**Executive Summary:** Clear Creek Independent School District administers an Interlocal Purchasing Cooperative for General Foods and Full-Service Food Distribution whereby participating school districts combine purchasing volume to obtain competitive pricing for food service commodities and related products. Pearland ISD Food Services Department has participated in this cooperative purchasing program for several years to support districtwide cafeteria and nutrition operations.

Administration recommends utilizing the following awarded vendors under the Clear Creek ISD cooperative purchasing program for the beginning of the 2026–2027 school year:

The Food Services Department has prepared a projected forecast of the top 50 anticipated purchases for the 2026–2027 school year based on current operational needs and estimated usage. However, Clear Creek ISD intends to rebid the General Foods and Full-Service Food Distribution solicitation in September 2026. As a result, awarded vendors, unit pricing, projected expenditures, and product availability may change following completion of the new solicitation process.

**Subject:** Consider Approval of a Master Affiliation Agreement with Oklahoma Baptist University for Student Clinical Placement Opportunities

**Executive Summary:** Administration recommends approval of the Master Affiliation Agreement between Pearland Independent School District and Oklahoma Baptist University to facilitate clinical and experiential learning opportunities for students enrolled in the university’s health profession programs, specifically the Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology program.

The agreement establishes a framework for Oklahoma Baptist University students to participate in supervised clinical and educational experiences within the District. The agreement outlines responsibilities related to student supervision, compliance with HIPAA and FERPA requirements, health and safety protocols, insurance coverage, and program coordination between the university and the District.

Under the agreement, Pearland ISD will serve as a clinical and educational placement site while maintaining full responsibility for student safety, supervision standards, and compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Oklahoma Baptist University will retain responsibility for program oversight, student eligibility, academic supervision, and required background checks, immunizations, and insurance coverage.

There is no financial impact to the District associated with this agreement.

**Recommended Term:**

The agreement becomes effective upon execution and will remain in effect indefinitely unless terminated by either party with six months’ written notice.

Approve the adoption and purchase of new and continuing instructional materials.

**Executive Summary:** Board Policy EFA requires school board approval of instructional materials that are being considered for adoption in the classroom.

HB1605, passed by the 88<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature (Regular Session) in 2023, restructured the instructional material/textbook adoption process for districts. Under the new SBOE adoption cycle, Social Studies materials (last adopted in 2016) are not scheduled for adoption for another four years. With this timeline in mind, the district provided K-12 Social Studies teachers an adoption process so that they would have the chance to select new instructional materials if the new materials offered better alignment to the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) and district curriculum, and/or more effective instructional strategies. Note: this adoption process does not include Advanced Placement (AP) Social Studies courses as materials for those courses are determined by CollegeBoard timelines.

Additionally, two new Career & Technology Education (CTE) courses, Energy and Natural Resources and Practicum of Education were added to high school CTE course options for 2026-2027 and needed to adopt instructional materials for use next year.

During the 2025-2026 school year, the district conducted an adoption process following established administrative guidelines. A summary of this process is:

- Grade-level and subject committees (including teachers) identified the best materials for their area.
- Instructional Specialists reviewed recommendations for alignment to TEKS and district curriculum.
- Teachers received printed samples and/or online access to materials under consideration.
- Publishers presented materials during teacher review sessions.
- Public review period allowed community members to view materials and provide feedback
  - Ten community members provided input, generally supporting the material options. Three respondents noted difficulty managing multiple publisher logins for online reviews. The district will address this feedback in future adoption cycles.
- All teachers in the subject area/grade level voted on final selections.
- The district Instructional Materials Allotment committee — comprised of the Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction and Directors of Elementary, Secondary,

and Career and Technical Education — reviewed the selected materials and made final recommendations.

High School World Geography, World History, Economics, and Sociology reviewed all options presented and expressed their preference to stay with their current materials. The district will need to purchase the extension of the digital subscriptions for these high school courses. K-4 Social Studies reviewed all options and will continue to use their current print materials as well as supplemental materials provided by the district.

For now, the Social Studies materials are being purchased for four years and the CTE materials for three years. The costs of these materials as proposed, including the renewals, is \$753,018.77.

The materials will be purchased using the district allocation of Instructional Materials Allotment funds, fund 410, and using awarded vendors.

Policy CH (Local) states that any single, budgeted purchase of goods or services that cost \$100,000 or more, regardless of whether the goods or services are competitively procured, shall require Board approval before a transaction may take place.

**Executive Summary:** The administration recommends approval of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Pearland Independent School District and the University of Houston-Clear Lake (UHCL) to establish a Guaranteed Admission Program (GAP) for eligible Pearland ISD students. Under the agreement, students who meet established academic criteria, including a minimum unweighted GPA of 2.75 and applicable university admission requirements, will receive a guaranteed admission offer from UHCL during their senior year.

The partnership is intended to expand postsecondary opportunities for Pearland ISD students, increase awareness of college pathways, and strengthen the district's efforts to support college, career, and military readiness. Pearland ISD will promote the program and provide limited student information to UHCL in accordance with FERPA and applicable privacy laws. UHCL will communicate directly with eligible students regarding admission opportunities and enrollment procedures.

**Background:** Senate Bill 12 created TEC §39.008, requiring all Texas school districts to annually certify compliance with specific provisions of state law related to instructional requirements, employee duties, and prohibited practices. The certification affirms that the District has reviewed applicable policies, procedures, practices, and operations for alignment with state requirements, including but not limited to:

- TEC §11.005 regarding the prohibition on certain diversity, equity, and inclusion duties; and
- TEC §28.0022 regarding certain instructional requirements and prohibitions.

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) has provided a standardized Compliance Certification Template to assist school systems in meeting the statutory requirement. State law requires the certification to be:

- approved by the governing body in a public meeting; and
- submitted electronically through the AskTED application no later than September 30 of each school year.

District administration has conducted a review of applicable local policies, administrative procedures, employee guidance, instructional practices, and vendor expectations to support compliance with the requirements of the statute.

- Debt Service Fund – Revenues realized total 98.9% while actual expenditures total 100.0%, which are covered by fund balance reserves.
- Tax Revenue and Collections – Tax year 2025 collections as of April 30, 2026, total \$105,235,747 or 97.8% of the tax levy.
