Purpose of This Meeting:

- Develop a foundational understanding of the Center for the Future of Arizona and its role in advancing K–12 education outcomes and innovations in Arizona, including statewide priorities such as early literacy, educational attainment, the Arizona Education Progress Meter, and Permission Granted, and consider how those tools and resources can support PVSchools's vision.
- Engage in discussion and reflection on how statewide demographic, educational, and workforce trends may impact future enrollment, programming, and facility planning considerations for PVSchools.
- Collaboratively process key takeaways from the guest presentation and identify themes, questions, or considerations relevant to the work of SEPAC and its subcommittees.
- Finalize subcommittee placements and establish the next steps for ongoing committee work related to school consolidation and closure, programming, and marketing/communication strategies.

Communication:

Thank you to everyone who participated in our recent committee meeting. We appreciate the time, thoughtfulness, and collaboration each member brought to the conversation.

The meeting opened with a review of our purpose, desired outcomes, and working agreements, followed by a brief table check-in to ground our work and center our discussion.

The committee then engaged in learning with a guest presenter Mr. Peter Boyle, Senior Director of Education with the Center for the Future of Arizona, who provided a broad, statewide perspective on K–12 education. The presentation focused on program development, innovation, and systems-level approaches to improving student outcomes. Members explored how data, policy tools, and structured resources can support districts in navigating requirements while advancing student-centered solutions. The group also had an opportunity to interact with several resources designed to help schools move ideas into action.

Following the presentation, committee members participated in a facilitated processing activity. Individually and in small groups, members identified one opportunity, one challenge, and one wondering related to future programming and initiatives. This activity generated meaningful reflection and helped surface themes that will inform future committee work.

The meeting concluded with a review of sub-committee rosters and a brief recap of key takeaways. The next SEPAC meeting will be Wednesday, July 22nd at 9:30 AM.
