Add your favorite things like food, place, color, toy, game, and more. Don’t forget to write your birthday and what you want to be when you grow up!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Library Visit</p> <p>Visit the local library, get a library card, and choose a book to read with a family member. Draw a picture of your favorite part. You can also listen to a book online.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">ABC Book</p> <p>Create your own ABC book. Draw and color a picture for each letter of the alphabet.</p>

You can include pictures, stickers, and different items that tell about your break.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Alphabet Fun</p> <p>Using shaving cream, write the letters of the alphabet with your finger. Take a picture of you with your shaving cream alphabet!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Alphabet Scavenger Hunt</p> <p>Search through magazines and cut out pictures of different things that begin with each letter of the alphabet. Paste your pictures onto paper in ABC order!</p>
