

SAT QUICK REFERENCE SHEET

The **SAT** is a standardized test widely used for college admission. The SAT measures two areas: evidence-based reading/writing and mathematics. Scores on these two areas range from 200-800. Students receive an SAT total score that is the sum of the two areas (ranging from 400-1600). The Kansas Regents Qualified Admissions score is 1060 (Reading/Writing + Mathematics). Students may also register for an optional SAT Essay test. This measures a student's comprehension, analysis and composition skills.

- Students should check the admissions requirements for schools they are interested in and talk to their guidance counselor to determine whether to take the SAT, ACT, or both ACT and SAT.
- 🖐️ It is very **important** that students not wait until their senior year to take the SAT. Many college applications have deadlines beginning in the fall of the senior year. If you are a senior student and you have not registered for the SAT or ACT, see your counselor immediately.
- Students can take the SAT more than once to try to improve their score.
- Students with **disabilities** and **English Language Learners** may qualify for testing with accommodations. A student with an IEP, 504 Plan or ILP should discuss this testing option with their counselor. If appropriate, an online request for accommodations can be made.
- Students who plan to play **college sport** at an NCAA or NAIA school must register with the respective eligibility center. In January 2023, the NCAA (<https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/>) removed test scores from initial eligibility requirements, but your college/university may still require the ACT/SAT for admission. NAIA (<https://play.mynaia.org/>) may require an ACT/SAT score depending on your GPA/rank.
- Test fees for 2026-27 (as of June 1, 2026): 💰
 - SAT - \$68.00
 - If a student receives free or reduced lunch, he/she is eligible for a **fee waiver** for up to two SATs which can be used junior and senior year. Students who qualify can obtain a form from their guidance counselor.
- Students should prepare for the SAT by:
 - Taking a rigorous, college-preparatory curriculum.
 - Taking the PSAT sophomore &/or junior year.
 - Visiting the SAT Preparation Center at sat.org/practice, which has many free practice opportunities.
 - Seeking opportunities listed below. Additional opportunities often arise throughout the year.
 - Use Method Test Prep through your Xello account (under "Resources"), which can be accessed by logging into your PowerSchool.
 - Peterson's DoD MWR Library & www.eknowledge.com/mil offer preparation materials to military families.
- College Board encourages online registration at www.sat.org/register. **Use a personal email, not your lvpioneer account.** The process to set up the account and register for the exam can take up to an hour the first time. You will need to know the classes you have taken and the grades received. If you do not know this information, go to PowerSchool>Forms>Grade History or see your counselor.
