

Summary

The May School Improvement Team meeting at Rocky River High School covered quarterly Title IX compliance reporting, athletic achievements, end-of-year testing logistics, and upcoming school events. The school maintained zero Title IX incidents for both Q3 and Q4, with team members attributing this success to proactive student conferences on sexual harassment and distribution of informational cards about appropriate behavior. Athletics highlights included the girls flag football team advancing to playoffs (competing this weekend at Johnson C. Smith University), Kedric Evans qualifying for state championships in shot put and discus, and upcoming recognition events including the Jair Alexander inaugural scholarship presentation.

The end-of-year testing schedule was shared, with EOC exams running May 28 through June 10, and an urgent call was made for volunteer test proctors to support the school's testing capacity. The meeting concluded with a review of final school year events, including prom on May 16, senior week (May 18-22), and graduation scheduled for June 13 at UNC Charlotte.

Topics

Title IX Compliance Report

- The school reported zero Title IX incidents for both Q3 and Q4, maintaining a perfect record with no sexual harassment or sexual discrimination reports for the entire school year.
- Team members identified a student conference on sexual harassment as a key prevention strategy that helped students understand appropriate treatment and recognize inappropriate behavior.
- Informational cards were distributed to students providing resources and clarifying what appropriate relationship behavior looks like, contributing to the zero-incident record.

- Students are aware of multiple reporting pathways, including approaching teachers, counselors, or administrators they feel comfortable with, and the counseling team has been actively involved in addressing student concerns.

Athletics Updates & Achievements

- London Spears represented the school as girls flag football was sanctioned as an official sport in North Carolina, and the girls flag football team advanced to the playoffs with competition scheduled this weekend at Johnson C. Smith University.
- Kedric Evans qualified to compete at the state level in shot put and discus on May 15, representing Rocky River in track and field championships.
- The all-sport banquet is taking place this evening (May 14) to recognize student athletes across all seasons, with coaching staff and athletic administration in attendance.
- Jaire Alexander and his family will present their inaugural scholarship award to a Rocky River athlete at the Senior Awards Ceremony on Tuesday, May 21.
- Elise Paris was nominated as Cheerleader of the Year and will attend the recognition gala on May 21 to represent Rocky River at the awards ceremony.

End of Year Testing

- EOC testing begins May 28 with year-long English 2, followed by year-long Math 1 on June 1, semester EOCs on June 4, and all makeup exams June 5, 8, 9, and 10.
- The school has an urgent need for volunteer test proctors between June 1 and June 10, with a signup link available in the presentation for community members willing to serve at least one day.
- The last day of school is June 10, marking the conclusion of the academic year immediately following the completion of all EOC and makeup testing.

Upcoming School Events

- Prom is scheduled for May 16 at the Gantt Center, followed by senior week (May 18-22) featuring spirit activities and events exclusively for graduating seniors.
- The Fine Arts Showcase will take place on May 21, highlighting student work and performances in visual and performing arts.
- Graduation is scheduled for June 13 at UNC Charlotte, representing the culmination of the school year and the ultimate milestone for the Class of 2026.
