

Summer Preparation for Honors Latin III (2026-2027)

In order to further your knowledge of Latin and to prevent the "burn" as educators say (i.e., the loss of acquired learning during the long summer months), I would like you to do the following assignments over Summer Break.

1. Read through "Accusative and Infinitive (Indirect Statement I)" (T p. 200-201) and watch this youtube video "Rule 86: Indirect Statement" ([Link](#)).
2. Learn the forms of fio, fieri, factus sum (T p. 206).
3. Read "A Rainy Day" (T p. 199-200) and write Ex. 46a, 1-12 ALL (T p. 199-200).
4. Write Ex. 46b (T p. 201) 1-10 ONLY and Ex. 46c (T p. 202) 1-10 ONLY.

NOTA BENE: Each assignment will be due (in paper or as a GoogleDoc) **on the first day of class.**
