- **Specialized Elementary programs** begin on **Tuesday, June 2, including** PK and Kindergarten Camp Chispas, Extended School Year (ESY) and Compensatory Services.
- **Accelerated Learning Elementary programs** begin on **Tuesday, June 2, including** Accelerated Learning (G1-G5) and Bilingual Bridge Camp for our emerging bilingual students rising 5th graders.

Families with students eligible and identified to attend these summer programming opportunities will receive information by May 26. All students in our summer programming will have access to our free summer meals. Please note that transportation is not provided to students, therefore families will have to arrange for daily transportation, unless predetermined by the ARD committee.

Additionally, there will be no summer programming on Friday, June 19, as campuses will be closed in observance of the Juneteenth holiday.

School Year Forms

School Year forms (previously called Back to School forms). **This applies to any new student regardless of start date at YES Prep.**

Annual Student Enrollment forms ensure important student information, such as guardians, emergency contacts and medical information, is updated and allows the district to respond appropriately in case of emergency. Maintaining up-to-date student information is also needed to maintain compliance with the TEA (Texas Education Agency).

Annual Student Enrollment forms for returning and new students will be released through [Skyward Family Access](#) on Monday, June 15, 2026. We encourage families to complete their students' Annual Student Enrollment forms as soon as possible.

School Year 2026-2027 Dress Code

YES Prep Public Schools believes in the power of community and school pride while also deeply valuing a student's right to express their individuality without the fear of unnecessary discipline, body shaming, or the confines of gender norms. Students have the right to be treated equitably and dress code enforcement at YES Prep Public Schools will not create disparities, reinforce or increase the marginalization of any group, nor will it be unfairly enforced more strictly against a student because of racial identity, ethnicity, gender expression, sexual orientation, cultural or religious identity, household income, body size or type, or body maturity.

For the 2026-2027 school year, students are required to wear a YES Prep-branded uniform top five days a week, the last day of the week allows for a variation (i.e. - college t-shirt day). Students will be allowed to wear a uniform top from any previous school year (that fits uniform policy).


Additional Guidance:

- All YES Prep students should own at least 1 campus polo.
- Uniforms from the 2025-2026 school year and previous years are acceptable if they meet the school's uniform guidelines.

YES Prep Shirts	<p>Students are required (encouraged) to wear a YES Prep Polo or YES Prep Spirit Shirt 5 days of the week to strengthen school pride, unify the community, and to promote a college-going culture. All YES Prep students should own at least 1 campus polo. <i>Students are not required to tuck in shirts.</i></p>
YES Prep Outerwear	<p>Students are encouraged to wear YES Prep-branded outerwear to continue to strengthen school pride, unify the community, and promote a college-going culture. Outerwear can be purchased from YES Prep or the campus Athletic Department. Students may choose from the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • YES Prep sweatshirt (purchased through YES Prep) • Campus athletics department outerwear (purchased through campus Athletics Department) • Campus-issued grade level or spirit sweatshirts etc. (purchased through campus as applicable)
Tops	<p>In the case that families cannot acquire YES Prep Polo or YES Prep Spirit shirts students will be required to wear uniform style polos in colors blue or white.</p>  <p>Shirts with other colors, designs or patterns are not allowed to be used as part of the uniform unless “free dress” has been awarded for that Friday as part of our incentive program.</p>
Bottoms	<p>Students may choose between pants, skirts, or shorts of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Khakis • Navy <p>Students should wear bottoms that allow them to comfortably participate in PE. Students may not wear pajama pants or bottoms with holes.</p> <p><i>Shorts and skirts should be no shorter than mid-thigh.</i></p>

	<p>Bottoms may not have holes/tears below the knee/with leggings underneath.</p> <p>Jeans and other sportswear will be allowed on Fridays only when “Free dress” has been awarded by our incentive program.</p> <p>Students are not required to wear belts.</p>
Shoes	<p>Tennis shoes are recommended so students can safely participate in activities at recess and in PE.</p> <p>For safety purposes, all shoes must meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closed-toed • Must have backs (i.e. no slides) • Must have hard soles (i.e. no slippers) • Any color is permitted • No shoes with heels over .5 inches • For student safety, Crocs and similar open-back rubber footwear are not permitted at YES Prep Southeast Elementary. These types of shoes may create safety concerns during recess, physical education, stair use, emergency procedures, and daily movement throughout the school building because they may slip off easily or provide limited foot support and protection.
Accessories & Styling	<p>Students may have visible piercings and tattoos if messaging and images are school-appropriate.</p> <p>Accessory items that are spiked (bracelets, belts, collars) are not permitted due to safety reasons.</p> <p>Students may wear a variety of hairstyles and colors. Head shaving designs are permitted as long as images are school-appropriate.</p> <p>Hats and sunglasses are not permitted for safety purposes.</p> <p>Religious head coverings are permitted.</p>
Free Dress Tops	<p>Clothing should meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • T-shirts are acceptable; however, all clothing and accessories must be school appropriate: YES Prep prohibits pictures, emblems, or writings on T-shirts that are lewd, offensive, vulgar, or obscene or that advertise or depict tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or any other substance, show gang affiliation, or depict violence in any way. • No tank tops, halter tops, tube tops, net or sheer tops, shirts with spaghetti straps, or strapless tops for any student. • No bare midriffs (half shirts) allowed for any student. • No open-toed shoes.
