall be in effect for one school year only. Violation of the terms of the agreement may result in a transfer request not being approved the following year. The Superintendent may reject a student's transfer request for the following year if:

1. The student or parent does not comply with District policies or campus procedures, rules, or regulations as detailed in the student handbook, the Student Code of Conduct, the Board policy manual, or principal documentation;
2. The student's attendance drops below 90 percent of the days the class is offered;
3. Class size exceeds state or local guidelines;
4. Facilities become overcrowded;

5. The transfer has a negative effect on the education of students who are residents of the District; or
6. The student fails to meet any other transfer standards as outlined in the transfer agreement.

Appeals

Any appeals shall be made in accordance with FNG(LOCAL) and GF(LOCAL), as appropriate.
