Dan White has long been a dedicated member of the Rockland sports community as both an athlete and a sports historian. White thrived as a multi-sport athlete in high school before earning a spot on a collegiate tennis team. He later became involved with the Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame, devoting himself to honoring Rockland's greatest athletes.

Dan was a very successful athlete at Nyack High. He was a county champion tennis player, going unbeaten his senior year in the first doubles slot with partner Mike O'Dowd. He was also part of a county champion basketball team at Nyack that was nearly undefeated in Rockland County play. White continued his athletic career at Rutgers University, where he was third doubles on the tennis team.

In the 1990s, Dan began his long tenure working with the Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame. He joined the executive committee in 1992 and has since successfully nominated 23 Rockland athletes for selection into the county Hall of Fame, including 10 from Nyack. White has also had a part in supporting 16 other Nyack nominees and has also helped coordinate countless county Hall of Fame induction dinners.

Dan was inducted into Rockland County Sports Hall of Fame in 2007 for his service to Rockland sports over the years. He was also given the Joseph R. Holland Lifetime
