## Announce New Elem. Teachers at Onteora

The Onteora Central Schools will have eleven new members on their combined elementary faculties when they open on September 10, 1959, it is announced by Ronald P. Vanni, Director of Elementary Education.

Mrs. Mary Hearn of Yerry Hill Road, Woodstock, will teach

grade four at the Boiceville school. She graduated from

Southwestern College at Memphis, Tenn., and is now doing graduate work at New Paltz State Teachers College. Previously she taught grades four and five at Memphis, grade six at Forth Smith, Arkansas and grade two at George Washington School in Kingston.

Mrs. Irene Frost, R.F.D. No. 2, Kingston, graduated with a B.A. degree from Adelphi College. She will teach grade two at Boiceville. Her teaching experience includes teach-

ing all elementary grades in the Brooklyn Public Schools and working as a Supervisor of Day Classes for Adults and teacher in charge of Evening Elementary Schools in the New York City system.

Mr. Herbert Dinn of Brooklyn, graduated this past June from New Paltz State Teach-

ers College with a B.S. degree in Art Education. Mr. Dinn will teach elementary art at Boiceville. He did his practice teaching in grades one through six and in the Junior-Senior High School at Irvington, New York.
