

# Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE)

ECFE offers daytime and evening classes for families with infants, toddlers and preschoolers. Classes are also offered for expecting families. Families have time to play and learn with their child, other families, and licensed staff. Caregivers also have the opportunity to connect with others, and a parent educator, to discuss a variety of parenting topics. All classes are held at the New Hope Learning Center.

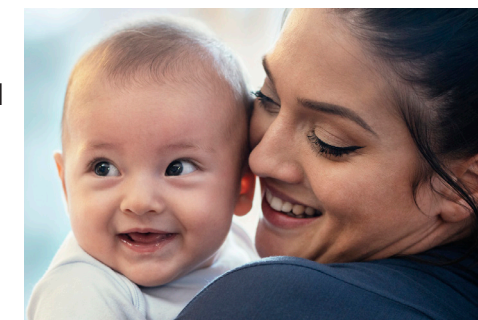

## Separating Classes

Child care for siblings 3-60 months of age is available, unless noted otherwise.

### Terrific Twos & Mixed Age

Our Terrific Twos and Mixed Age classes allow children to engage all of their senses as they sing, dance, create, build, problem solve, communicate and socialize. Caregivers also have time to meet separately for discussions with a licensed parent educator.

### Celebrating Unique Minds

Join us for a welcoming and interactive family education class designed to celebrate and explore neurodiversity together. This caregiver-and-child experience invites families to learn about the many ways brains can work and thrive, embracing the strengths, challenges, and beauty of thinking differently. Whether you're new to the topic or already on a neurodiversity journey, this class offers a supportive community where kids and caregivers can learn with and from each other.

### NEW! Family Support for Young Children with Diverse Needs

Join other families parenting young children with diverse needs in a warm, supportive environment designed to celebrate every child's growth. In this ECFE class, families connect, share experiences, and explore strategies to nurture their child's learning and development. Each session includes parent discussion time, guided activities for children, and opportunities to build community with others who understand your journey.

## Preschool

(For children 30 months–4 years on Sept 1, 2026)

Teachers help children engage and learn in ways that support all areas of growth and development (cognitive, physical, language, and social). Our preschool programs have received the highest possible rating by Minnesota’s quality rating system for early education settings. Call 763-504-5330 for information.

### Drop-Off Preschool for 30 mos.–4 years old

Classes meet 2–5 days per week, for 2.5 hours each day.

### ECFE Preschool for 3 & 4 year olds

One day per week, caregivers and children attend together. Children attend alone for an additional 1–4 days per week. It’s the perfect combination!

### 5-Day Preschool for 4 year olds

Classes meet 5-days per week, for 2.5 hours each day. Preschools are held at elementary schools across the district and at the New Hope Learning Center. Visit our website for locations and transportation information.

## Early Adventures

(For children 4 years on Sept 1, 2026)

Early Adventures is full-day care, with a preschool component. ## Early Childhood Screening

(For children 3–5 years old)

All 3 to 5-year-old children in Minnesota are required to complete an Early Childhood Screening. Early Childhood Screening is a free and simple check of your child’s vision, hearing, height, weight, and development, as well as a review of immunizations. The screening helps to identify children who may need additional support or services prior to kindergarten. ## Early Childhood Special Education/ Early Intervention

Early Childhood Special Education provides opportunities for growth and support for children and their families. Any child between birth and five years of age with a demonstrated developmental delay, and who meets the eligibility criteria, is eligible to receive services. If you have concerns about the way your child moves, sees, hears, plays, talks, or behaves, a referral for a free screening and/or evaluation can be completed through the Minnesota Help Me Grow website, [helpmegrowmn.org](https://helpmegrowmn.org). ## One-to-One Visits (For parents with children, birth through 3rd grade)



ECFE offers free home visits with a licensed parent educator.
