Acceptable Use of Computer System

The Board of Education will provide access to various computerized information resources through the District's Computer System (DCS) consisting of software, hardware, computer networks, and electronic communications systems. This may include access to electronic mail, so-called "on-line services", and the "Internet." It may include the opportunity for some students to have independent access to the DCS from their home or other remote locations. All use of the DCS, including independent use off school premises, shall be subject to this policy and accompanying regulations. Further, all such use must be in support of education and/or research and consistent with the goals and purposes of the School District.

One purpose of this policy is to provide notice to students and parents/legal guardians that, unlike most traditional instruction or library media materials, the DCS will allow student access to external computer networks not controlled by the School District where it is impossible for the District to screen or review all of the available materials. Some of the available materials may be deemed unsuitable by parents/legal guardians for student use or access. This policy is intended to establish general guidelines for acceptable student use. However, despite the existence of such District policy and accompanying guidelines and regulations, it will not be possible to completely prevent access to computerized information that is inappropriate for students. Furthermore, students may have the ability to access such information from their home or other locations off school premises. Parents/legal guardians of students must be willing to set and convey standards for appropriate and acceptable use to their children when using the DCS or any other electronic media or communications. The District respects the right of each family to decide whether or not to apply for independent computer access.

Student use of the DCS is conditioned upon written agreement by all students and their parents/legal guardians that student use of the DCS will conform to the requirements of this policy and any regulations adopted to ensure acceptable use of the DCS. All agreements shall be kept on file in the District Office.

Generally, the same standards of acceptable student conduct which apply to any school activity shall apply to the use of the DCS. This policy does not attempt to articulate all required and/or acceptable uses of the DCS; nor is it the intention of this policy to define all inappropriate usage. Administrative regulations will further define general guidelines of appropriate student conduct and use.

District students shall also adhere to the laws, policies, and rules governing computers including, but not limited to, copyright laws, rights of software publishers, license agreements, and student rights of privacy created by federal and state law.

Students who engage in unacceptable use may lose access to the DCS and may be subject to further discipline under the District's school conduct and discipline policy and the Student Discipline Code of Conduct. The District reserves the right to pursue legal action against a student who willfully, maliciously or unlawfully damages, or destroys property of the District. Further, the District may bring suit in civil court against the parents/legal guardians of any student who willfully, maliciously or unlawfully damages or destroys District property pursuant to General Obligations Law Section 3-112.

Acceptable Use of Computer System

Student data files and other electronic storage areas will be treated like school lockers. This means that such areas shall be considered to be School District property subject to control and inspection. The computer coordinator may access all such files and communications to ensure system integrity and that users are complying with the requirements of this policy and accompanying regulations. Students should **NOT** expect that information stored on the DCS will be private.

The Superintendent or designee is authorized to establish regulations as necessary to implement the terms of this policy.

Acceptable Use of Computer System & Network

General Use of the District's Computer System & Network by All Users

The Board of Education will provide access to computerized information resources through the District's Computer System and Network ("DCS"), which shall include but not be limited to applications, software, hardware, computer networks, documents, accessed web pages, online services, artificial intelligence ("AI") tools, and electronic communications systems. Portions of the DCS may be accessed via the Internet and/or Wi-Fi networks. This policy establishes general guidelines for acceptable use by all users, including staff, students, and visitors. The Superintendent or designee is authorized to establish regulations as necessary to implement this policy.

DCS access may include the ability to access the DCS independently from home or other remote locations. All uses of the DCS, including independent use off school premises, shall be subject to this policy and any accompanying regulation(s). Upon accessing our DCS, all users agree to abide by the policy and regulations. Students and staff may have access to the DCS for educational and recreational/personal purposes that are consistent with this policy and its regulations, as well as for educational/research use. However, all use of the DCS must be consistent with the goals and purposes of the School District and may not interfere with a staff member's work for the District or a student's schoolwork or otherwise interfere with any educational use of the system.

Both the computer/network equipment and all computerized files contained in them are the property of the District. The District will have complete access to all such files to monitor appropriate use of the DCS and to perform system maintenance from time to time. The Director of Technology or designee may access all such files and communications to ensure system integrity and to verify that all users comply with the requirements of this policy and the accompanying regulations. No user of the DCS should have any expectation of privacy with respect to any information stored and/or accessed on the DCS.

The rules, regulations, and laws that govern acceptable student and staff conduct on an everyday basis shall apply to the use of the DCS. This includes, but is not limited to, Board policy and the Code of Conduct. However, this policy does not attempt to articulate all required and/or acceptable uses of the DCS; nor is it the intention of this policy to define all inappropriate usage. Administrative regulations will further define guidelines of appropriate conduct and use.

Users who violate these expectations may lose access to the DCS and face further disciplinary action. The District reserves the right to pursue legal action or recover financial losses against anyone who willfully, maliciously, or unlawfully damages or destroys District property.

DCS users shall also adhere to the laws, policies, and rules governing computers, including, but not limited to, copyright laws, rights of software publishers, license agreements, and student privacy rights created by federal and state law.

Use of Artificial Intelligence by All Users

For the purposes of this policy, artificial intelligence (AI) refers to computer-based systems or tools that perform tasks typically associated with human intelligence, including, but not limited to, generating text, images, audio, or video; coding; data analysis; translation; or personalized feedback.

Acceptable Use of Computer System & Network

Use of AI by any user on the DCS must meet the following guidelines:

1. All users must use AI tools that protect privacy and maintain academic integrity.
2. All district policies and regulations apply when using AI, and AI may not be used to violate or circumvent district policies and regulations.
3. AI use must support teaching, learning, administrative efficiency, or other relevant goals.
4. Users of AI must protect student and employee data and privacy and comply with all policies, laws, and regulations related to the same.
5. Users of AI must uphold academic honesty and professional ethics as required by District policy and the Code of Conduct.

AI may not be used to:

1. Generate or submit student work presented as entirely one's own when such is not authorized via the AI matrix and instructor. Similarly, staff should not utilize AI to generate information to fulfill professional obligations without editing and adding their own voice and personalization.
2. Replace required student learning, skill development, or assessment of individual understanding;
3. Access, store, or share personally identifiable student information without authorization;
4. Create, distribute, or amplify false, misleading, harmful, discriminatory, or inappropriate content;

Violations of AI rules will be addressed in accordance with the Code of Conduct, academic standards, and other applicable Board policies and procedures.

Use of the District's Computer System / Network and Artificial Intelligence by Students

Students are permitted to use AI tools in ways that align with teacher expectations and academic integrity standards, including AI as a learning support (e.g., brainstorming, feedback, tutoring, or accessibility assistance), and when explicitly permitted by a teacher or course guidelines. Expectations for AI use shall be clearly communicated in coursework and assignments, and, when required, students must disclose the use of AI tools in the creation of work product. Staff who suspect a student has not done an assignment on their own can request that the student demonstrate their knowledge of the material in other ways, to the same extent they already do.

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
