I hope you have a safe and relaxing summer! I look forward to meeting you on the first day of school.

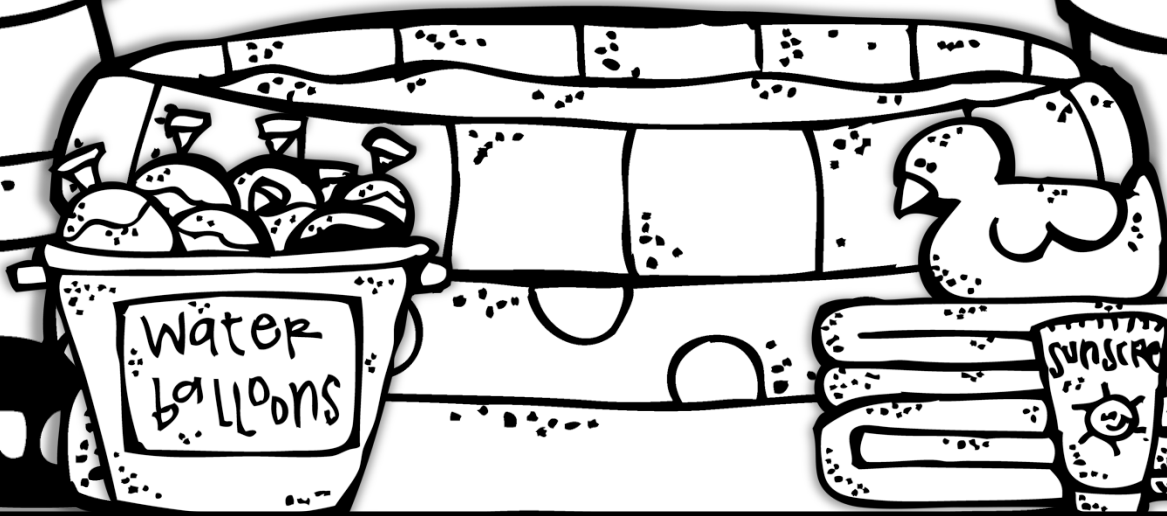
