About Cambridge



General Program Information

The Cambridge Program at Juanita High School develops thinking skills through academic rigor, prepares students for university life, and provides connections to and understanding of the global community. These aims are met by utilizing a challenging, accelerated curriculum based on the University of Cambridge's Cambridge Assessment International Education program. The curricula, which falls into four areas – Math and Science, Languages, Arts and Humanities, and Global Perspectives – provides a well-balanced course of study for academically able students. "Juanita High School is amazing, and I consider it one of the crown jewels of Cambridge in America," said Mark Cavone, U.S. Regional Director, Cambridge International Examinations, North America.¹

Each of Cambridge International's thoroughly developed syllabi enhances students' understanding of subjects, encouraging independent learning and constructive thinking skills – all of which are highly prized by universities. Students joining the Cambridge Program become more confident, responsible, reflective, innovative, and engaged. Stuart Schmill, Dean of Admissions, Massachusetts Institute of Technology states, "Cambridge students are very well-prepared for our curriculum, and we find that they have a lot of confidence, but also that they have good deep subject knowledge, and the ability to think critically."²

Upon successful completion of the AICE curricula, students enrolled in the Cambridge Program at Juanita High School earn the Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) Diploma. To earn the AICE Diploma, students must demonstrate the skills of independent research and investigation, the use of initiative and creativity, and the application of knowledge and skills, in all four subject areas. The AICE Diploma requires students to earn a total of 7 AICE credits with at least 1 credit from each area.

Cambridge International's AICE qualifications are recognised and valued by the world's top-ranked higher education institutions. More than 2220 universities in over 90 countries formally recognise Cambridge qualifications; in Washington State, many colleges will award up to a full year of college credit upon successful completion of the AICE program. Juanita High School graduates go on to universities around the US and internationally, including Dartmouth, Yale, Princeton, Stanford, Harvard, the US Naval Academy, UCLA, Duke, Johns Hopkins, University of Washington, Cambridge, Oxford, McGill, and many others. In a recent study by Cambridge International, the authors found that, compared to the US average, more Cambridge graduates enrolled in a university program immediately after high school, their GPAs were higher, and they were 14% more likely to finish their degrees within 4 years.³ US college admissions staff say "Cambridge students are often the ones who come into our institution and thrive. They are ready for the demands of the academic course-load of the university and have excellent academic skills."⁴

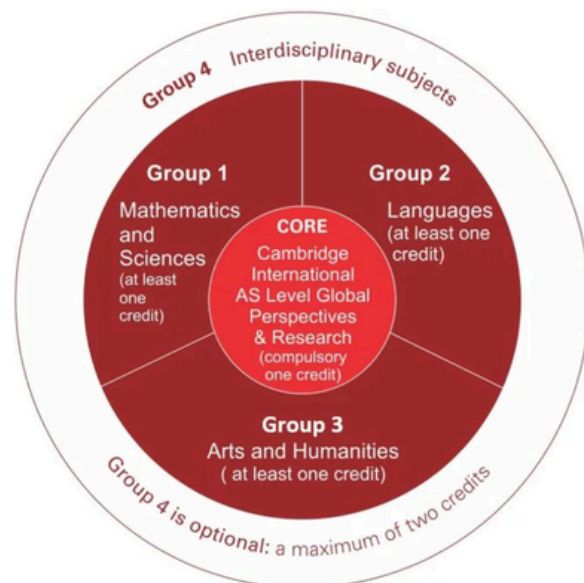

AICE Diploma

To qualify for the AICE Diploma, students must earn seven AICE credits within a 25-month period AND one credit in each of the following areas : Languages, Global Perspectives, Math & Science, and Arts & Humanities. Pre-AICE courses prepare students for success in their AICE level coursework but do not count towards the AICE Diploma. AS Level Qualifications count as one AICE credit whereas A Level Qualifications count as two. To calculate a final A Level score, scores from AS Level papers are combined with scores from the A Level papers, earning students up to two credits for Mathematics, Literature, History, and Biology or Chemistry.

Cambridge awards six marks: A*, A, B, C, D, and E. Mark E is equivalent to a grade of "C" as well as a "3" on an Advanced Placement (AP) Examination. Students earning less than an E mark do not receive credit toward the AICE Diploma. AS Levels are ineligible for the A* mark. The AICE Diploma is awarded at three different levels (in descending order): Distinction, Merit, or Pass, depending on the exam grades earned.

- treat feedback as an opportunity for academic growth, not an opening to ask for points
- adhere to each teacher's retake, absent, and late work policy
- sit the Cambridge assessments administered by Cambridge International at the end of each course

Things to Consider

Ask yourself and answer honestly.

- Am I prepared to put hours into my homework every night for the next four years? To potentially have to review material and study when other students are able to take time off during breaks?
- Am I prepared to take advanced level coursework in ALL core subjects, not just the ones I like or am good at? To persevere when things are hard and ask for help when I need it?
- Am I prepared to be pushed intellectually by my teachers, to be asked to think critically and creatively, work collaboratively, and respond with humility to constructive criticism and feedback on my work?
- Am I prepared to have four of my courses dictated by the Cambridge Program every year, and to sit up to ten separate exams in the spring all the way up to graduation?

Other Considerations



Exams & Fees

Throughout the year, Cambridge teachers assess student skills and knowledge with classwork and in-class exams and assign a course grade to each student. These grades are reported on their Juanita High School transcript, issued by the Lake Washington School District.

From April to May, students take separate exams which are graded in the UK and incur additional fees. Every Cambridge exam is required, and AS/A Level exams count towards the students' AICE Diploma. These exams are reported on students' Cambridge Exam Transcript which is issued by Cambridge. Each course involves between two and four exams, scheduled both during and outside of school (a sample calendar for 2026 is shown at right). Scholarships are available to students in need of financial assistance; please see the Cambridge Administrator Jessica West for more information.

In 2026, IGCSE exam fees are \$82.75 each, most AS exams are \$124.80, A Level exams are \$201.85 each, and there are additional mailing costs (\$30) and possibly other additional program costs (clubs, field trips, etc)

Juanita Experience

Cambridge students at Juanita High School have the same 24 credit state graduation requirements as all Lake Washington School District students. The following credits are required : 16 Cambridge, 0.5 Health, 1.5 PE, 2 World Language, 2 Arts, and 1 CTE. Juanita has extensive elective opportunities as well as the chance to participate in a wide variety of clubs and sports. Although it is possible for Cambridge students to take Advanced Placement courses as electives, participate in WANIC or Running Start, and peer tutor in other courses, it should be noted that these are only available for students who are concurrently meeting or have already met their overall graduation requirements.

If you are an incoming 10th grader, please complete the 10th Grade Registration form (pg 13) instead.
