**4. Student Leadership Council (WALC) Presentation by Kealyn Lamarre**

Dean of Student Affairs Karin Hughes introduced Kealyn Lamarre (grade 11). Kealyn proposed creating a new organization called the Woodstock Academy Leadership Council (WALC). Charged with working with the administrative team to identify projects that will both benefit the school and increase student voice, student members will span all grades. A mini-project has been assigned—to improve New Student Day—and group members will likely participate in the event. During Kealyn's PowerPoint presentation, questions were asked and answered. The WALC will meet bi-weekly or monthly, membership will be considered after completing an application, and officers will be elected. As projects are undertaken and completed, the group plans to report back to the Student Life Committee. Committee members thanked Kealyn for her vision and enthusiasm.

**5. Student Activities Updates by Heath White**

Dean of Student Affairs Karin Hughes introduced Student Life Committee member Heath White (grade 11). Heath gathered data from a variety of clubs and organizations to create a PowerPoint called "WA Life: A Student's Perspective." School strengths included academic diversity, strong teacher-student relationships, and high participation in over 46 clubs/activities. Additional detail was provided for student government, honor societies, and the arts. Areas of improvement included increased access to SAT test prep, and providing additional opportunities for learning outside of the classroom, such as internships and field trips. Student Life Committee members thanked Heath for a great presentation.

Dean of Student Affairs Karin Hughes shared that Bobbie-Jo Saucier planned to present a health services overview at the next meeting in May.
