**VI. 2026-2027 K-12 Science Textbook Adoption Presentations**

Brook Becker (grades K-2), Chrissy Robbins (grades 3-4), Kianie Brockman and Julie Christner (grades 5-8), and Nathan Bramble (grades 9-12) reviewed recommended science materials and textbooks. Teachers focused on alignment with Ohio's learning standards, future focus skills, and differentiation opportunities. Materials and texts will be on display through the May 18<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

**VII. Presentation: Designing Schoolwork that Builds Study Skills & Executive Function of LifeLong Learners**

Emily Burton, Stephanie Denton, Emma Klingman, Lori Schreiner, and Sandy Zuefle presented their findings from the recent Homework/Best Practices committee. The study identified best practices for staff in assigning and integrating homework in the learning process, reviewed how to equip students with effective strategies for studying, note-taking, executive functioning, and included connections to current brain research. The presentation included a review of current homework policies, teacher survey findings, independent research findings, and recommendations. The recommendations were to design of purposeful homework, explicitly teach study skills and executive functioning, teach note-taking as an overt skillset, align study practices with evidence-based learning strategies, and support the responsible and productive use of technology and AI.

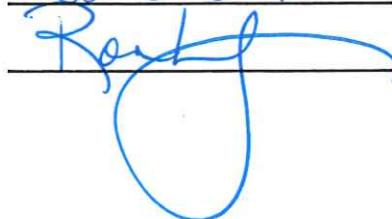
