Gifted and Talented students in grades 3-5 at Lewis & Clark Elementary School selected an individual they think exemplifies those traits and will now embody their chosen individual at the People of Character Living Wax Museum on Wednesday.

In preparation for the Living Wax Museum, the third, fourth, and fifth graders chose a celebrity or historical figure and researched how that person lived up to the qualities of respect, fairness, caring, responsibility, and trustworthiness.

They used their research to write a paper explaining how they exemplified those traits and on Wednesday, they will bring the research to life. Each of the students will dress up as their person of character and give a presentation about their topic next to a display board they have created.
