7. Adapt teaching methods and instructional materials to meet students' varying needs and interests.
8. Work cooperatively with special education teachers to modify curricula as needed for special education students according to Individual Education Plans (IEP).
9. Establish and enforce rules for behavior and procedures for maintaining classroom order.
10. Present a positive role model for students that supports the mission of the school district.
11. Interact in a positive manner with staff, students, and parents.
12. Demonstrate behavior that is professional, ethical, and responsible.
13. Regular in attendance.
14. Utilize ovens to prepare pre-packaged meals for attendees as planned by head cook.
