Monday: Boys - Khaki Pants, Black Belt, White Button Down Shirt With Logo, ILTexas Plaid Tie, Solid Black Tennis Shoes and Black Crew Socks

Monday: Girls - Plaid Jumper Dress worn with Maroon or Black Modesty Shorts, White Peter Pan Blouse, Solid White Tennis Shoes, White Knee High Socks or Solid White Footed Tights.

Tuesday-Friday Boys: Khaki Pants or Shorts, ILTexas Polo, Black Belt, Solid Black Tennis Shoes and Black Crew Socks.

Tuesday-Friday: Girls – Khaki Pants, Khaki Shorts or Khaki Skort – must be uniform design and knee length, ILTexas Polo Shirt, or Khaki Jumper Dress with Logo, worn with Modesty Shorts, Solid White Tennis Shoes and White Crew or Knee High Socks or White Footed Tights.

Starting on page 59, **DRESS CODE & UNIFORMS** it states: "Jackets may be worn to school, but only school-approved jackets are allowed in the building. **Hoodies are not allowed.**"

Also, further on page 61 it states: "SWEATERS, JACKETS & SPIRIT SWEATSHIRTS

A solid maroon, white, black, or grey cardigan (button up or closed v-neck sweater) or jackets with an ILTexas logo may be worn Monday through Friday. Only the ILTexas blazer or jackets with the ILTexas logo may be worn Monday through Friday. **Jackets of ILTexas colors may be worn, but the hoods may not be worn on the head in the building.** Pullover hoodies are not permitted (including Athletic hoodies issued by the Athletic Department). No other jackets, hoodies, sweaters or sweatshirts may be worn during school hours in the school building."
