School Psychologist

Responsibilities:

- Conduct psychoeducational assessments to evaluate students' cognitive, academic, behavioral, social-emotional, and mental health functioning.
- Interpret evaluation results and prepare comprehensive written reports in compliance with federal and state regulations
- Participate in CSE, CPSE, 504, and MTSS meetings.
- Provide individual, group, and parent counseling and training per IEP requirements.
- Make recommendations to the CSE to support the placement of students in their least restrictive environment.
- Conduct program searches for students requiring out of district placements.
- Lead crisis intervention efforts.
- Conduct Functional Behavioral Assessments and develop and implement Behavior Intervention Plans and monitor progress.
- Train staff on the implementation of BIPs and data collection.
- Integrate counseling services into the environment, as appropriate.
- Provide assistance to staff in the design and implementation of appropriate interventions and accommodations for students.
- Contribute to program development that furthers the integration of social, coping, and problem solving in the classroom.
- Provide support services to parents/guardians as needed.
- Coordinate and/or collaborate with a range of individuals and outside agencies to promote and provide comprehensive services to students and families.
- Provide and/or assist in professional development for staff, parents, and/or the community.
- Participate in professional growth activities on a yearly basis including workshops, in-services, professional reading materials, and/or other available offerings by the district and other providers.
- Proficiently use technology to communicate, compile reports, and collect data, create initial IEPs and update annually.
- Participate in building or program activities and meetings as appropriate.

Qualifications:

- New York State Certification as a School Psychologist
- Completion of an approved program in School Psychology
- Demonstrated knowledge of psychological testing instruments, data interpretation, and legal guidelines under IDEA and Section 504
