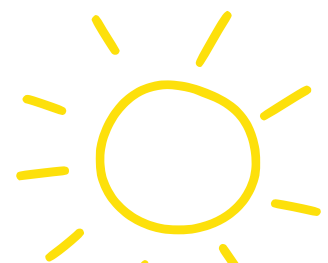

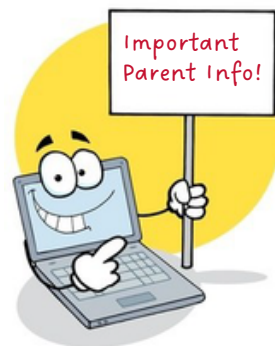

TUCKER'S CORNER



Using Positive Language to Improve your Child's Behavior

As adults, we might find ourselves using phrases such as "no", "do not do that," or "stop" when working with a child who begins or continually makes their own choices. Young children are not able to make the logical connection that when they are told not to do something, what they actually should do is the opposite. Instead, it is more helpful for young children to hear what they can do. When you focus on using positive language with a child, you will likely find that they have fewer tantrums, whine less, and experience fewer challenging behaviors. Using positive language and positive descriptive feedback gives your child a better understanding of what you expect and makes them feel valued when they do what is expected of them.

Instead of telling children what not to do...	Try saying these examples next time!
"Do not climb on the counter."	"Please keep your feet on the floor."
"Do not cut that."	"Scissors are for cutting paper or playdough."
"Stop being sad. We have to go to school today."	"I know you are sad. Going to school is not a choice. We will be sure to play with your toys together when we get home. Would you like me to buckle you in your seat or would you like to buckle yourself?"
"I need you to stop watching TV and start picking up your toys right now."	"We need to stop watching TV soon because I need your help to pick up your toys. Remember, first we pick up your toys and then you may watch TV."
"Good job!"	"You did such a nice job letting the child go first on the slide and keeping your hands to yourself!"

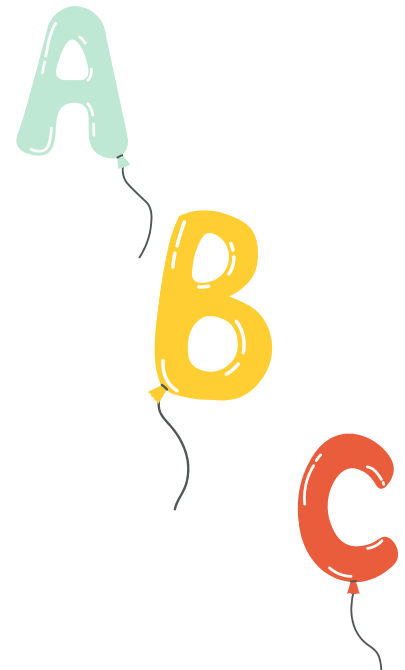

Learning About Letters and Words

Learning about letters and words is important to developing young readers and writers. Through games, songs, and other playful experiences with letters throughout the day, your child is developing a strong foundation. In the 4K classroom, children see letters in meaningful places every day! Quite a bit of letter learning takes place during shared reading and interactive writing. Children are also provided with many opportunities to play with the letters themselves. Word learning can happen naturally as children are exposed to stories and learning letters.

Word Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Help your child connect their name to words. You might say <i>"that word starts like your name or that word has some letters you know in it."</i>

FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE: IMMUNIZATIONS - IS YOUR CHILD UP TO DATE?

Hello families,

As summer is approaching it is time to start thinking about scheduling your student's [well child visit](#) and making sure they are up to date on vaccines. The Wisconsin Immunization Law requires that all students through grade 12 meet a minimum number of required immunizations prior to school attendance. These requirements can be waived only for health, religious or personal conviction reasons.

Class Description

Countdown to Kindergarten is a playful readiness class that builds early math, reading, writing, and social skills. Students also have a lot of fun and meet new friends while becoming familiar with routines and the school setting. This class is for students entering 5 year old Kindergarten the following fall.
