

# Nassau Summer Program for Students with Disabilities



Our Transition Services Summer Program gives students with disabilities, who would otherwise be homebound or receiving limited programming, the opportunity to be part of a more comprehensive learning experience that also prevents substantial regression during the summer months.

Serving students, ages 14 to 22, with cognitive, physical, developmental and learning disabilities, the program encourages students to fully explore their communities and learn valuable life and socialization skills that are not necessarily emphasized during the academic year.

## Community Internships

Hands-on experiences in clerical, cultural/museum, food service, health, hotel/hospitality and retail work settings.

## Educational & Social Excursions

Weekly trips to Long Island and New York City attractions such as the Cradle of Aviation Museum, Bronx Zoo, Adventureland, Old Westbury Gardens, a NY Mets baseball game and more. Admission fees included in summer rate.

## Travel Training

Students learn to use the bus, railroad and NYC subway to travel to various points of interest.
