Requirements

U.S. Service Member Applicants may meet content knowledge and experience requirements as follows:

- Applicant has served in a branch of the military with an MOS **related** to the CTE credential listed above.
- The service member must also have served no less than 3 years of active duty (Guard/Reserves must have 10 years or 5 years with a total of 12 active related deployment months) under this MOS.
 - MOS, time of service, and an Honorable discharge must be verified on a DD-214 submitted with this application.

All other applicants must meet content knowledge (Option A, B or C) AND occupational requirements outlined below:

Content Knowledge:

- **Option A**
 - Valid FAA Part 107 Remote Pilot Certification **AND**
 - Current industry-recognized flight training credential (i.e., USI, AUVSI, sUAS-NIST, NeuroDiversity Works)
- **Option B**
 - Valid FAA Part 107 Remote Pilot Certification **AND**
 - Have completed UAS 2055 **AND**
 - Have completed UAS 1040 or 1055
- **Option C**
 - Valid FAA Part 107 Remote Pilot Certification **AND**
 - Certificate of completion of training conducted within CCCS or CSU Drone Center, with a minimum of 35 in-person hours covering UAS 1040 or UAS 1055 Flight Training Course Learning Outcomes and Competencies

Occupational Experience:

- 20 verified sUAS commercial flight hours **OR**
- FAA-certified flight or ground instructor **OR**
- One year/two semesters' verified experience full-time teaching UAS/aviation-related coursework in the content area (full-time is defined as 51% or more of a teaching schedule dedicated to teaching in the content area)
