



	<p><b>Q: When can I register for the next semester?</b>  <b>A:</b> An announcement will be posted on Instagram when the online registration form is available and it will be stated on the information flyer.</p>
	<p><b>Q: I signed up to drive on Tuesdays at 5:40 PM, but I can't make it. Can I drive on Wednesday at the same time?</b>  <b>A:</b> No. Whatever driving time you picked at the registration, that is your slot for the entire semester.</p>
	<p><b>Q: I normally go to lecture on Tuesday at 4:15PM, but I can't make it. Can I go to lecture another day?</b>  <b>A:</b> Yes. Lectures are flexible. In the fall &amp; spring, the same lecture is given 7 times per week. You DO NOT need to notify anyone about what lecture you will be or won't be attending.</p>
	<p><b>Q: What if I can't make it to any of the lectures during the week?</b>  <b>A:</b> You MUST make up any missed lecture(s) before you can receive your completion certificate. There will be opportunities to make-up missed lectures before the semester ends.</p>
	<p><b>Q: What if I can't make it to my scheduled driving time during the week?</b>  <b>A:</b> You MUST notify your driving instructor that you won't make it, then talk to them about the make-up driving time.</p>
	<p><b>Q: If I miss a driving day, do I need to reschedule the driving right away?</b>  <b>A:</b> No. There are many ways to make up for missed driving time. Please be patient and be guided by your driving instructor.</p>
	<p><b>Q: I want to be in the same car as my friend. Can I switch into their car?</b>  <b>A:</b> We will do our best to accommodate the students to be with their friends, however, ALL switches MUST be mutually agreed upon by the students on week-1 &amp; MUST be approved by Mr. Moran.</p>
	<p><b>Q: My child will turn 16-years old after the first day of the semester. Can I sign him/her up for that semester?</b>  <b>A:</b> No. NYS Dept. of Education requires ALL students to be 16-years old by day one of the semester. There are NO EXCEPTIONS.</p>
	<p><b>Q: How will I know of any changes to the Driver Ed calendar?</b>  <b>A:</b> Announcements will be made at the lectures and announcements will be posted on Google Classroom and Instagram.</p>
	<p><b>Q: Is the 5-Hour Certificate (MV-278) included in the Driver Ed tuition?</b>  <b>A:</b> Yes. The 5-Hour certificate will be provided to any student who requests one, so they can schedule their road test before they receive the MV-285 certificate.</p>
	<p><b>Q: When can I get the 5-Hour certificate?</b>  <b>A:</b> Students can get the MV-278 after 5-hours of classroom instruction.</p>
	<p><b>Q: I will be taking my road test after the completion of Driver Ed. Do I still need to get a 5-Hour certificate?</b>  <b>A:</b> No. The Course Completion Certificate (MV-285) supersedes the 5-Hour (MV-278) certificate, however, you can't make your appointment until after you get the certificate.</p>
	<p><b>Q: Will Driver Ed be closed if it snows?</b>  <b>A:</b> Yes, if the roads pose a hazard, we will cancel the driving and/or lecture. "If it's snowin' we ain't goin'"</p>
	<p><b>Q: When can students receive the driver ed completion letter?</b>  <b>A:</b> The driver ed completion letter (formally the MV-285 certificate) will be issued once the semester has ended, with successful completion of the program.</p>
	<p><b>Q: Do I have to attend the parent orientation?</b>  <b>A:</b> Yes, the purpose of the orientation is to explain the program and how it works. If we didn't have an orientation, we would get hundreds of questions about the program.</p>
	<p><b>Q: If I have a question, can I call Mr. Moran?</b>  <b>A:</b> It's preferable that all inquiries are via email. We typically have over 200 students enrolled in the program, which makes it extremely difficult to manage the time making phone calls. If a phone conversation is necessary, of course we can talk.</p>
	<p><b>Q: Can my child complete the program remotely or all-online?</b>  <b>A:</b> No. The NYS Education Department changed the guidelines back to the way they were "Pre-COVID", where all classes were in-person.</p>
	<p><b>Q: How long are the lectures?</b>  <b>A:</b> The duration of each lecture varies, but the average is 80-minutes per lecture. There is a total of 24-hours of classroom instruction.</p>
	<p><b>Q: Can a student opt out of the driving portion?</b>  <b>A:</b> No. As of June 30, 2023, the SED changed the guidelines back to the way they were "Pre-COVID", where all students must participate in the driving and lecture portion of the program.</p>
