



Summer 2026 Assignments

Reading and other schoolwork over the summer provides students with opportunities to broaden their knowledge, increase their skills, and enrich their vocabularies. It also increases students' confidence levels and helps them feel prepared for coursework on the first days of school.

Art:

All students enrolled in AP 2D Art & Design will complete three summer assignments designed to strengthen creative thinking, experimentation, and portfolio development before the school year begins. Details about these assignments will be communicated to students in May or June and can be found [HERE](#). The work includes creating 100 iterations of a single subject to explore variation and visual problem-solving, generating and documenting possible ideas for a sustained investigation, and researching artists who work in series to better understand concept development, style, and artistic process. Students are expected to have their work completed by September.

English:

All students enrolled in an AP or Honors English class for the 2026-27 school year must individually complete an original summer honors project. Details about this project will be communicated with students in May or June 2026, and information will also be available in Kenmore East's Counseling Center throughout the summer. Students must complete their summer reading work independently. There will be no extensions for these projects. Social Studies:

All students enrolled in an AP history class will be required to complete a summer project. Details about this project will be communicated to the students and posted here. Students will have to complete this project independently and adhere to the due dates that are posted.
