Why

Concurrent Enrollment?

Concurrent Enrollment is linked to:

- Higher college-going rates
- Higher performance in college freshmen level coursework
- Higher college graduation rates
- Lower education costs for the student
- Reduced time to completion of degree and entrance into the workforce

Important Things to Consider

- Concurrent courses are college level courses with college level curriculum and expectations.
- Are online courses right for you? Online courses require students to be self-motivated and work independently.
- The calendar for the concurrent course may be different.
 - Even if the high school is closed (school breaks, teacher in-service, etc.), students will attend the college course as scheduled
- Absences for SHS activities/sports are not excused in college courses.
 - Students may not want to take a college course during a semester they will experience frequent activity absences.
- **Communication is IMPORTANT!**
 - Students must monitor grades and communicate with their instructors.
 - Instructors will not contact/communicate with parents.
 - SHS DOES NOT have access to students' concurrent application or grades.
 - **STUDENTS MUST CHECK THEIR COLLEGE EMAIL DAILY!**

Admission Requirements

Oklahoma State University

- Junior or Senior
- Assured Admission Requirements*
24 composite ACT OR
3.0 cumulative unweighted GPA and top 33% of class
- Approval from high school counselor or principal and parent/guardian

Students have the option to apply without a test score. Students who select this option on the application will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript.

NOC

- Junior or Senior
- Admission Requirements
19 composite ACT OR
3.0 cumulative unweighted GPA and 19 ACT in area of enrollment
- Approval from high school counselor or principal
- Approval from parent or legal guardian

University of Oklahoma

- Junior or Senior
- Assured Admission Requirements*
24 composite ACT OR
3.0 cumulative unweighted GPA and top 33% of class
- Approval from high school counselor or principal and parent/guardian

Students have the option to apply to without a test score. Students who select this option on the application will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript.

Application Process

Oklahoma State University

- Complete the on-line concurrent application
- Pay A \$50 application fee (if first time applicant)
- Submit an electronic concurrent approval request to both your parent and counselor.
- Submit the on-line SHS Concurrent Enrollment Agreement
- Submit your official transcript - Transcript Request Form
- OPTIONAL - Submit your official ACT scores

University of Oklahoma

- Complete the on-line concurrent application
- Submit the on-line SHS Concurrent Enrollment Agreement
- Submit your official transcript - Transcript Request Form
- OPTIONAL - Submit your official ACT scores

Northern Oklahoma College (NOC)

- Complete the on-line concurrent application
- Request your transcript
 - Pick up the transcript and take it to NOC when you enroll instead of having it mailed. Transcript Request Form
- Print your ACT scores at myact.org
- Print and complete the Concurrent Admissions Form
 - A parent AND counselor's signature are required.
- Submit the on-line SHS Concurrent Enrollment Agreement



Meeting Graduation Requirements

Can I “trade” a college class for a required high school class?

YES! - Common Dual Credit “direct trade” Courses

- English Composition I (1 semester) = Part 1 of English IV
- English Composition II (1 semester) = Part II of English IV
- American History since 1865 (1 semester) = U.S. History
- College Algebra (1 semester) = Prep for College Algebra
- See Your Counselor about dual credit for other courses.

High School & College Transcripts

- Every concurrent college course grade will go on the high school transcript and will be computed into the student's cumulative GPA (as with any regular SHS course). This also includes courses taken during the summer semester.
- All concurrent courses receive unweighted credit.
- A student's college transcript is a permanent record. A student's grades impact their high school and college grade point averages (GPA), future financial aid eligibility, admission to institutions of higher education, and eligibility to continue concurrent college enrollment.
- Students must earn a 2.0 cumulative GPA to continue concurrent college enrollment at any state system institution.

Do I have to pay for concurrent courses?

- **SENIORS** receive a **TUITION** waiver (from the OK State Regents) for up to **18 credit hours TOTAL** (includes summer before SR year and Fall/Spring semesters of SR year.)
- **JUNIORS** receive a **TUITION** waiver (from the OK State Regents) for up to **9 credit hours TOTAL** (includes summer before JR year and Fall/Spring semesters of JR year.) Juniors at OU pay tuition, but no fees.

OSU Classes at SHS and Cowbou Concurrent Online

- Tuition is waived
- Fees are waived by OSU
- Students are responsible for books (if applicable)

OSU Classes at OSU

- Tuition is waived
- Required to pay FEES (aprx. \$400)
- Students are responsible for books (if applicable)

NOC Classes

- Tuition is waived
- Required to pay FEES (aprx. \$400)
- Students are responsible for books (if applicable)

OU Classes

- Tuition and fees waived for Seniors
- Juniors are required to pay tuition (aprx. \$525)
- Students are responsible for books (if applicable)

How do concurrent classes work in my schedule?

1 Concurrent Course = One block release
2 Concurrent Courses = Two block release
3 Concurrent Courses = Three block release

- **Seniors** - Up to three concurrent releases per SEMESTER, which will accommodate up to 9 college hours.
- **Juniors** - Up to three concurrent releases per YEAR, which will accommodate up to 9 college hours.
 - We do not recommend Juniors take 9 hours in one semester.

NOTE:

- If you enroll in an online concurrent course or course scheduled outside of regular school hours, you may take a release during the block of your choice.
- If you enroll in a course on NOC or OSU's campus, don't forget to consider travel time!
 - The class MUST begin at least 30 minutes after your SHS class ends OR begin at least 30 minutes after your SHS class ends.

What if I drop a concurrent course?

- **Follow the OFFICIAL withdrawal process**
 - Failure to do so may result in financial obligations and failing grade on high school and college transcripts.
- **Communicate with your counselor**
 - Communicate with their high school counselor BEFORE dropping a concurrent course.
 - By law, all students must be enrolled in school full time and concurrent courses count toward full time student status.
 - Students dropping a concurrent course will be enrolled in a SHS class.
 - Any SHS course added after the first 5 days of class will result in an Audit for that class.

What if I am on an IEP or 504?

- Make sure you connect with Office of Disability Services to let them know. It is the student's responsibility to reach out and to supply the needed documentation to each university.
