

Remembering A Life Devoted to God, Students and Service

The DePaul Cristo Rey community lost a dedicated Board member, school advocate and tireless volunteer with the death of **Sister Barbara Davis, SC**, in April. S. Barbara joined DPCR's Board of Directors in 2017 and was recognized with DPCR's Founders Leadership Award in 2022 for her service, charity and passion for the school's mission. S. Barbara had a long and distinguished career in education serving 50 years as a teacher, Catholic elementary school principal, school consultant, and coordinator of alumni relations for Catholic college graduates. She was loved and appreciated by students, families and colleagues, and honored as a Distinguished Principal by the **National Catholic Educational Association Department of Elementary Schools** and was a recipient of the Governor's Award for Excellence. This quote, one of her favorites from **St. Elizabeth Ann Seton**, sums up her career, life and 65 years as a Sister of Charity. "You will often be at a stand for what is best in a situation so new, but only do your best as you have always done and leave the rest to our dear God."

Certifications Launch New Era in Corporate Work Study



As the demands of today's workforce continue to evolve, DePaul Cristo Rey is reimagining how students prepare for the future. This summer marks a significant new chapter for the school's Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP) which is a signature component of the Cristo Rey model and has been an integral part of a DPCR education since the school's founding in 2011.

In those 15 years, the world of work has and continues to rapidly change, so DPCR leaders have spent more than two years researching and exploring ways to invest in students so they are better prepared for college and careers. That work, led by Vice President of Corporate Work Study **Shermirah Smith**, has led to certification programs being piloted with students this summer. "We have talked to industry professionals to understand what they need in entry-level employees and what certifications are relevant in their fields," says Shermirah.

This month, 30 students in three cohorts are participating in certification programs. These are CNA (certified nursing assistant) certification for students interested in health care; OSHA 10 safety certification for students interested in construction, engineering and manufacturing; and a CompTIA computer information certification for students interested in cybersecurity.

"After these summer programs are over, my team and I will review the successes, areas to be improved, and data for future planning," says Shermirah. "Our next steps will be to place our certified students into relevant CWS positions this coming school year as well as explore adding more certification options into the curriculum in the year ahead."

Heaven Evans Named Alumna of the Year

During our second annual Braggin' Rights Alumni vs. Students basketball game, **Heaven Evans '18** was honored during half-time as Alumna of the Year. Her time on the basketball courts at DPCR and **Thomas More University**, where she earned her bachelor's degree, demonstrated she's an all-star athlete who competes with heart and lifts those around her. 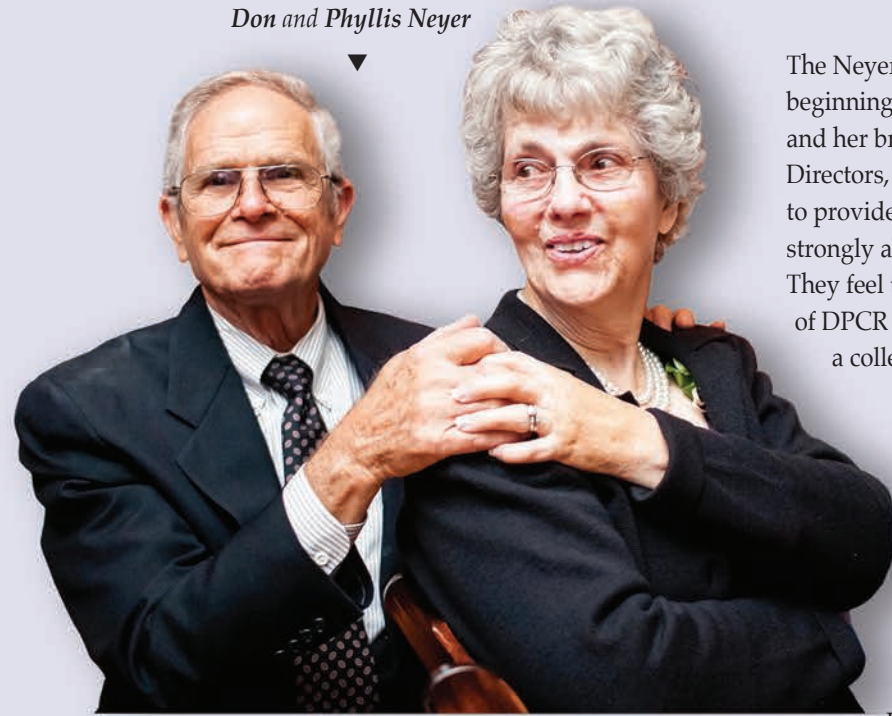

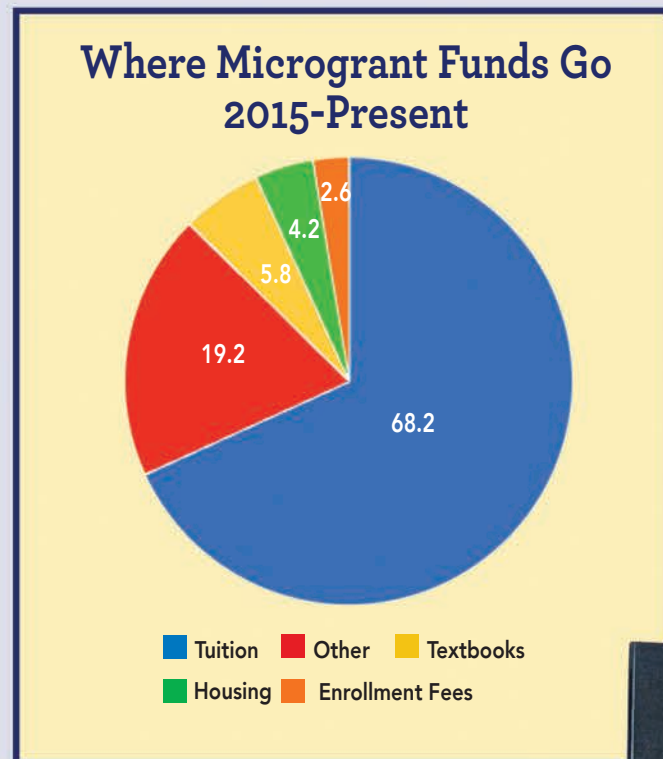

Don and Phyllis Neyer lived a legacy of love, faith and service in Cincinnati. They raised their eight children in a devoted Catholic family and taught them the importance of giving back to help those in need. Since their deaths, their philanthropy continues with their children as they carry on their giving to local organizations. Thanks to a significant gift to the Graduate Success Fund, their legacy now lives on through DePaul Cristo Rey alumni.

"Our parents were always giving back," says daughter **Donna Broderick**. "Dad always told us that the definition of love is 'to will and work toward the good of another.'" Phyllis passed away in 2016 and after Don's death in 2023, he left his children a donor-advised fund from which to oversee charitable giving. This year, that fund provided a \$150,000 gift to DPCR's Graduate Success Fund.

The Graduate Success Fund provides professional and financial resources to support alumni to college completion. Through this fund, alumni can apply for microgrants to fill college financial shortfalls including tuition gaps. The Neyer gift will help to endow the fund and support the microgrants.
