

## Summer Preparation for Honors Latin II (2026-2027)

In order to further your knowledge of Latin and to prevent the "burn" as educators say (i.e., the loss of acquired learning during the long summer months), please complete the following assignments over Summer Break.

1. Read through "Nouns: 4th and 5th Declension" (T p. 228) and **learn the endings** for these two declensions. See the Latin Tutorials: [The Fourth Declension | LatinTutorial](#) and [The Fifth Declension | LatinTutorial](#).

2. Read through "The Partitive Genitive or Genitive of the Whole" (T p. 229).

3. Read "First Morning in Rome" (T p. 227) and **write Ex. 25a, 1-6 (T p. 227)**.

4. **Write Ex. 25c, 1-3 ONLY (T p. 229)**.

NOTA BENE I: Each written assignment will be due (in paper or as a GoogleDoc) on **the first day of class**.

NOTA BENE II: There will be a vocabulary quiz on Lesson 25 on **the second day of class**. The quiz covers **ONLY** the vocabulary below.
