PROJECT IN MOTION

On Friday, May 22, members of the South Shore School District gathered for a Groundbreaking Ceremony to kick off our 18-month building expansion and remodel project. Students, staff, community members and the Board of Education celebrated with pride, excitement and gratitude for our school and community. Groundbreaking is about more than moving dirt or starting construction. It is about honoring everything that has come before us, and the privilege we have to build a bright and enduring future for our students. Generations of Cardinals have walked our halls, and we carry every one of those cherished moments with us as we step forward into this next chapter of our district.

In the days following the last day of school and groundbreaking, crews moved in and began preparing the building for asbestos abatement and construction. On the next page you will see an orange area on the figure marking Phase I, which will take place over the summer. Our goal is to make sure the updated 7-12 side of our building is finished and ready for students when they return to school in September. The first two weeks of work have led to significant progress and momentum to kick off the summer.

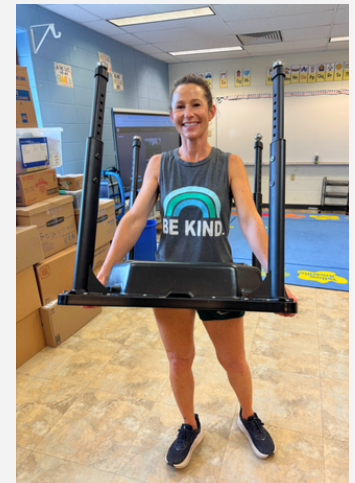

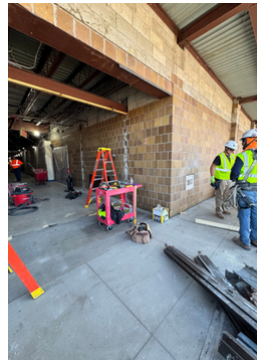

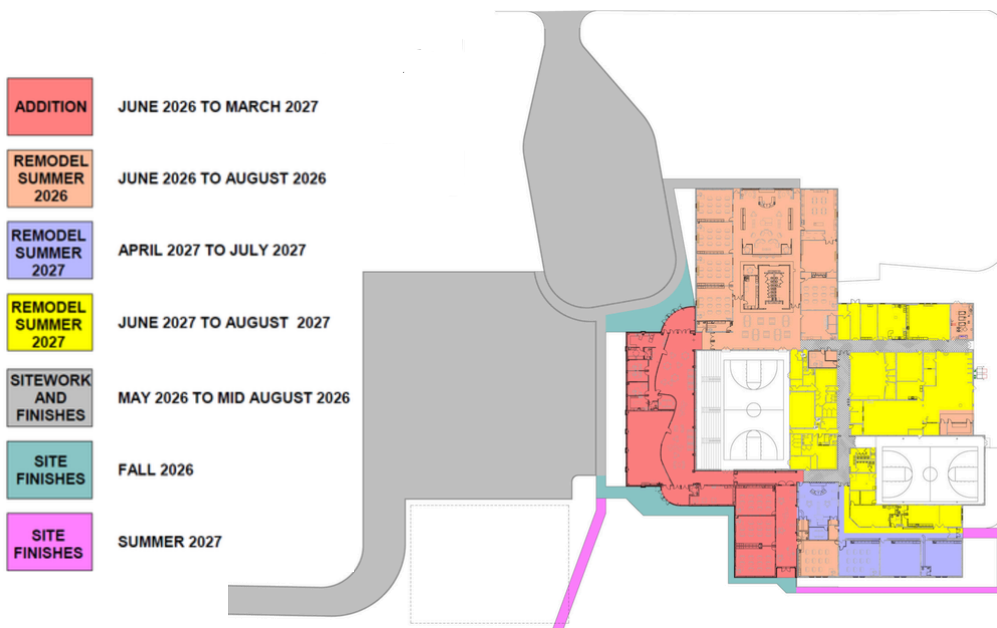


CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY

Our project is on schedule and making excellent progress after only two short weeks. Demolition, excavation and preparation work is underway with air handlers, electrical systems and plumbing. The more we dig into the building, the more we see how absolutely critical it was to make these needed improvements. Weekly construction meetings take place with the project manager, site superintendent, architect, all of the major contractors, and school district leadership. SOUTH SHORE FORENSICS UPDATE

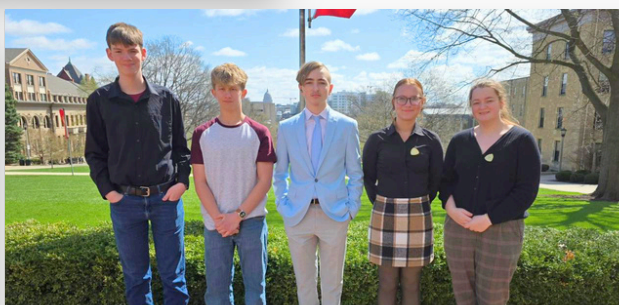

She kept on smashing records right through her last high school race this year. After taking the podium in three events at sectionals, she went to compete at the state meet in La Crosse on June 5-6. Addy placed 4th in 100m hurdles, 5th in 300m hurdles, and 10th in long jump! In 2026, she set four new school records: long jump, triple jump, 100-meter hurdles, and 300-meter hurdles. She put in consistent effort not just *at* practice but *after* practice *and* during the off-season. Her work ethic, and the success she garnered from it, are an inspiration for many Cardinals to come!

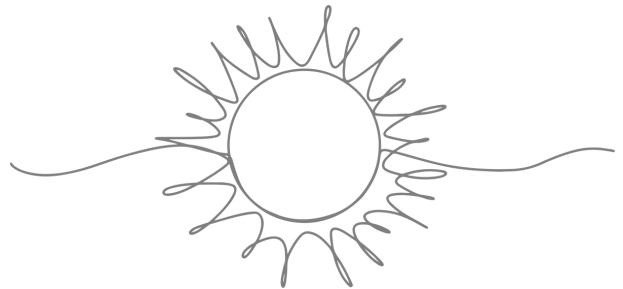
