Budget Message from the Board of Trustees for Fiscal Year 2026-2027

For your consideration, the Board of Trustees of the Baldwin Public Library respectfully presents a budget for 2026-2027 in the amount of \$6,489,946.

This includes a Tax Levy of \$6,187,329, which represents an increase of \$127,985 (2.11%). This amount is within the Tax Cap.

As always, we have carefully considered every budget line and the impact that expenses have on public service. We have increased the Materials budget by \$11,800 to continue to provide the community with a robust mix of physical and digital materials. We propose adding \$42,624 to our Operating Expenses which includes programs, supplies, and equipment maintenance. It also includes the fees we pay in order to have an online catalog and services such as the delivery of materials from other libraries. Buildings & Grounds has an increase of \$13,000; we will need more custodial supplies to care for our newly renovated spaces and we anticipate a modest increase in utilities. This budget also allows us to support the staffing levels that the community has come to value.

The Baldwin Public Library is a distinct entity with its own budget and trustees that are presented as separate propositions at the same time as the annual school district vote. One seat on the Library Board will be presented for election.

This past year has brought many changes to the Library and more great things are on the way. We thank you for your support and encourage you and your entire family to visit the Library to take advantage of one of the best values you will ever get for your tax dollars.

Mensaje de presupuesto de la Junta de Fideicomisarios para el año fiscal 2026-2027

Para su consideración, la Junta de Fideicomisarios de la Biblioteca Pública de Baldwin presenta respetuosamente un presupuesto para 2026-2027 por un monto de \$6,489,946.

Esto incluye un gravamen fiscal de \$6,187,329, lo que representa un aumento de \$127,985 (2.11%). Este monto se encuentra dentro del límite del impuesto.

Como siempre, hemos considerado cuidadosamente cada línea del presupuesto y el impacto que los gastos tienen en el servicio público. Hemos aumentado el presupuesto de Materiales en \$11,800 para continuar proporcionando a la comunidad una sólida mezcla de materiales físicos y digitales. Proponemos añadir \$42,624 a nuestros Gastos Operativos, lo que incluye programas, suministros y mantenimiento de equipos. También incluye las tarifas que pagamos para tener un catálogo en línea y servicios como la entrega de materiales de otras bibliotecas. Edificios y Terrenos tiene un aumento de \$13,000; necesitaremos más suministros de limpieza para cuidar nuestros espacios recientemente renovados y anticipamos un aumento modesto en los servicios públicos. Este presupuesto también nos permite apoyar los niveles de personal que la comunidad ha llegado a valorar.

La Biblioteca Pública de Baldwin es una entidad distinta con su propio presupuesto y fideicomisarios que se presentan como propuestas separadas al mismo tiempo que la votación anual del distrito escolar. Un puesto en la Junta de la Biblioteca será presentado para elección.

Este último año ha traído muchos cambios a la Biblioteca y más cosas excelentes están en camino. Les agradecemos su apoyo y los animamos a usted y a toda su familia a visitar la Biblioteca para aprovechar uno de los mejores valores que jamás obtendrán por sus dólares de impuestos.

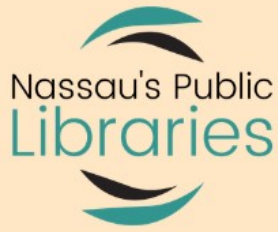
