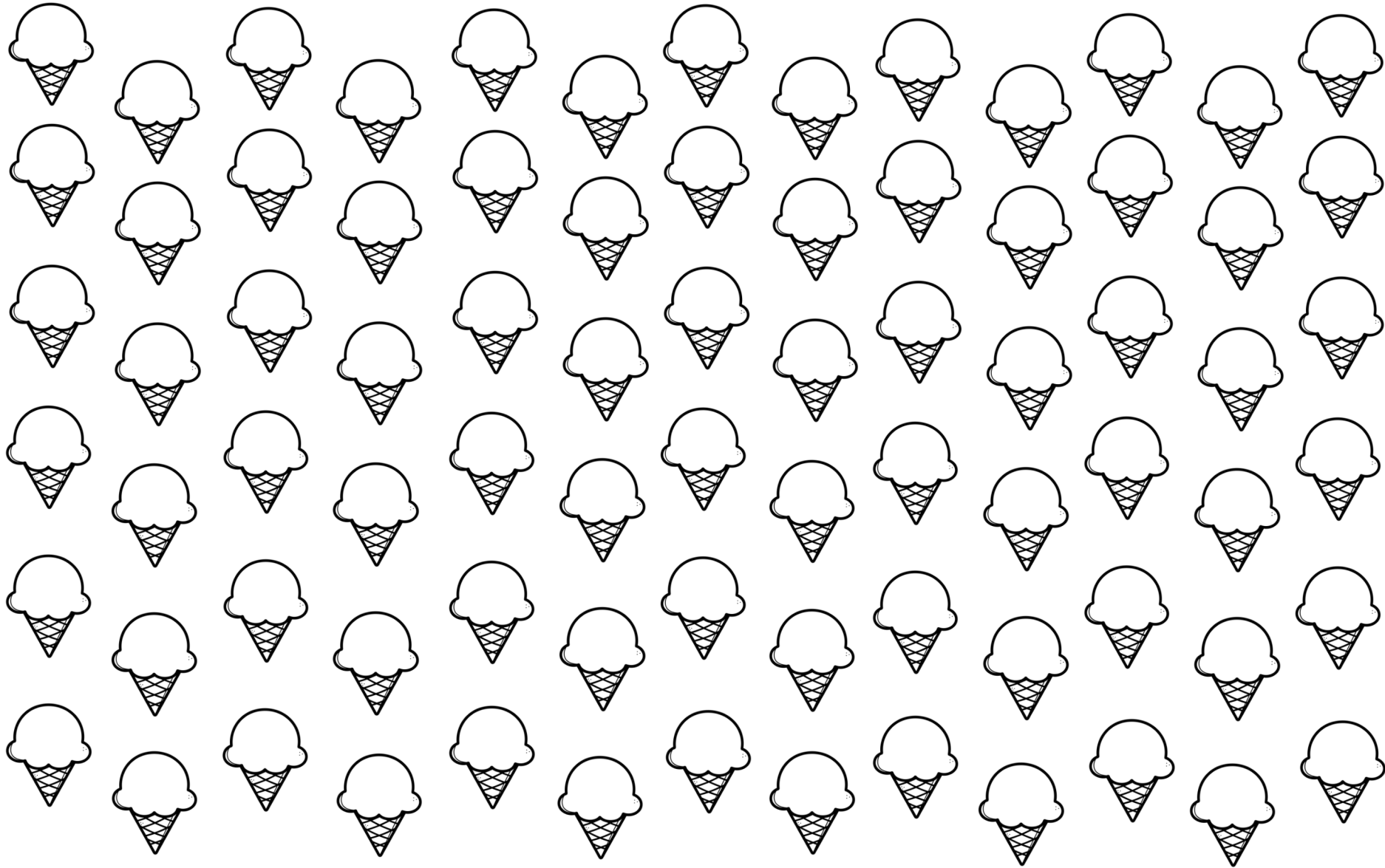

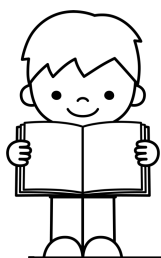

INDEPENDENCE SKILLS
