At VMSS, we want to partner with you to ensure your child is ready to reach their full potential. To meet this goal we need your child to attend school on time each day they are physically well.

We strongly believe in the power of learning from and with our students. If a student is not in school then we miss that opportunity.

Furthermore, being absent leads to lower grades, higher dropout rates, and poor social skills.

Students who miss school, miss out on forming friendships, gaining face-to-face academic support and developing strong communication skills.

Help your student succeed by maintaining healthy daily routines, limit technology and ensure good sleeping and eating habits.

If your student has struggled in this past year or begins to struggle with their attendance, you will be contacted by VMSS for support by a School Counselor or Behavior Specialist.

## Cell Phone & Wireless Earbuds/Head phones

District 196 middle schools require students to leave their devices at home or turned off and put away in their backpacks during school hours. Students struggling with this practice will be required to have a parent pick up their technology from school.

There are many students who are dropped off and picked up from school each day. For that reason we encourage you to plan ahead as our lines are quite long and we need to keep

### **SAFETY AS PRIORITY #1.**

Please only use the east parking lot (by the flagpole) for students. The north lot is reserved for buses and the parking lot to the south of the east lot is reserved for buses and deliveries.

Period 1 starts at 8:20am and breakfast is not served past 8:15am to ensure that students have enough time to travel to class.

Because learning starts promptly at 8:20, students regularly arriving late to school (without valid excuse) will meet with a School Counselor or Behavior Specialist to develop a support plan. Students showing a pattern of arriving late will make up time missed after school.
