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# *What makes a Music Scholar at Fettes?*

**Music Scholars should be musically motivated, committed both to their instruments and music-making in groups, and should be prepared to contribute to School music in a major way and set a fine example to others. 13+ Music Scholars are also expected to take Music as one of their Fourth Form (Year 10/S4) GCSE options.**

## **Music Scholars Programme**

For students who perform exceptionally well throughout their assessment and succeed in being awarded a Music Scholarship, this includes:

- Free music lessons across two instruments each week in term time
- Opportunities to lead and perform in concerts, recitals and competitions
- Invitation to participate in the planning of musical events
- Music Scholars are nurtured and supported by the Music staff to monitor progress, ensure an even spread of commitments and assist with their musical development.

# How to apply for a Music Scholarship at Fettes

**To apply for a Music Scholarship at I3+ or at I6+ please complete this Application Form by the deadline date (see below).**

- I6+ deadline to apply for a 2027 Scholarship  
= 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2026
- I3+ deadline to apply for a 2027 Scholarship  
= 14<sup>th</sup> January 2027
- Late entrants are by exception and this cannot be guaranteed. To avoid disappointment please ensure you meet the deadline.

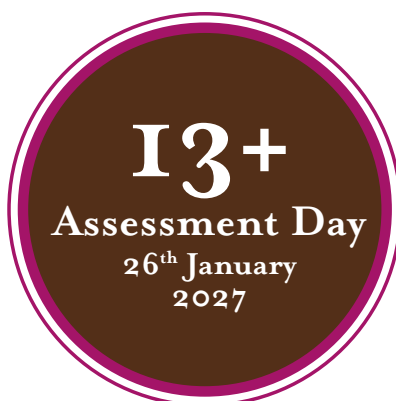
Candidates can only apply for a maximum of two Scholarships for 2027. We do not recommend applying for the combination of Music and Sport or Music and Piping / Snare Drumming as the time commitment to fulfil a student's potential in two of these Scholarships would put an undue burden on the candidate's academic priorities.

# *What to expect on the Assessment Day*

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# At 13+

**Candidates entering into our Third Form (Year 9/S3) will first gain an offer of a place at Fettes by attending an assessment in the Autumn Term which will comprise a CAT4 test and 15-20 minute interview with a member of our Senior Management Team.**

Candidates sitting Common Entrance will also take the CAT4 test to assist us with setting. Candidates will then return to Fettes for the Music Scholarship Assessment Day on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> January 2027.

Our 13+ Music Scholarship Assessment falls into **three** components:

**1.** Submit a Music CV by 13<sup>th</sup> January 2027 outlining musical ability, experiences, and achievements to date. The titles (and composer's names) of recent pieces played should be included. ([see example](#))

**2.** Perform two contrasting pieces on the principal study (Grade 5 or above – Trinity or Associated Board)  
If a second study on an instrument or voice is being offered, one piece should be presented. Candidates may offer a third instrument and are invited to prepare one piece on it. Pieces should be selected carefully and should demonstrate the candidate's musicianship and communication, rather than pure technical ability. An accompanist will be provided, where required, and you will have the opportunity to rehearse with them before the audition.

**3.** A short interview with the Director of Music and Head of Instrumental Music, within which candidates should be able to demonstrate their commitment, passion and the potential to thrive in Music at Fettes.

Candidates are advised to bring spare reeds and strings with them as appropriate.

# At 16+

**Candidates will attend our Scholarship Assessment Days on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2026 with the Music Assessment taking place on 10<sup>th</sup> November.**

Our 16+ Music Scholarship Assessment falls into **three** components.:

1.

Submit a video recording of two contrasting pieces on the candidate's principal study. For pianists, it is important that your hands are visible on the recording. This recording should be shared with [admissions@fettes.com](mailto:admissions@fettes.com) by 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2026 and the total performance time should not exceed 8 minutes. These can be recorded on a mobile phone or tablet and shared via WeTransfer or other platforms.

2.

Perform two contrasting pieces on the principal study (equivalent to ABRSM or Trinity Grade 7 or above). If a second study on an instrument or voice is being offered, one piece should be presented. Candidates may offer a third instrument and are invited to prepare one piece on it. Pieces should demonstrate the candidate's musicianship and communication other than purely technical ability. An accompanist will be provided, where required, and you will have the opportunity to rehearse with them before the audition. Please note photocopied music is not acceptable for the performance and originals must be used.

3.

A short interview with the Director of Music and the Head of Instrumental Music with an opportunity for the candidate to ask questions.

Candidates are advised to bring spare reeds and strings with them as appropriate.





## *What to wear and what to bring with you*

### **We want students to feel comfortable**

Please wear your school uniform or alternatively smart comfortable clothing.

We recommend you do not wear a Smart watch of any description, and do not bring a mobile phone. If you do bring these with you, we will ask you to leave these at reception. Please do bring a clear water bottle and clear pencil case.

We do not give detailed feedback on an individual's performance at our Assessment Days and the performance of each Scholarship holder is reviewed annually and is subject to satisfactory progress and behaviour.

### **Bursaries**

Fettes is committed to broadening access to the school by offering means-tested financial support towards the payment of school fees - known as a Bursary. Bursaries can cover 100% of fees payable, depending on the financial circumstances of applicants.

Bursaries at Fettes are not connected to Scholarships. The deadline for applying for a Bursary for entry to Fettes in 2027 is Friday 30<sup>th</sup> October 2026.
