THE COMMUNITY

Sleepy Hollow High School serves an ethnically and socio-economically diverse student body from the villages of Sleepy Hollow and Tarrytown. Recently renovated and expanded, the school stands above the east bank of the Hudson River in southern Westchester County, approximately 20 miles north of New York City.

We have become a community of choice for middle and upper middle class families who value our "snapshot" of the real world. Our population is a blend of families who have lived in town for generations and newly-arrived immigrants from the Caribbean and Latin America. Many of our families can afford to send their children to a host of private schools in the area, but we are proud to say that they choose instead to have their children attend the public school. Side by side, the children of professionals and tradesmen, study our full curricula. Their parents jointly support the Foundation for the Public Schools of the Tarrytowns, which raises hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to supplement our educational programs.

THE SCHOOL

Sleepy Hollow High School is a comprehensive school with an enrollment of 846 students, grades 9-12. The school has favorable class sizes and an unusually broad-based high school curriculum of more than 160 courses designed to meet the needs of the diverse population it serves; we adhere to an open-enrollment policy and we encourage all students to challenge themselves to the best of their ability. In addition to 19 Advanced Placement courses and 18 honors courses, we offer 14 dual enrollment college-level courses as well as New York State Regents courses in all major academic areas (See Course Offerings). Acceleration and independent study projects for advanced students are provided, as well as remediation, special education courses, and English as a New Language (ENL) for students with limited English proficiency. Instruction in a full range of occupational skills is also available through the Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES). We offer comprehensive fine and performing arts curricula; students have the opportunity to participate in All County and All State music ensembles, and national music festivals. As well, we offer an award-winning multimedia program and digital news network.

We have established partnerships with colleges, universities, corporations, as well as with local historical and business resources to make our community an extension of our campus. A variety of educational experiences are provided through projects and internships linked to our partnerships.

Advanced Placement courses in the following 19 subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics I, Physics 2, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Government & Politics, U.S. History, World History, French Language, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Music Theory, and Studio Art.

Honors courses in Chemistry, Physics, English 9-12, Integrated Algebra, Integrated Geometry, Integrated Algebra 2/Trig, Pre-Calculus, Global History I-II, US History, Economics, Government and Contemporary Issues, and Spanish I-III.
